# Five locals arrested in drug sweep

Five Floyd Countians have been ensnared in what is being billed as the largest drug sweep in state history.

Kentucky State Police, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the federal Drug Enforcement Administration, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, the Internal Revenue Service, state Attorney General Ben Chandler, the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Kentucky, and officials and law enforcement agencies in Perry,

Pike, Fayette, Clay, Laurel and Harlan counties banded together Tuesday for the operation, dubbed "Operation Oxyfest 2001."

The name of the drug sweep is a reference to the prescription medication oxycodone, a form of synthetic morphine which is sold under the brand name OxyContin and is known on the street as "oxycotton" or "O.C."

More than 200 people were caught up in the action, with 155 people facing charges in Fayette, Pike, Clay and Perry counties and another 52 facing federal charges.

## W'wright utility panel seeks to settle lawsuit

An air of secrecy surrounded the Wheelwright Utility Commission meeting this week and left many citizens waiting impatiently for several hours before the commission returned, only to take no action.

The special-called meeting, held Wednesday night at 6:30

p.m., started and stopped just as quickly as members James Branham, Laura Bowers, Elaine Meyers and Lowell D. Parker (Nanny Hall, also a utility commission member, was not present) went into executive session following a motion made by Parker.

The closed session was to discuss the litigation brought against the commission by Paul

Preston, a former meter reader for the city, and Ruby Preston, his wife and a former city hall custodian.

The Prestons are striving for a settlement agreement to pay them for wages lost during the time they have been laid off as employees of the utility commission.

## James pitches 'Arcade of Attractions'

The Prestonsburg Tourism Commission met Thursday afternoon in a lengthy meeting that brought many innovative ideas to the table.

These ideas could prove to be beneficial to the city of Prestonsburg if given approval.

Fred James, Prestonsburg's tourism director, presented his ideas in the form of a proposal he affectionately referred to as the "Prestonsburg Visitors Center Arcade of Attractions."

If the proposal is agreed upon, Prestonsburg could anticipate not only an added tourist information center in the community, but also an added tourist attraction.

The proposal included a rough floor plan of a foreseeable facility at what is now the old Prestonsburg Post Office. The proposed facility would include, but not be limited to, two video stations and a 10-foot viewing screen displaying portions

## Strike guard irked by dismissed case

The Kentucky West Virginia Gas Company strike may be over, but Larry Crawley, former security guard for the strike during December, still has the strike at the top of his priority list.

Crawley, a North Carolina police officer, filed charges against Hubert Halbert in early December of last year concerning an incident which allegedly occurred on the picket line during the strike.

Crawley claimed that Halbert had pulled a gun on him as he was trying to provide what he felt to be "emergency" help

across the line. Crawley later filed a charge of first-degree wanton endangerment against Halbert in Floyd District Court.

Crawley has said that he was responding to what he believed at the time to be an alarm signaling a gas leak when he attempted to cross the picket line. He alleged that, as he made toward striking workers, Halbert pointed a gun at his head.

All cases involving the strike were dismissed January 26, including that of Crawley's.

Crawley spoke with The Floyd County Times on Wednesday and stressed his dis-

Also to be addressed in closed session was the pending status of present members Gary McCoy and Audrey Yates, both longtime employees of the utility commission.

After the commission came back into session at approximately 9:30 p.m., a motion was made to permit Tim Parker, as the city of Wheelwright's attorney pending litigation, to enter into settlement negotiations with the Prestons' attorney.

The motion was approved, with only Bowers opposing, and the meeting was adjourned.

During the course of those final comments, Gary McCoy approached the commission but was told, by Parker, that questions from the public could not be answered during a special meeting.

The three-hour-long wait was less than fruitful as no action was taken beyond Parker being recognized as the city attorney and being given the go-ahead to pursue a settlement with the Prestons. The Prestons declined to comment after the meeting, saying they had to first

"get the situation handled" before making any statement. Both McCoy and Yates also preferred not to comment.

In a brief interview, as tired citizens and commission members were filing from the Municipal Building, Lowell D. Parker commented on the nature of the meeting and what will be done next.

"We left it in the hands of our attorney to handle all the litigation concerning this matter," Lowell Parker said. "The city has given

of informative, and at the same time entertaining, clips of such local attractions as Jenny Wiley State Resort Park, the Kentucky Opry, Thunder Ridge Racing and many others.

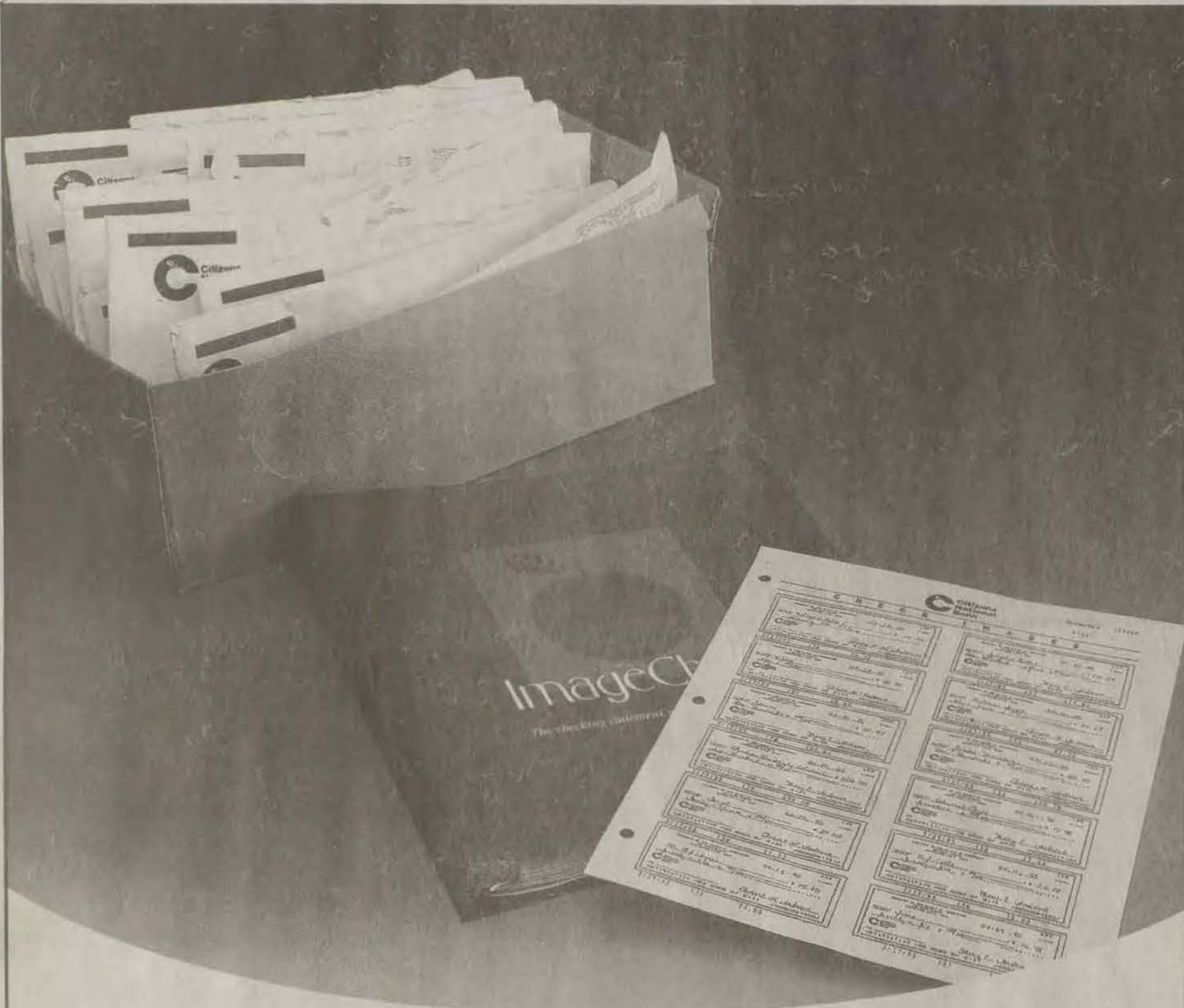
James feels confident that the money put into the project, which is at this early point, estimated at costing \$1.5 million, would be recouped by an increase business tourism would bring in Prestonsburg and the rest of Kentucky.

James' vision, which includes the viewing theater, is a long-term goal. The short-term goal, which is fully supported by the rest of the commission, is to appeal to the city to gain semi-permanent residence at the old post office. They would gain this location as a tentative measure in hopes that they could get a better, more suitable, location and approval and funding for the Arcade of Attractions later on.

James said he feels pressure with the idea of being "loaned" the building his office is presently in and is eager to gain a commitment from the city on location.

Members of the commission seem enthusiastic about the proposal but are anxious to secure semi-permanent residence so they can move ahead to step two without concern for stability.

The Prestonsburg Tourism Commission will meet again March 8.

# Ashland, Education team to award teachers





## Crackdown on oxycodone needed

Kentucky State Police and law enforcement agencies from around Eastern Kentucky, together with U.S. Attorney Joseph Famularo, this week declared war on the illegal prescription drug trade which has run rampant through our region by engaging the largest roundup of drug suspects in state history.

The statistics — over 200 people arrested, \$100,000 seized and nearly 10,000 pills removed from the streets.

We wholeheartedly endorse and applaud this effort to rid Eastern Kentucky of a scourge which threatens lives — both literally through overdose deaths and figuratively through a monstrous cycle of addiction.

Dead center in law enforcement's cross hairs is the powerful and deadly oxycodone, marketed under the brand name OxyContin and known on the street as "oxycotton." The illicit use of this particular drug has reached epidemic proportions in Eastern Kentucky and has probably caused more grief and destroyed more lives than all others combined.

Oxycodone is legitimately used to treat pain in cancer patients and others with chronic, debilitating diseases. It does so because it is a form of synthetic morphine.

As a result, oxycodone is highly addictive, leading both dealers and users to engage in insurance, Medicaid and Medicare fraud, and, in more desperate time, to resort to crime.

Oxycodone also carries a high price tag on the street, with prices typically running \$1 a milligram and pills sold in 10, 20, 40, 80 and 160 mg strengths. Many addicted to the drug go through several pills a day.

The severity of this epidemic and the toll it has taken on the people of Eastern Kentucky has long demanded just the type of action taken by law enforcement agencies this week.

And while this week's roundup will likely take a toll on the trade in this dangerous drug, it is clear that more is needed. While more than 200 people were netted in this sweep, only five came from Floyd County, with police still searching for a sixth. Yet, anecdotal evidence would suggest that the problem is far more widespread.

But this week's actions are an encouraging sign that officials are taking a no-holds-barred approach to this menace and, overall, represent a good start to solving the problem — as long as it remains a start which continues to be pursued seriously in the future.

And on January 13, I was in London and the price was \$1.39 a gallon and here in Pike and Floyd counties the price was \$1.55.

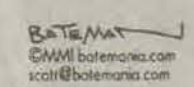
I was in Lexington on Friday, February 2, and at this Shell station on Winchester Road the price was \$1.33 a gallon and elsewhere also.

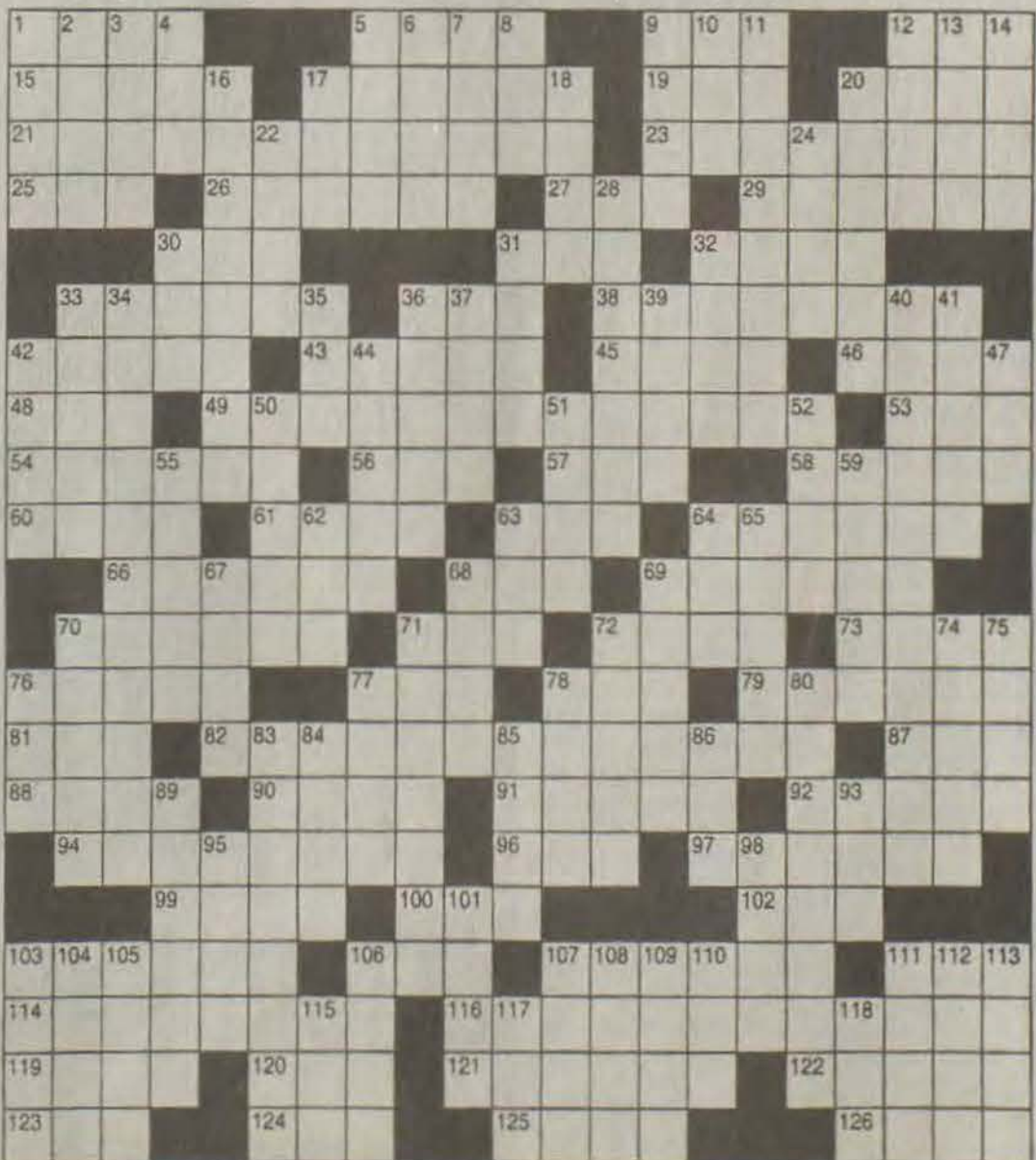

## Two documentaries on KET pay tribute to African Americans' struggle for civil rights

In the early years of the 20th century, Marcus Garvey dreamed of creating an independent black nation. His bold idea galvanized the largest international movement of black people in history. American Experience "Marcus Garvey: Look for Me in the Whirlwind," airing Monday, Feb. 12 at 9 p.m. on KET and Thursday, Feb. 15 at 9 p.m. on KET2, examines the leader of the Universal Negro Improvement Association (UNIA), a movement that would forever change the tenor of race relations in the United States.

Founded by Garvey and kindred spirit Amy Ashwood in 1914, the UNIA, with its motto of "One God, One Aim, One Destiny," attempted to foster racial pride and empowerment through industrial training. Garvey did not believe that integration was the solution to the oppression and impoverishment that besieged many African Americans' lives. Instead, he preached a gospel of black

self-reliance and nationalism.

The 90-minute documentary features powerful interviews with men and women whose parents joined the Garvey movement more than 80 years ago. Narrated by Carl Lumbly, the program is in an in-depth examination of one of the nation's earliest proponents of black pride.

Following each airing of the Garvey documentary, at 10:30 p.m., Nantucket: Rock of Changes tells the little-known but dramatic tale of the nation's first school integration suit. In the early 1800s, the tiny island of Nantucket was an exceptional place: a center of international whaling and one of the wealthiest ports in the world—a wealth shared by the island's white and black residents. Beneath this surface of tolerance and prosperity, however, the Quakers had drawn a well-established color line through the tight-knit community. The churches, meeting halls and cemeteries were segregated. The

peacefulness of the community rested on an uneasy foundation that crumbled when 17-year-old Eunice Ross was denied admittance to the island's only high school because she was

black. As a result, the black community launched a successful school integration suit, precipitating Nantucket's school desegregation in 1846.

## Frontline on KET investigates 'work' of hackers, exposing risks to our privacy and security

Designed to facilitate the free exchange of ideas, the Internet has become home to confidential, classified information from virtually every nation in the world. Financial information, national infrastructure, even state secrets can be accessed via the complex computer network that is the World Wide Web. But how safe is that information if computer-literate teenagers can break into top-security computer systems, infect them with viruses, or steal sensitive—even dangerous—documents?

Frontline "Hackers," airing Tuesday, Feb. 13 at 10 p.m. on KET and Saturday, Feb. 17 at 8 p.m. on KET2, investigates the role of hackers and reveals how their exploits highlight the profound insecurities of the Internet and the software that drives it. Through interviews with teenagers, security experts and law enforcement officials, the program illuminates a virtual world where many of our most sacred beliefs—including the very notion of "bordered" nations—are called into question. Many hackers are young, self-described "techno-nerds"

who devote considerable time and energy to demonstrating the vulnerabilities in computer software and the Internet. While these demonstrations range from small irritations to costly disruptions, most hackers claim to be doing a public service by exposing weaknesses.

Less well known among the general public are cases of cyber crime that threaten the stability of and public confidence in Internet banking and on-line commerce. Even more sobering, however, is the threat hackers pose to national defense systems. Frontline speaks with government officials who confirm that several cyber assaults—two of which attacked the U.S. Army's computer networks—have posed serious threats to national security.

## NEWS OF THE WEIRD

■ In January, a federal judge in Tampa locked up 1980's corporate raider Paul Bilzerian for contempt of court for allegedly hiding assets in a long-standing civil lawsuit in which the government is trying to collect a 1991 securities judgment that Bilzerian defrauded investors of \$62 million. In a recent bankruptcy filing,

Bilzerian claimed only \$15,800 in assets, listing even a \$5 Casio watch, but Florida law allows bankrupts to keep their homes, and Bilzerian has lived for years in an 11-bedroom, 37,000-square-foot lake-front residence with indoor basketball court, movie theater, nine-car garage and elevator (which he offered to rent out during the week of the Super Bowl for \$600,000).

■ Excellence in Education: In a Nov. 16, 2000, letter published in its entirety (except for naming the recipient) in Washington (D.C.) City Paper in January, the human resources director for the District of Columbia Public Schools informed a female job applicant that an investigation into her criminal record had been resolved in

her favor. According to the letter, DCPS accepted the applicant's documentation that the government had, for undisclosed reasons, declined to prosecute her cocaine distribution charge, her marijuana possession charge, her three dangerous-weapon charges, her shoplifting charge, her soliciting prostitution charge, and her destruction of government property charge (all during

1984-1992) and that the woman, thus with a clean record, is now "eligible for employment with DCPS."

### The Right to No Life

■ In December, a couple in Tangxia, China, was considering a lawsuit against the Tangxia Central Hospital for its failure to spare their baby girl the misery of being born (since undisclosed ultrasound

examinations had earlier shown that the girl, born in October, had two heads). And in France in October, a deaf, partly blind, mentally retarded 17-year-old boy won his wrongful-birth lawsuit against doctors who failed to counsel his parents that the mother's rubella during pregnancy almost certainly would

## Balderdash

My husband Ronnie isn't much for board games. Every time one is brought to the house for a Saturday night rumble, he complains that he doesn't want to learn or get into any new games as he has enough in his brain already. TriBond, Mindbenders, and Who Wants to be A Millionaire are a few of the recent ones.

However, there is one game that, ever since we've been married, every time the subject of games would come up, Ronnie would rave about this certain one. In fact, he said I was born to play this game because you don't have to know anything and it's all about being able to B.S. I wasn't sure how to take this so-called compliment, but I listened as he went on to

explain.

First of all, the game is one I'm sure a lot of you are familiar with, as it's been around for a while. It's called Balderdash. And it basically consists of a stack of about 500 cards that have strange words from all over the world on one side; on the other are the definitions. For instance, there's the word PROSOPOLEPSY which means "judging people to

be nice from their appearance." But most people would never have heard of that word so each player makes up a definition which they write down on a slip of paper; there's where the B.S. comes in. Again, you don't have to know anything like in all those trivia-oriented games, you just have to be good at making people think you do. All the slips of paper are given to a moderator (everyone takes turns being in that position) who reads all the made-up definitions including the real one. The way you gain points is by guessing the real definition from all of the phony ones, and by having other players mistakenly pick your definition as the real one.

That's where the fun comes in. In the older version of Balderdash, you only had words to contend with, but the new edition, Beyond Balderdash, gives you five

categories — words, dates, initials, people and movies. When the answers are read, the game can get pretty hysterical. In fact, Parker Brothers states in their rules that if the game "erupts into a riot the creators of the game will not be held responsible."

On Saturday night a word was given that was spelled BWLCH (don't ask me to pronounce it as there are no vowels in it). Some of the responses that came up in an attempt to bluff the other players were: "a small goat-like animal that navigates by scent," and "a Russian burp." While someone else claimed it was Czechoslovakian for 'Cheers'. One individual kept coming up with wonderful definitions that sounded almost too good. For BWLCH he put "pronounced Welch...this is the original tribe of the West Prussian Republic that fell in 742 AD." Now you have to admit that sounds official. But as it turns out BWLCH is a small mountain pass.

And then there was OMPHALOSKEPSI. The definitions ranged from "a viral disorder of the bronchial tissue" to "the Latin word for skepticism." No one picked the real definition because it sounded so absurd (which happened on several occasions). The word actually means "gazing at one's bellybutton while meditating."

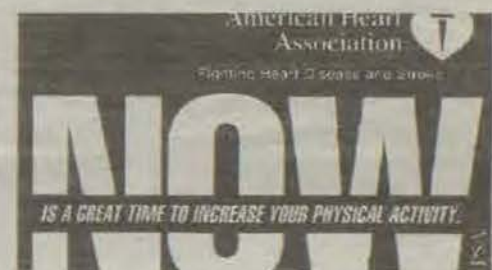
"You mean there's actually a word for that?" I asked. "But what if you can't see your bellybutton?" OK, I won't go there.

# Critter Corner

## What My Dog Has Taught Me

Life is divided into two important sections: Mealtime and Everything Else.

Mealtime:

Just because there

doesn't seem to be anything visible around to eat certainly doesn't mean there isn't anything around to eat. The act of staring at the underside of a table or chair on which someone else is eating sets in motion a chain of events that eventually

results in food.

It goes without saying that you should carefully check the lower third of any space for edibles. Mouth-sized things, which cannot be identified by sight or smell, are considered gum.

When you actually

receive a meal, submerge your head into it as you would a shower. Never, never look up again for a minimum of fifteen minutes after the obvious food is gone. This is important. Just because your dish is empty doesn't mean that it is time to stop eating.

Remember that all food is potentially yours up until the time that it is actually swallowed by another. The lengthy path a piece of food will take from a plate to a mouth via a hand is as good a time as any to stake your claim to it.

When it comes to selecting an appropriate beverage, location and packaging mean nothing. There are absolutely no exceptions to this rule.

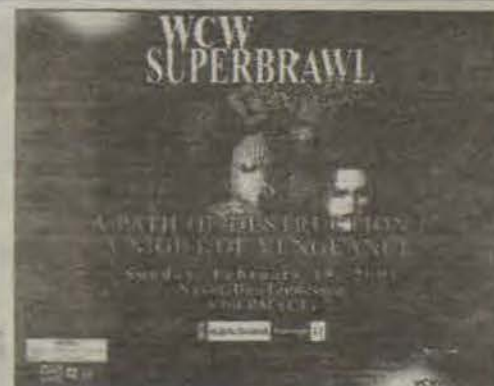

cause birth defects that would make his life not worth living. However, in January a Texas Court of Appeals sided with doctors and reversed a trial court decision that had awarded a couple \$42 million for their prematurely born daughter's dismal quality of life (blind, incontinent, brain-damaged, speechless, paralyzed in three limbs).

### Creme de la Weird

The New York Times reported in November that at least 23 small businesses (though one has 76 employees) are actually taking the far-fetched advice of a former agent and an accountant who give seminars showing how "Section 861" of the Internal Revenue Code actually exempts nearly all Americans from the duty to pay income taxes (and thus, that the firms need not withhold taxes from paychecks). The IRS director calls that interpretation "just plain nonsense," but the agency has for months allowed the companies to flout the law.

In November, prominent Vermont hunter Thomas N. Venezia, 41, was finally brought to justice after several shooting sprees, marauding through Canadian woods massively and maliciously violating game laws. An undercover agent quoted Venezia

after one illegal shooting: "I have the 'K' chromosome. I love to kill. I have to kill." Once, Venezia spontaneously leaped from a truck and started firing at ducks, then later at pigeons because, he said, he needed action because he had gone an hour without killing anything. At a hearing in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Venezia, sobbing, admitted the incidents and was permanently barred from Canada (though he remains licensed to hunt in Vermont).

The University of Michigan has accepted 15,000 personal papers of Unabomber-murderer Ted Kaczynski (an alumnus) and is housing them with, according to a December San Francisco Chronicle report, "all the academic solemnity that, say, Churchill's papers received when they went to Cambridge." Said a Kaczynski biographer, "Ted is obsessed with his public image." The university's decision is ironic, said Kaczynski's former prosecutor Steven Lapham, who points out that the man's private journals, introduced in his trial, showed that contrary to his alleged social and environmental reasons for his serial bombings, he merely "enjoyed taking other people's lives because he could."

### The Entrepreneurial Spirit

Apparently, the fragrance "Oh My Dog", from the French company Dog Generation, is selling well in Paris (at about \$30 a bottle, including complimentary shampoo), providing pööches (according to the label) "an emotional short-cut between dog and man." And in Baltimore (according to an October report in the Baltimore Sun), Susan Wagner continues to pursue her lawsuit against the maker of Paws and Effect (a cologne designed to be sprayed on cats to mask their natural odors, sold at a Nordstrom fragrance counter) for failing to put a clear-enough warning on the package that it was not for humans; Wagner claims serious, recurrent skin problems.

In November, the company 911 Computer of Korea introduced a \$60 hand-held lie detector that reveals deceptions by sensing voice tremors caused by stress-restricted blood flow (a technology developed for the Israeli military). The Handy Truster Emotion Reader can allegedly point out lies with 80 percent accuracy after being calibrated with truthful statements, but a company spokesman said it might not work against politicians because it can be defeated by "compulsive" liars.

### Recurring Themes

In 1999, News of the Weird reported on the 82-year-old retired chemist who had been living quite happily in a 200-square-foot room in the downtown Boston YMCA since 1949. In November 2000, former Navy man Orlan Lattimer, 81, finally moved out of his room at the Arlington Hotel in San Francisco, where he says he has lived since 1937. After a while on a waiting list, the city Housing Authority assigned Lattimer a studio apartment (with his first-ever private refrigerator and private bath) about a block from the Arlington.

### Dignified Deaths

Bob Talley passed away in London in December during his 100th birthday party, just after receiving a congratulatory telegram from the Queen and uttering, "Yes, I made it (to 100)." At a New Year's Eve performance of the Trenton (N.J.) Symphony Orchestra, first trumpeter James M. Tuozzolo, 57, passed away of a heart attack moments after rendering (according to the conductor) a "flawless" solo. In July, Percy McRae, 65, passed away of a heart attack moments after singing the national anthem for Chicago Cubs fans at Wrigley Field.
