Jonathan Jackson, director of the spillway project, will be present and prepared to demonstrate sample blastings in addition to providing answers to those Lake View Village residents who feel they may have suffered damage to their homes or property as a result of recent blasting. Jackson will explain how these complaints can be handled and detail how a damage report can be

The demonstrations should provide a firsthand look at what these procedures are capable of and Jackson urges residents to meet with the engineers on April 5 so that any questions that may still persist, despite efforts made so far to satisfy them, may be given his full attention.

Others from the Corps of Engineers, along with any contractors who are also involved with the project, will also be on hand

A gift of time

Hancock rallies fellow state workers to woman's aid

There are good people in this world who donate many things — money, clothing, food, labor — but there are some needs not so tangible. Occasionally adversity becomes so difficult that the very concept of time can become taxing, and when support and care is needed, there is often a desperate thirst, a hunger, for time itself

Connie Hancock understood this and so decided to make perhaps the most important donation of all ...

Hancock, the Floyd County PVA (Property Valuation Administrator), did not donate her time to a recognizable cause such as volunteer work, she actually encouraged other PVAs and staff deputies from around the state to donate their personal days to her friend and fellow worker, Donna Seeberger of Frankfort.

Revenue Cabinet's Personnel Department in Frankfort who is personally in charge of handling payroll for the Floyd County PVA office, recently found herself running out of time. Her husband, Steven, had underwent heart surgery and afterwards complications found him ill and in need of care.

Seeberger, who had accrued a certain number of sick days, decided to spend time with her husband at home and provide him with the constant care and support he so badly needed However, her sick days ran out.

"We kept asking when she'd be back to work," Hancock said. "We were told she would be off indefinitely without pay.

"Donna had been a real help. She's more than just a name in Frankfort or a payroll clerk. She has been a real friend. When we lost our PVA, my father Lowel Hall, in August, she helped us with the transition and the paperwork and made things more smooth."

It was after asking about Seeberger and being told of her indefinite status that Hancock realized that Seeberger had used all of her sick days and was now faced with a very daunting decision — work or family.

"When we found this out we decided to contact her to see if we could help by donating sick days ourselves," explained Hancock. "PVAs

Meetings to focus on business, jobs at federal prison

The federal Bureau of Prisons will be holding a pair of workshops next week to assist those who wish to work for or do business with a new high-security prison being built near the Floyd, Martin and Johnson county lines.

On Monday, April 9, representatives from BOP will be in the Sheldon Clark High School cafeteria to explain what jobs will be available at the new prison — named United State Penitentiary-Big Sandy — and what qualifications are required for each job.

The jobs workshop will take place from 6 to 8 p.m.

That meeting will be followed up on Tuesday, April 10, with a similar meeting for area businesses interested in doing business with USP Big Sandy. The business seminar will focus on what goods and services will be purchased by the prison and requirements for local vendors wishing to do business with federal agency.

The seminar will take place from 2 to 3 p.m. at the Martin County Senior Citizens Center.

The meetings are being hosted by Big Sandy Area Development District, Martin County Judge-Executive Lon Lafferty's office and the Martin County Economic Development Authority.

Equal pay urged for state's women

After playing more than three months of catch-up, the average Kentucky woman finally got to where her male counterpart was at the end of last year in terms of pay, and April 3 Gov. Paul Patton signed a proclamation declaring it Equal Pay Day to commemorate the event.

The day symbolically recognizes when wages paid to women for the last year plus what they have earned so far in 2001 equals what men earned in 2000.

"If we're going to realize our goal of making Kentucky all that it can be, we're going to quite simply have to use the resources of all Kentuckians," Patton said.

Equal Pay Day has been celebrated around the nation since 1979 as an effort to bring attention to the wage gap between women and men.

Nationally in 1999, women earned about 72 percent of what men earned. In Kentucky, which ranks 21st in the nation in terms of the wage gap, they earned 72.6 percent.

Women deserve equal pay for equal work, Patton said. He said state government has lead the way to bringing up women's

Best of all, she said, Jake set himself a goal: to get out of

Through his years in junior high school, "Jake" came to special education before he entered high school.

"He succeeded, and he will graduate from high school this spring," Kilburn said.

The payoffs of FRYSCs' hard work can be seen in several of the schools state Education Commissioner Gene Wilhoit recently visited on a tour of high-achieving schools that also have high percentages of students who live in poverty.

Wilhoit visited Lost Creek and seven other schools that turned in high scores on the Commonwealth Accountability and Testing System (CATS): Carlisle County Middle School, Cravens Elementary in Owensboro, Engelhard Elementary in Jefferson Roundstone County, Elementary in Rockcastle County, Silver Grove High School in Silver Grove, Elementary in Western Anderson County and Wrigley Elementary in Morgan County.

"One of the commonalties I noticed ... was the effect of the Family Resource and Youth Services Centers," said the Commissioner.

"The centers played an important role in those schools' success-just as important as any other major components of Kentucky's education system. They support not only the students, but their families as well, providing a warm,

As FRYSC directors like Kilburn know, meeting basic needs can often transform children's attitudes about schooling. Similarly, a vision or hearing exam can produce an immediate change in school performance.

After-school care for children, job placement for teens and adults and substance-abuse or mental health counseling might also spell the difference between a family environment that dooms children to school failure and one where all family members can thrive as learn-

FRYSCs exist to make that difference. Their assigned mission: Do what's necessary to remove non-cognitive barriers to learning, promote resources that strengthen families and improve student performance.

FRYSCs work hand-in-hand

welcome atmosphere to the with families to improve children's lives at home and at school. Kilburn's center, for example, hosts Christmas toy and distributes drives Thanksgiving food baskets every year. Robert Evans, director of Engelhard's Family Resource Center, strives to improve children's attendance. Kilburn said her center even held a pep rally to motivate children for the CATS test.

Her attempts proved successful as all of the staff in her office promptly filled out forms indicating how many hours they would be willing to donate. The forms were then sent to the payroll department in Frankfort where appropriate adjustments were made

Hancock's efforts did not end in Floyd County, however.

The adjustments were no sooner made in Frankfort than Hancock began to contact other PVAs in surrounding counties, informing them of Seeberger and her husband.

"We called surrounding counties with a chain-letter type setup," Hancock said. "I would call three or four counties and tell them about Donna and Steve and ask them to donate and also ask them to call three or four more and do as I had

The idea paid off as several surrounding counties followed Hancock and her staff's example and filled out forms to be sent to Frankfort and credited to Seeberger's personal days.

As a result, approximately 9 weeks worth of sick days were donated and Seeberger, who will now have a job to return to, can stay with her recovering husband free of concerns and worries that had been causing her added stress to an already stressful situation.

"We're like family when someone's in need," said Hancock. "It's not the first time this has been done. We always try to help others because at some point in time we may need it ourselves."





Gas wells threaten park

While exploring routes to the Midwest in the late 1700s, Daniel Boone came upon a marvelous passage through the rugged Pine Mountains.

Over millions of years, the forces of nature had sculpted this deep, rock-walled canyon that rises above the Russell Fork of the Big Sandy River.

Known simply as The Breaks, this beautiful gem of nature has long been a source of wonder and a place of lore.

How fortunate for all generations to come that in 1954 the states of Kentucky and Virginia decided to create the Breaks Interstate Park.

Situated on 4,600 acres along the border between the

two states and about 30 miles from Pikeville, it remains a marvel to behold.

Known as the Grand Canyon of the South, it is the deepest

gorge east of the Mississippi River. Its extraordinary beauty, winding trails, breathtaking vistas, inviting campgrounds, lure to anglers and wild waters attracted more than 380,000 people last year.

But now the Blue Flame Energy Corp. wants to drill natural gas wells on the rim of the gorge. The company says it can drill in the park because the well sites are on property acquired by the park in 1973 but acquired without the rights to natural gas and oil deposits beneath the surface. The owner held onto those. Not to worry, the company says, nobody will notice the drilling work.

That, of course, is ludicrous. Who wouldn't notice drilling rigs in a park? Who wouldn't be concerned about endangering the pristine environment of this gem?

People in Southeastern Kentucky are rallying against the drilling permits — but there are not enough people and not yet the right people.

It's time for the state to show leadership on this threat to a marvelous park. The state must step in and stop the

Then the legislature must buy the gas and oil rights. Without those rights there is no way to ensure The Breaks will remain a natural wonder for future generations to enjoy.

Quit smoking on 'Kick Butts Day'

We, the sixth-grade class of Adams Middle School, would like to remind everyone that Wednesday, April 4. is designated as national "Kick Butts Day." This is a day on which smokers are encouraged to stop smoking for one day.

We feel that one of the big reasons so many people begin smoking is all of the money that tobacco companies spend on advertising. In a recent survey conducted by the members of our class, we found over 3,000 smoking messages in a five-day period. These messages were found in many different places, including billboards, magazines and local stores. Many of the messages found were on items such as backpacks, tshirts, hats and sports equipment which are used by kids and teens. Ads found in magazines, television and movies are used to make smoking look cool or glamorous.

Unfortunately, these tactics and others seem to be working. During the fall, the Kentucky Incentive Program conducted a survey with area students. The results of the survey indicated that 9 percent of sixth-graders surveyed admitted to using tobacco between one and nine occasions, and 13 percent of sixthgraders surveyed said they had used tobacco products on 10 or more occasions.

Smoking is harmful. It is linked to many serious health problems such as cancer and heart disease. Smoking can also harm your reputation. It can make other people not want to be around you. It causes bad breath, yellow teeth and makes your clothes smell. Smoking is also a very expensive habit. It takes away money you could use on other

Governor Patton Outlines Certified Clean County Program

"This program can get us started now toward that cleaner Kentucky that we all want for ourselves and our children." Governor Patton told a news conference Friday as he signed an Executive Order that creates the Certified Clean County Program. "The state will provide existing resources as an incentive to help counties clean up their illegal dumps and adopt a mandatory "solid waste collection service to

free," Patfon added, Under the Certified Clean County Program, the state will reimburse eligible counties for 75% of the direct expense of cleaning up illegal dumps. Redirecting existing resources in the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority fund and the Transportation Cabinet Secretary's Discretionary fund would cover

keep their county clean and dump

be available through the next fiscal year but the governor expects to seek other funding sources to make the program permanent.

The Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Cabinet will provide assistance to participating counties in identifying illegal dumps and estimating the cost of cleaning them up. The Cabinet will also provide staff to monitor and assist in the clean up effort and inspect and re-certify the county as dump free on an annual basis.

Once all the dumps are cleaned up, the county will be designated a Certified Clean County and the state will pay for, install and maintain a Certified Clean County sign at each entrance to the county. Certified counties will gain extra points when applying for grants and get priority for funds from the Division of Conservation State

the cost. The funding would only Cost Share Program and the Waste gible counties 75 percent of the Tire Trust Fund.

To be eligible, counties must mandate a curbside solid waste collection service requiring all residents and businesses to use the service and pay for it.

"This Certified Clean County program is not the final solution to our problem. It is just one step that we can take now," Patton said. "I remain committed to a comprehensive program that includes a recycling and education component to cleanup Kentucky and keep it clean."

The problem will not go away until we take action and I will keep the issue in the forefront until we do take action," the governor said.

A new abbreviated number that deaf, hard of hearing or speech disabled individuals to communicate by phone.

Prior to 711, 800 numbers were used to access the Kentucky Relay Service. A different toll-free number was designated for deaf, hard of hearing, and speech disabled users. With the implementation of 711, callers across the state can quickly access and connect to the Kentucky Relay without knowing a 10-digit toll-free number. The three-digit number will connect to the relay from any telephone in the state, including pay phones and cellular telephones.

'Three-digit dialing is particularly beneficial to people traveling through the state, as well as first time users who are unsure how to access the relay," PSC Chairman Martin Huelsmann said. "With

711, any individual in the state who needs to make a relay call can do so quickly, without searching for or memorizing numbers."

Kentucky Relay users typically call the relay on a text-telephone or TTY. Hearing callers access the service with a standard phone. Calls are answered by specially trained operators called communication assistants (CAs), who facilitate relay calls by verbalizing the hearing impaired callers typed message and typing the hearing user's conversation word-forword so that it

may be read by the hearing impaired caller.

The Kentucky Relay operates 24-hours a day. There is no charge to access the relay or to place a local relay call. Regular charges apply to any long distance calls.

Water shortage advisories lifted

After almost two years of below-normal rainfall and below-normal stream flows, Kentucky experienced normal to above-normal rainfall in February. Nearly all monitored streams have remained in a normal range of flow for several weeks, and the Kentucky Division of Water is lifting water shortage advisories.

Water systems that were suffering from water shortages during the fall of 2000, are now at or near full capacity. A Water Shortage Watch had been in effect for 55 counties, and a Water Shortage Warning has been in effect for 33 counties. Advisory areas covered counties in the Salt River basin, the Upper Cumberland River basin, the Green River basin and the Tradewater basin. A Water Shortage Watch is issued when conditions are right for shortages to occur, a Water Shortridge Warning is issued when shortages are actually occurring in an area.

Some streams are flowing at levels below the long-term average for the date, but small reservoirs and lakes have filled to normal capacity, and groundwater levels have been recharged sufficiently to continue to keep stream levels up. The long-term outlook is for normal or nearnormal precipitation.

Assisted living certification underway







This Sunday when the green flag waves signaling the beginning of the Virginia 500 at Martinsville, Ken Schrader will be starting his 500th race. The M&M's Pontiac driver will become only the twenty-second driver in Winston Cup history to reach the milestone of 500 career

It has been a 16-year journey for the Missouri native, but during that time if you would have kept track of all the starts he made in different forms of racing, you would probably find that Schrader has actually started close to 2,000 races. While many of today's Winston Cup drivers enjoy their free time away from the demands of the race track, Schrader uses the free time to crawl behind the wheel of everything from a dirt track car to a truck in the Craftsman Truck

Schrader's first venture into Winston Cup came in 1984 when former NASCAR pace car driver Elmo Langley entered him in a race at the old Nashville Langley Speedway. Schrader for five races that year and during that time he was able to showcase the raw talents that would some day make him a regular at the Cup level.

His big break in the series came the following year when Junie Donleavy decided to take a chance on the rookie. The Richmond, Virginia car owner was known for giving young drivers their start and Schrader proved that all he really needed was good equipment to go along with his talent.

Schrader posted three top-10s during that first year with Donleavy on his way to a very respectable 16th-place finish in the final points standings. The year was good enough to win him

Winston Cup Rookie of the Year honors. He would stay on with Donleavy for two more seasons, highlighted by a 10th place final points finish in 1987.

1988 found Schrader moving to Rick Hendrick's operation where he would stay for nine seasons. It was during this span of his career that he became known as one of the best drivers that competed in the series. While with Hendrick he notched four wins to go along with five top-10 finishes in the season long points

As the 90s began to unfold, Hendrick along with many other owners decided that the way to do business in Winston Cup was by fielding multiple teams. Hendrick was also fielding cars for Winston Cup Champions Terry Labonte and Jeff Gordon which made it seem like that Schrader's team was becoming nothing more than an afterthought.

At the end of the '96 season, Schrader announced that he was moving to Andy Petree's team to drive the Skoal Bandit made famous by the retired Harry Gant. While the two never did make it to victory lane together they were competitive enough to put together three straight years finishing in the top-15 in the final points standings.

Schrader's tenure with Petree only lasted three years as he left to drive for MB2 Motorsports in 2000. The move was questioned by many as MB2 was a single car team in only its second year. He only posted two top-10's last season on his way to an 18th place finish in the points standings which was his lowest finish since coming into the series.

Midway through last season, MB2 obtained a second team with driver Johnny Benson. This move has proved to be beneficial for both drivers as Benson's team has become a fixture in the top-10 and Schrader's 10th place finish at Texas moved him into 13th place, only 34 points from being in the top-10.

Schrader is enjoying his resurgence this season and with the help of one of the highest profile sponsors in the sport has made MB2 Motorsports one of the more competitive teams in the series today. While Benson is expected to pick up his first ever win in the series this year, it may just be Schrader who gives MB2 its first ever win in the series.

eye connectors on the house side. We set to work with iron bars, trying to turn one connector and then the other.

The water crossed the highway and kept coming. By dark the house was surrounded and escape out off, other than by the bridge. We kept struggling to raise the bridge but it was slow going and we were able to elevate it only about a foot and a half in hours of work. A house swept away by the flood up-stream struck the bridge in the middle around nine and destroyed part of the floor, but miraculously that foot and a half proved sufficient to save the bridge. It was almost exactly the distance to the

Around midnight we had the bridge as high as we could get it to go so we decided to try and cross back to the highway side. The road was still open to Prestonsburg.

Talk about ghostly! There was a full moon and black scudding clouds, and wind, and rain, and the sound fiftyone feet of water, three hundred feet across, and a foot and a half down makes as it clears a tight turn and takes flight into a straight-away.

We got by the broken area by holding on to hangers and the support wire, which was, of course, quite low in the middle, but the whole affair was like walking on water. The bridge was about the length of a football field but the crossing seemed to take forever.

We did not run. It was not V.O.'s style."

The photographs accompanying today's story were taken the very next day following the midnight adventure of Turner and his father. He writes that the water, by this time, had started to recede.

As I read Mr. Turner's letter, I could visualize the entire scene as though I were watching an old black-and-

white starring James Stewart and some young Hollywood newcomer. As with all good writing, I wanted the story to continue.

Turner says that his career has taken him far and wide, including several trips abroad, "mostly to the Old Soviet Union and Eastern Europe. I had about as many close calls and 'adventures' as most people, but none of it could rival the joy and excitement of growing up in Floyd County in the Fifties. I feel sorry for those of you who missed it. You don't have any bridges to raise and you cannot visit with V.O. and Virginia Turner."

Thank you, Dr. Turner, for the trip back in time.

Dr. Jack Justin Turner, Professor Emeritus, Middle Tennessee State University, spent some of his youth playing the saxophone, basketball, and becoming an expert in foreign relations in part by refereeing the wars between his college roommates, one a Shi'ite Muslim, the other a Maronite (Catholic).

He has established and administered four scholarship programs, and been awarded the University Honor Society 'Outstanding Faculty Member Award,' the 'Outstanding Teacher Award,' and the 'Outstanding Advisor in the Arts and Sciences Department Award.'

Additionally, he has survived escaping a car bombing. an airport bombing, and a fistfight with two KGB agents in Moscow in 1991.

His career has been honored by way of proclamation by the Tennessee legislature in January, 2000.

He currently resides in Murfreesboro with his wife, Judith (Judy) Gibson Turner, formerly of Maytown, who has been voted "Teacher of the Year" for her school, Northfield Elementary.

Keep spring events festive; handle foods properly

Springtime is an especially festive time as our gardens blossom out of a winter sleep and we look forward to special observances and celebrations of the

Some traditional foods associated with spring festivities might contain organisms that can make people sick. Therefore, it is important to prepare, bandle and store these foods to destroy disease-causing bacteria present, as well as prevent development of these organisms in the foods.

Whether you're going to an egg hunt, Seder meal, graduation party, or neighborhood picnic, keep this season festive by cooking raw eggs, lamb, poultry, or ham sufficiently to destroy organisms that can cause illnesses. Remember to keep hot foods hot and cold foods cold. To keep cooked foods safe, maintain hot foods at 140 degrees Fahrenheit or refrigerate them at 40 degrees Fahrenheit or below. Don't let hot or cold foods stay out for more than two hours, because bacteria multiply rapidly at room temper-

Follow these food-handling tips to ensure a healthful, festive spring.

Store eggs in their cartons on an inside refrigerator shelf, where the temperature remains cooler than the door. Storing eggs in the refrigerator door also risks movement that could crack shells.

■ Wash your hands thoroughly with warm water and soop each time you handle eggs, including cooking, cooling, dyeing, hiding and storing. Also wash utensils, equipment and work areas with hot, soapy water before and after they

come in contact with eggs.

Buy eggs with clean, un-cracked shells that have been kept refrigerated at the store. Be sure the "sell by" date on the carton hasn't expired,

Don't color or hide eggs with cracked shells, because bacteria can enter these cracks and contaminate the eggs.

■ Hide Easter eggs just before the hunt, or put them out just before the Passover Seder plate is set on the table. Don't eat hard-cooked eggs that have been out of the refrigerator for more than two hours. Refrigerate hidden eggs immediately after they're found.

For quality and safety, use eggs within one week after you buy them; hardcooked eggs, within three days.

■ Use a meat thermometer to be sure raw meats reach an internal temperature sufficient to kill disease organisms. Cook fresh, raw ham to an internal temperature of 160 degrees Fahrenheit; raw lamb and beef roast to at least 145 degrees Fahrenheit, and poultry to 170 degrees Fahrenheit for white meat and 180 degrees Fahrenheit for dark meat.

If desired, heat fully-cooked, readyto-eat ham to 140 degrees Fahrenheit before serv y

Set the oven temperature no lower than 325 degrees Fahrenheit to destroy bacteria that might be present in ham. lamb, beef, or poultry products.

■ Keep fully-cooked, ready-to-eat ham in the refrigerator.

Refrigerate country (dry-cared) ham after you slice it. A sliced, uncooked ham can be refrigerated for two to three months, but only five to seven days after it's cooked.

Use raw lamb or beef within three to five days; otherwise freeze it and use within six to nine months.

Put perishable foods in the refrigerator as soon as the meal is over, but no more than two hours after you've taken them out of the oven or refrigerator.

Carve leftover meat off the bone, place it in small, shallow containers to speed the cooling process, and place in the refrigerator or freezer.



And one of the better savings vehicles you have available is a Section 529 plan, named after the portion of the IRS code authorizing these accounts.

You can establish a 529 plan for your children or grandchildren. And you can choose from two types of this plan:

Prepaid tuition programs-In a prepaid tuition plan, you buy future tuition credit-at today's prices-at an in-state, public

Tax-deferred savings plans-Under these plans, your earnings grow tax-deferred until you withdraw the money to pay for qualified higher educaton costs. Withdrawals are then taxed at the student's tax rate, which will typically be lower than yours.

Of the two arrangements, the tax-deferred savings plan is far more popular, because it doesn't restrict students to certain colleges in specific states, as does the prepaid tuition plan. In other words, you can invest in any state's plan. Also, you'll receive several other significant benefits, including the following:

· You can contribute large amounts. Generally, you can contribute more than \$100,000 per year to a 529 plan, although contribution limits vary by state. You may want to consider the applicable gift tax rules.

· You control withdrawals. If

you're the account owner of the 529 plan, you'll manage all withdrawals for the life of the account. The student doesn't automatically take control of the assets as the age of majority. You can even change beneficiaries, if you choose.

· You'll minimize the impact on financial aid awards. Because the money in a 529 plan is held in your name, it won't significantly jeopardize any financial aid packages your child or grandchild may resolve. Colleges generally require students to contribute 35 percent of their assets to pay for school, compared to less than 6 percent for parents.

The 529 plan offers some important benefits. But make sure you use your plan strictly for college. If you make a withdrawal for anything other than higher education expenses, you may have to pay taxes and a 10 percent penalty on the earnings at your tax rate. Also, keep in mind that different state plans choose different money managers-so you might want to research the organization that's investing your money.

But if you're satisfied that you've found a good 529 plan, give it some careful consideration-it can help you cope with the high costs of higher educa-





They were also prepared to handle blasts from residents who intended to ask questions, respectfully, about damage to their homes which seems to have manifested since construction began.

The mood was one of eagerness as the sirens indicating the five-minute warning for the blast sounded across the lake. As residents waited, many took the opportunity to talk with some of the engineers on hand from the various companies contracted to help with the blast.

"There will be more blasting along the south wall." Jim Mangon of Hilltop Construction able portion of hillside exploded said Thursday. "The blasting for that area should start in about six months, around mid-summer."

The south wall area mentioned has been worked on before during construction and puts the residents of the Lake View Village at the highest risk

Questions began with technical questions, explanations about blast specifics, but soon the subject of damages began to surface as Cindy Collins asked Mangon who would be responsible for the damages to the homes and property of the nearby residents.

the damage claimed. "There are many reasons damages can occur to homes such as frost during the winter," said Mangon.

Many of the residents claim that during the pre-blast inspections, done by Ed Walters out of Ohio, that they were not home at the time the inspector arrived and so received no pre-blast inspection, a vital concern for comparisons of before-blast and after-blast condition.

Mangon, when questions as to what these residents should do about not having been afforded this important aspect of the construction preparation, only claimed that he had taken care of all items of their concern.

"If there is damage done, we want it paid for," said Marshall.

have a federal permit to cross the Levisa Fork, we had to document its existence and get the state historic preservation officer, David Morgan, to agree to have it torn

Another reason permission was needed, according to Ross, was because of the uniqueness of the bridge itself.

"Because this bridge is unique we had to get permission," said Ross. "Four of its subtype exist in the whole country, two of which are located in Prestonsburg ... We had to design the new bridge with new features so that the uniqueness of the area would be preserved."

Those new features include ornamental lights and brown metal railing, but will not include the signature arch that has became as natural to the area as the surroundings

The bridge has had a while to mold to its surroundings. Constructed in 1932, during Prestonsburg's greatest period of growth and expansion, the bridge followed its counterpart, the West Prestonsburg Bridge, by only four years to become Floyd county's second modern highway bridge. The addition of the two bridges had a tremendous impact on the community, becoming the city's connection to the rest of rural

Floyd county. The grace and delicacy of the 161-foot high arch will be an attribute which will certainly be missed as it has long been viewed as an important element to the landscape, but, despite upgrades in the 1970s, when I-beams were introduced into its superstructure, and being listed in a 1982 survey of historic bridges of Kentucky as being the only concrete span still serving its original function, the Town Branch Bridge must now make way for a newer, safer struc-

Instead of an arch, the new bridge will have brown metal railings, various fixtures and also





Bush's actions betray coalfields

the voters of Eastern Kentucky and Western Kentucky got what they wanted when they chose George W. Bush over Al Gore in last year's presidential election. They preferred a conservative in the White House, and that's what they've got.

But the voters in the coalfields presumably wanted more than that. You have to believe they also wanted a chief executive who would do everything reasonable to protect the lives and welfare of their friends and neighbors who dig coal for a living. They didn't

The first blow was Mr. Bush's immediate effort to block Clinton administration rules that were written to help disabled, retired miners get their federal black lung benefits - money that would be spent in the coal counties.

The next disappointment was the forced departure of safety advocate Tony Oppegard from the U.S. Mine Safety and Health

As a political appointee, he had to turn in his resignation when the Bush administration took office. But Mr. Bush didn't have to accept it. And he shouldn't have, given the fact that Mr. Oppegard was leading the federal probe of Martin County Coal's spectacular slurry breakout, which dumped 250 million gallons of sludge and wastewater into miles of mountain streams.

About the same time that Mr. Oppegard left, the Bush managers also waved goodbye to MSHA chief J. Davitt McAteer, who was vilified by Big Coal for not having provided industry "a receptive audience." The truth, of course, is that the only appointee friendly enough to suit the coal barons would be one of their own.

That's what they're getting. Mr. Bush is replacing McAteer, a near-legendary health and safety advocate, with a Utah coal company consultant, Dave Lauriski. The head of the National Mining Association is delighted. Not surprisingly, the president of the National Black Lung Association isn't.

Mr. Lauriski's expertise is in showing coal operators how to deal with federal rules. Unfortunately, too many already believe they know how. They have perfected the RID system: Resist, Ignore and Denounce.

That's why relentless oversight is necessary, and why federal regulators, who operate at a safer distance from coalfield power brokers, typically have been more effective that their state counter-

The Martin County Coal incident is a textbook example of the industry's attitude and practice. Regulators say the firm misrepresented the size of the barrier between the 72-acre impoundment and adjacent mines, through which the flood of slurry broke last

MSHA had to face down a company proposal to modify and keep using the site after the break. Finally last week, the agency was able to approve a better approach, which environmentalists like and which will ensure permanent closure and reclamation of the disaster scene.

Gov. Paul Patton could do worse than find a place in his new state mining oversight system for Mr. Oppegard, who would bring



Just to be on the safe side, however, we did the neighborly thing and asked the people living behind us and in front of us if the chickens would present any problems for them. Their reply was no.



Money is where the power lies, and the little guy doesn't have a chance.



ike the state of Texas. Charlie Daniels is partly Western and partly Southern. His signature "bullrider" hat and belt buckle, his lifestyle on the Twin Pines Ranch (a boyhood dream come true), his love of horses, cowboy lore and the beroes of championship rodeo, Western movies, and Louis L'Amour novels, identify him as a Westerner. The son of a lumberjack and a Southerner by birth, his music - rock, country, bluegrass, blues, gospel - is quintessentially Southern. In fact, even his bent for all things Western is Southern, because his attire, his lifestyle, and his interests are historically emblematic of Southern working class solidarity with the "lone cowboy" individualism of the American West.

It hasn't been so much a style of music, but more the values consistently reflected in several styles that has connected Charlie Daniels with millions of fans, For decades, he has steadfastly refused to label his music as anything other than "CDB music." music that is now sung around the fire at 4-H Club and scout camps, music that has helped elect an American President, and music that has been popularized on a variety of radio

Charlie Daniels graduated from high school in 1955 and soon enlisted in the rock 'n' roll revolution ignited by Mississippian Elvis Aaron Presley. Already skilled on guitar, fiddle and mandolin. Daniels formed a rock 'n' roll band and hit the road.

When you hear a classic Charlie Daniels Band performance like, "The Devil Went Down to Georgia," you hear music that knows no clear genre. Is it a folk tale? A southern boogie? A country fiddle tune? An electric rock anthem? The answer is yes, to all that and more. And the same goes for "In America," "Uneasy Rider," "The South's Gonna Do It," "Long-Haired Country Boy," "Still in Saigon," "The Legend of Wooley Swamp," and the rest of a catalog that spans more than 35 years of record making

NEWS of the Weird...

-Fraternities at the University of the Philippines and other Filipino campuses stage many of the same activities (such as toga parties) that U.S. "Greeks" do except that some apparently engage in murder and bombings in displays of organizational power, according to a February report in the Far Eastern Economic Review. The prestigious UP has accounted for 11 frat-related homicides (of about 100 nationwide) in the last 10 years, in acts ranging from student executions to gang-type rumbles, and frat brothers now in government and industry allegedly help to shield their organizations from police scrutiny.

In a decision published in February, Canada's Tax Court rejected Newfoundland magician Hans Zahn's attempt to claim business losses on his income tax returns, ruling that Zahn's record of losing money for the last 17 years, plus the province's economy and the nature of its farflung communities, urge the conclusion that no reasonable person would think Newfoundland could support a magician. Zahn said he once earned about \$1,200 (USD) a week but started suffering setbacks; for example, the rabbits he

used in his act started dying in the frigid Newfoundland winters. "You try to bring worldclass entertainment to the regions," lamented Zahn, "and Revenue Canada (the taxing agency) penalizes you for it."

 Police in Jacksonville, Fla., arrested Robert Eric Denney, 19, for a 1998 murder, and a Florida Times-Union report in March revealed that his DNA is linked to the crime scene. Despite close surveillance, Denney had avoided giving up a DNA sample, three times foiling officers (refusing

a glass of water; putting a cigarette butt back in his pocket rather than discarding it: declining to lick-seal an envelope) and smirking that he knew what the officers were trying to do. Shortly after that, while walking around outside his workplace, Denney absentmindedly spit on the ground, and officers scooped up the saliva and rushed it to the lab.

People Different From Us

-News of the Weird has reported several times on cat "hoarders" who may "collect" felines as a form of obsessive-compulsive disorder, but none had the quantity of Jack Wright of Kingston, Ontario (361, down from his Guinness Book record 689 in 1994). He drew the attention of the Globe and Mail newspaper in January when he fell behind several months in mortgage and utilities payments because of litter, food and other cat expenses (about \$100 (USD) a day) and also because, unlike the typical hoarding case, the local Humane Society has no issue with Wright, in that his cats appear properly cared for.

Compelling Explanations

- In March, Charles Douglas Stephens Jr., was acquitted in Panama City, Fla., after only 15 minutes' deliberation, apparently because the jury accepted his indignant denial that he ever robbed a convenience store. Stephens had pointed out to police that he had served time for murder and that he would probably murder again if the circumstances warranted, but that he could not have robbed that Circle K because he would never have been "stupid enough" to leave witnesses alive.

- The Federal Communications Commission proposed a \$7,000 fine against WZEE-FM, Madison, Wis., in January for violating its "indecency" regulations by playing the raw, unedited version of the Eminem song "The Real Slim Shady" during hours when children could be listening. Station personnel defended themselves by saying that they of course had cued up the milder, edited version of the song but that "static electricity" caused the station's CD player to skip that and jump right to the nasty version.

- King of Denial: A 68-year-old repeat child molester, charged with impregnating his 13-year-old daughter, explaining himself (in Edmonton, Alberta, in February), said he only "accidentally" had sex with her when she slipped into his bed one night and that the whole thing was "a trap the Devil had set, not something I consented to or something I had control over."

 In February, Australian ex-soldier Frederick Somerfield, 79, won his appeal and will now receive a military disability pension, based on heart trouble that he said was caused by having drunk too much beer while stationed at remote locations during World War II. In fact, he said, some of the locations were so remote that the only alcoholic beverages available were very cheap brews, which were especially bad on his heart.

- Lawyer Craig Wormley, explaining his client to reporters in January (the client being the 19-year-old San Jose, Calif., college student Al DeGuzman, in whose home were found 60 explosive devices and four long guns along with a map and tape recording detailing a plan to make a Columbine-like attack on the De Anza College library and cafeteria): DeGuzman merely has "an innocent fascination" with bombs.

Least Competent Criminals

-In December, according to Albuquerque police, James Sammon skipped out on a tab at Paisano's Italian Restaurant, but his chances for success were not good because he was dining with his two young sons that night and left the 6-year-old behind. And a shoplifting suspect (Home Depot, St. Louis, January) left his 10month-old son behind as he fled the store's security guards; the baby's mother identified Vernell Parker, 41, as the alleged culprit, and he was found and arrested three days later.

Prodigles

The Philippine Daily Inquirer reported in December that a 9year-old boy started up a parked transit bus using a screwdriver and drove it an eighth of a mile in morning rush hour in downtown Quezon City before police overtook him. (He said his father taught him the trick with the screwdriver.) And 2-year-old Harry Fairweather caused a furor last winter in Winsford, England, by regularly setting off retail stores' shoplifting alarms just by passing by the detectors; medical exams have to date turned up no certain answers on how Harry could have such a strong electrical field around his body.

Least Justifiable Homicides

A 43-year-old driver was shot to death in Lynwood, Calif., in January because, stopped at an intersection, he refused to run the unusually long red light despite the fact that there was no other traffic, a reluctance that annoyed the driver behind him, who pulled out a gun and started firing. And a 56-year-old man who lived in unit 712 of a Miami Beach apartment building was shot to death in February, allegedly by the resident in 512 who had once too often endured the overflow bathtub in 712; the resident of 612, who usually mediated the men's disputes, was not home that day.

and represents more than 18 million in sales.

His resume includes recording sessions with artists as diverse as Bob Dylan, Flatt & Scruggs, Pete Seeger, Mark O'Connor, Leonard Cohen, Ringo Starr and Johnny Cash. His songs have been recorded by Elvis Presley and Tammy Wynette. His touring legend has been documented by ABC Newsmagazine 20/20. It's funny how you sometimes realize that life has come full circle. It doesn't seem like a long time at all (although in reality it has been twenty-three years) since I received the letter that changed everything. I was in Lexington, attending UK and working for the summer, when my mother called me from home. She was crying so hard I couldn't understand her, and she had to put my grandmother on the phone. Although she wasn't much more coherent. I finally made out part of what they were saying: "Congratulations. You have been accepted into the School of Veterinary Medicine at Auburn University!" I don't remember what the rest of the letter said, and it didn't matter. As soon as I got off the phone, I went tearing around the corner to the Chevy Chase Small Animal Clinic where I had worked for three years, first as a volunteer, and later as a licensed veterinary technician.

Being so close to the University, many of our clients were students, so we were a little slow in the summer. I distinctly remember running through the back door, yelling at the top of my lungs, rounding a corner in the narrow hallway (the clinic had been converted from a small house) and sliding into the front office, where Madelyn, the receptionist, had old files spread out all over the floor. I somehow vaulted across the stacks of records and landed in the door of Dr. Reeves' office, where I almost collided with her, coming out to see what all the commotion was about.

I had a vivid flashback of this when our friend Shawn called me Thursday evening with the same news. They always send the letter to your home address, and his mother had just read it to him. He is now at UK himself, and since it was too far to come running, he called the clinic. Het out a scream that almost caused Trish to jump through the office window, started crying and finally had to put Shawn on the phone's speaker so he could tell her himself. I felt about two hundred years old.

I moved to Auburn, Alabama in the fall of 1978. I was five hundred miles away from home and knew only one other person. Ironically, a girl from Pikeville that I had known since childhood had been accepted into the same class with me. It didn't take long to meet other people and find our way around, though, because it is really quite a small town. The best way I can think of to describe Auburn is to imagine the University of Kentucky plopped down into a town the size of Prestonsburg; it teems with students during the school year and seems almost deserted in the summer. The town has grown considerably since I lived there, but I like to remember it the way it was - very old, very Southern, and very quirky. The Sani-Freeze ice cream stand is gone now (we students called it the Sani-Flush, or just "the Flush"), but you can still get the best lemonade in the United States at the drugstore on Toomers Comer. The same old gentleman who has been making it there for close to forty years will squeeze the lemons for you fresh and ask if you want it regular or extra sweet. It was the kind of town where the theft of pop bottles from someone's back porch made the morning news on the radio.

The Vet School is located just outside town, about a mile down Wire Road (named for the route of the first telegraph wire in the area), and for a veterinary student, life centers here for four years. For the first two years we were immersed in the "basic sciences": anatomy, histology, physiology (where we were repeatedly told "You can't diagnose abnormal until you know what normal is.") We spent long hours peering through microscopes and dissecting cadaver animals, writing reports and taking tests; all the while cultivating ulcers, high blood pressure and the morbid sense of humor that is common to people in every medical field.

When we finally became juniors, the great milestone was getting our "greens"; the hideous shamrock-colored scrubs and receiving jackets that marked us as upper-classmen. Along with the greens we got long lectures on always representing our school and profession with a neat and conservative appearance. To this day I have an obsession with white shoe polish. Then we began clinical rotations, where we were actually allowed to work with animals! (Gosh, we'd almost forgotten those existed!). We had also carned other privileges, depending on the particular rotation. On Ambulatory, we were on call all night (expected to be able to get to the school within fifteen minutes no matter what). On Beef Cattle and Equine night watch we got to make rounds of the barns every three hours, usually accompanied by Tripod, the three-legged Large Animal Clinic's mascot cat. On Dairy rotation five of us were expected to milk the School's thirty-cow herd at 5:30am and 5:30pm (except for the lucky student who was assigned to bring the entire herd in, unassisted, thirty minutes earlier). There is nothing more terrifying than losing control of an entire herd of cows, some of whom have stopped to check out the feed bunkers, and the rest of whom are wandering aimlessly toward Wire Road, at the crack of dawn with no one else in sight. (Ask me how I know this!). Of course, all students were still expected to be in class promptly at 8:30.

Veterinary School: it's the adventure of a lifetime, and it will change your life in ways you can't even imagine yet. The best of luck to you,



Jody Ridley is often referred to as the 'Granddaddy' of short track racers. After a career of 35 years on NASCAR and other circuits, Ridley is returning for another season of competition in the NASCAR Gatorade All-Pro Series, which he has

won several times. To prove his longevity in the sport, he brought his son Anthony and grandson, Jordan Craven to a practice session at Mobile International Speedway, Mobile, Alabama in preparation for the recent NASCAR Gatorade All-Pro 200, March

Ridley's career began in May 1965 at Boyd Speedway in Chattanooga, Tennessee. In 35 years, Ridley has competed in almost every racing series in existence, including Winston Cup.

After several years running the big tracks in Winston Cup, the Chatsworth, Georgia native switched to shorter tracks because of sponsorship and the responsibility of raising a family. He and his wife, Margaret have a son Anthony, and daughter, Kim. "I can't say I like to race as much as I did when I was younger, but it's the only thing I know. I set out a couple years, and then ran three races in 2000. I kind of

got over it, but like I said, it's all I know, and here I am. We're going to give it a shot and see if we can win another cham-

Ridley ran a close second to Gary St. Amant in last December's Snowball Derby at Five Flags Speedway in Pensacola, Florida, "The track feels real good," continued Ridley. "Of course you never really know how good it's going to be until you get to running against others. From what I see right now, it's real good. "I've been coming to Mobile since the early 1970's and even though I didn't always win, I've ran good. I sat on the pole several times. Mobile is just a miniature Dover. The Dover track is one mile, Mobile is one-half mile. Maybe that's why I've always done well here.

On May 17, 1981, Ridley held off Bobby Allison and Dale Earnhardt to win the Mason-Dixon 500 at Dover, Delaware,

"Racing is a dangerous sport," said Ridley. "Accidents can happen anytime. I've never had a serious injury, but it's something that's there, and it can happen at any time. I've had some pretty bad wrecks where my car was torn up, but I've never been laid up. Racing has been good to me, and Mobile has been one of my best places to win or run good." Ridley will turn 59 in May.

2001 turkey season outlook

by LEE MCCLELLAN KDFWR

In 1978, Kentucky turkey hunters harvested only 44 birds. Most of this harvest came from remote areas of the Daniel Boone National Forest in eastern Kentucky and the Land Between the Lakes National Recreation Area in western Kentucky, Back then, outdoors enthusiasts could go their entire lives without seeing one of these regal birds in the wild in Kentucky.

Today, it's a much different story. They live all over the state in areas that would have been inconceivable just a few years ago. Wild turkeys have even been observed perched on a cent. An estimated 65,000 fence, far away from any trees, in a spacious paddock on one of central Kentucky's world famous horse farms.

"It's good all over!" exclaimed George Wright, turkey program coordinator for the Kentucky Department of Fish Wildlife Resources (KDFWR). Hard work and good management by agency personnel is primarily responsible for

the inning ended.

the expansion of wild turkey numbers in Kentucky.

A cold winter this year should place the spring turkey season at the peak of the mating season. The mild winters of previous years caused the peak of turkey mating to be a little ahead of the hunting season. That, in turn, caused harvest levels to be slightly below expectations. This year, however, "the timing looks good," Wright said. This year hunters will have the largest turkey flock in modern history to hunt. There are more than 160,000 turkeys now in Kentucky. There were 18,607 turkeys checked in last year with a hunter success rate of 29 perhunters participated in the 2000 spring turkey season and that

number is expected to grow. The flock has grown to the point where no area of the state is markedly better than any other area. "Hunt anywhere you can get permission," Wright said, "because our distribution is good over all the areas with decent habitat." Traditionally, the top turkey counties in terms of harvested birds are in the lower Green River Watershed such as Ohio, Muhlenberg, Butler and Hopkins.

However, central Kentucky ounties like Owen, Pendleton, Hardin, Bracken, Adair and Nelson are really coming on as turkey producers. "Hunters are capitalizing in more and more areas each season," Wright explained. "There's no secrets about turkeys.'

The Kentucky spring turkey season runs April 14 through May 4 statewide with a season limit of two male turkeys or turkeys with visible beards. Shooting hours are one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset. Only one gobbler may be taken in any one day. The

opening is a Saturday this year because the usual April 15 opening would fall on a Sunday, as well as conflict with Easter this season. When April 15 lands on a Sunday, the spring season opens the preceding Saturday - as it does this year.

"Let's all be very careful, too," Wright warned. "It could be more crowded than normal in the woods. Be safe and respect other hunters.'

Youth hunters should also be aware that on May 5 this year, those under 16 will be able to turkey hunt as long as they are accompanied by an adult if using a shotgun. The new Youth Turkey Day is designed to give younger hunters an extra opportunity without having to compete with adults. Youth hunters must comply with all other regulations and limits governing turkey hunting during this one-day hunt.

Lastly, all turkeys taken in Kentucky must be appropriately tagged and reported through the state telecheck system by calling toll-free 1-(877)-245-4263 on the day the bird is taken. Hunters not issued tags when they purchase a turkey permit, or hunters not required to have a permit, must make their own carcass tags to use while hunting.

With a great flock and good weather, this year should offer the best chance at a turkey since Simon Kenton hunted them.

Sportsman's License

Outdoors enthusiasts have a way to save time and money this year by purchasing a Sportsman's license. The \$80 Sportsman's license seems a little steep at first, but includes a hunting and fishing combination license, spring turkey permit, statewide deer permit, state waterfowl permit and a trout stamp. These licenses and permits bought separately run \$87.50. The only things not covered are the federal waterfowl and migratory bird permits

and fall turkey permits. Persons who purchase a Sportsman's license do not receive carcass tags for turkey and deer, and are required to make their own while hunting.

Quota elk hunt applications are available until May 31, 2001 for Kentucky's first elk hunt. They are \$10 and available wherever licenses are sold and over the internet at www.kdfwr.state.ky.us. You may also call 1-877-598-2401 (KY-TAG-01) to purchase an elk quota tag or other licenses.

All applicants are eligible for a collector's patch commemorating Kentucky's first elk hunt. To receive a patch, send proof of purchase of the permit or your social security number and a selfaddressed stamped envelope.



None of these can surpass the pleasurable strolls over the hills in the autumn on what we have come to know as the Left Hand Fork on the farm where our ancestors for centuries have lived and died. It is the best place in the western hemisphere to unboggle the mind and settle down without distraction.

Through ankle-deep leaves I follow the paths surveyed by the wild animals by constant use for an eon, and which have proven to be the easiest and most accessible routes to travel. Near the top of the mountain is a "flat" where the leaves have drifted and form a likely place to half-sit, half-recline and reflect.

A short climb away on top of the hill are the "raven rocks," so named generations ago by my ancestors whose name I bear. From what I am told. Youth violence: "I could kill you!"

Well, it happened again. That is, life just seems to follow the old wise tale, and "Everything comes in three." After reviewing last week's work, I realized that I had a "run" of children who had threatened violence in regional schools. Apparently, the usual school board's policy must be "something" similar, "If a student threatens bodily harm to another student and/or school personnel, then said student is to be suspended until a mental health professional evaluates the child in an effort to determine whether or not the student would be a threat to the physical welfare of another person." What would you think and/or do if you were asked to come to the school, talk with officials, and have your child suspended because he or she threatened to "kill" a student or

As would be expected, the characteristic most common for the three children, who were actually interviewed, was that they appeared and acted as though they were very frightened. One was 10-year-old Sarah, who had been seen in therapy before. Thus, she and her mother were very familiar with what to expect. Ms. Mom spoke up quickly. She explained what she thought had happened and what the possible contributing factors had been. Sarah had probably begun showing signs and symptoms of depression and anxiety last November. She had her first fight at school about that time. Sarah had also been revealing some physical indicators, head

and stomachaches that seemed to be related to stress. In fact, her pediatrician had prescribed an anti-depressant medication the week before she was interviewed. An overall impression was that Sarah's problems at school mainly had to do with her interactions with classmates. Several boys had been "picking" on her in a bullying fashion. She reacted inappropriately to their remarks and behaviors so that she was "caught" by the teacher for not following classroom rules. Then, she often had to sit on the bench during recess and watch the other kids play. Of course, other students would tease her about not being able to play. The specific final blow arrived while Sarah was fighting her "best friend". In the heat of the fight, Sarah reportedly told the other kid. "I could

kill you." During her interview, she was quick to admit that she never intended to harm her good friend.

The next child, about Sarah's age, also threatened to kill another student during a fight. Gail and her mother were also well known; she had psychological testing last year. In addition, Gail has received mental health services since she was really young from a variety of sources-psychiatrists and therapists in outpatient settings and

Question: My daughter came home from college at spring break with a rash over her chest and arms that has been very itchy. She went to the student health center at her school where the doctor diagnosed it as pityriasis rosea. What is this and are other members of the family likely to get this rash? She's had the problem now for about three weeks, and it doesn't seem to be getting much better. How long will she suffer from this?

Answer: Pityriasis rosea is a common skin disorder that afflicts females about one and one-half times as frequently as it does males. Seventy-five percent of those with this disorder are between the ages of 10 and 35, but individuals of any age can get it. Your college-aged daughter is probably close to the mean age of 23 for those pityriasis rosea. Fortunately this problem is a benign one in that it has no serious health implications other than the rash.

Daughter's Pitriasis Rosea is common skin ailment of college-aged women

Pityriasis rosea often begins with a single oval-shaped or round area of "rash" that has fine scales near its edge and measures from one-half to four inches (one to 10 cm) across. This so-called "herald patch" can appear anywhere on the body, but most often it is on the trunk. It is called a herald patch because it precedes - or "heralds" - the development of fullblown pityriasis rosea. Within five to 10 days after the herald patch, numerous smaller oval or round lesions appear in a symmetrical pattern on the trunk and extremities.

What I've just described is a "textbook" case of pityriasis

Of course, not everyone reads the medical books before they come down with an ailment, so they don't get the story "just right." These people can have the rash of pityriasis on their lower arms, face or in other ways that are atypical for this disease. In addition, they can have blisters, bumps or hives instead of the typical pityriasis lesions.

Some individuals have low fever, muscle aching, headache and other common symptoms of mild illness preceding the pityriasis rosea. In addition, there have been a few reported outbreaks in army barracks and college dormitories adding support to the theory that this illness is caused by an as yet unclassified type of viral infection. Consequently, there is probably a very small chance that others within your family could share your daughter's spring break malady.

Pityriasis rosea typically takes two to 12 weeks to clear up. Some people have very intense itching with this illness. but fortunately, most do not. No medicine really speeds the healing process, although the use of prescription or non-prescription topical and oral medicines are often of help for the itching. The lesions eventually clear up, although it may take several more months for the subtle increased or decreased pigmen-

tation at the sites of previous lesions to totally fade away.

If this doesn't describe what your daughter is experiencing now, then I'd suggest that she see her doctor again. There are several other conditions that can initially look like early pityria-

Postscript: Unceasing wonders

Driving south on US 23, toward Prestonsburg, in the East Point area, I recently saw a wondrous sight, a sight I wish could have been captured on something more tangible than my mind. I'd love to be able to point to a photo, one I'd have had enlarged to poster size, and say, "This is the bobcat

I saw on a clear day in early March 2001, near the border of Floyd and Johnson counties. A brown, boxy car, of nondescript (to me) make was in front of me

in the right lane. Behind me, two empty coal trucks were racing back to their loading point, trying to get in as many runs as possible on this crisp, blue-sky day. Other vehicles were headed north in the other set of lanes

But the bobcat, distant kin to the mischievous and wiry critter at my house who gets stuck between doors, was going west to east, against the tide, bound for Cannel Coal Gap, where perhaps it had a family waiting.

Awesome is a word we overuse these days, so much so that its become almost laughable. But the sight of this big, graceful cat was awesome. Its movement was that of a natural machine. As the powerful hind legs flexed in the air, the front paws touched earth. Then the back legs came down, shoving off, and the front legs leapt forward.

The movement was much too fleeting, yet the whole scene, for a second, was played in slow motion. Every driver seemed to let up on the gas, as if we were all part of the same brush stroke. We all merged into the painting of this special point in time.

A different kind of wonder has to do with the recent Presidential proclivity to open more natural park lands to gas and oil drilling. We have the right, we believe, to buy our children every piece of plastic ever conceived to fill their empty lives. We have the right, we believe, to walk around comfortably in our homes in our underwear and bare feet when the temperature outside is frigid, just as we have the right to turn the thermostat in our sealed-up houses to 65 degrees when the summer sun

The word that is not being uttered, certainly not by government officials, is that dirty, profane 12-letter word that we haven't taken seriously since the 70's. CONSERVATION. No, conservation would be the opposite of everything we've come to know; it would be inconvenient, something we can't abide. Conservation might mean that the President and his fuel financiers would have to park their trophy trucks and risk a sweat stain on their imported suits. Conservation might mean that we reuse some things that we normally put in the garbage (or toss out the car window), that we readjust our HVAC comfort level and that we car pool or scale down to a more efficient car.

If we wait for our leaders to set the example, however, I'm afraid we're in for a long wait. This may be a wonder that does not cease.

ing and she said, "I could kill you!" The third child was a very angelic looking boy and was several years older than the girls. Fred and his mother had never been involved with mental health providers, so he appeared really frightened by the whole affair. He was quiet, did not speak unless spoken to, and then sometimes looked at his mother to rescue him with the answer. Fred appeared so shy and withdrawn. An opinion was that this behavior was very different from when he talked to a friend in the school hall about wanting to harm a teacher. Based on the information Fred's mom gave about their family and their routines, there certainly were some "red flags" that are likely to increase the possibility of family problems. Some examples pertained to her mother and father's parenting style with teen-age children perhaps not having routine rules with

predictable consequences. Similar to other situations with children and families, the prevention of youth violence at different stages of life has been studied. A psychologist (Richard Tremblay, Ph.D., University of Montreal) in Canada decided to explore programs for children since he considered treatment after adults and juveniles were in prison to be unsuccessful. He began a research project with 1,037 6-year-old boys and observed them for many years. His two year intervention consisted of three parts: a home-based parent training program; boys identified as disruptive received training for social skills within a larger group of children who were "socially" OK; and teachers were taught how to best promote prosocial behavior and how to deal with disruptive behavior. As expected there were a variety of outcomes from the researcher's program. No differences were found during the first two years after the program. This might be explained from the point that it sometimes takes extended time to really notice a significant change in family behaviors since so many different

habits of various individuals need to

school. For example, the boys in the "treatment" group were more likely to be well adjusted and half as likely to have serious behavior problems. In addition, they were less likely to be friends with boys with problem behaviors, as compared to boys who did not receive treatment, and mainly interacted with other disruptive kids. Again, the "treatment" group boys had a lower rate of delinquency, a lower rate of gang involvement, and a decreased likelihood of school failure.

Although these improvements were shown, the intervention was not thought to lower the level of aggressive behaviors in the children. After looking at young infants, the research's study concluded that aggressive behaviors were not shown much before 5 months of age, but peaked at about 24 months, and then gradually declined. Additionally, other conclusions were that children with siblings were more prone to be aggressive than only children, which was especially true for females. Another opinion was that physical aggression is an innate characteristic of children rather than a learned behavior. It is prosocial behavior, how to act reasonably, and control of aggression that are learned.

Needless to say, the majority of children do learn to control their aggressive tendencies and do well within society. However, 4 to 5 percent of boys do not learn to do so and are more likely to be involved later with delinquency, violence, and then crime. When the original group of kids was 17, about one-third showed various problem behavors in middle and high school. One-third of this smaller group had been arrested, 90 percent were significantly behind in grade level by age 14, and more than 40 percent were sexually active by age 13. The two greatest risk factors identified as contributing to these youngsters' antisocial and violent behaviors were low maternal education and having a teenage mother. A guess is that these mothers may have been less likely to maintain consistent rules and consequences for their chil-

As with so many problems, youth violence can be prevented, if only the adults in children's lives will take their part of the responsibility long before the children know what is really happening or have to deal with it and themselves.

Research Shows Egg Benefits



According to the American Heart Association, it's now okay to eat an egg a day. Based on a Harvard study published in 1999 as well as decades' worth of other research, it is now accepted that saturated fat is the major dietary culprit in raising blood cholesterol levels, followed by total fat. Eggs are a medium fat food and almost two-thirds of a Large egg

yolk's 5 grams of fat is unsaturated.

In addition to recognizing that eggs are not a significant dietary risk factor for heart disease; health professionals point out that eggs can even be part of a weightloss diet. According to Keith-Thomas Ayoob, Ed. D., R.D., a spokes-person for the American Dietetic Association, the 75 calories in a Large egg are "packed with essential nutrients and beneficial antioxidants." Because they contain significant amounts of nutrients compared to their calorie count, eggs are a nutrient-dense food.

For healthful eating, Ayoob recommends serving eggs along with whole-wheat toast and orange juice, instead of more fat-laden foods. He also suggests cooking eggs without fat - poached or hard-cooked eggs, for example or cooking them with either a vegetable oil spray or olive or canola oil.

Further research has shown that eggs provide health benefits beyond those previously understood. Besides the egg's high-quality protein, other egg nutrients may be helpful in retaining good vision and ensuring good memory. The lutein and zeaxanthin in egg yolks may help protect against age-related macular degeneration, a leading cause of blindness among older Americans. Scientists also believe that the egg yolk's choline may help ensure proper infant brain development and memory capacity

From early development to maturity, eggs can be a part of a healthful diet based on the Food Guide Pyramid. Eat eggs along with plenty of grains, vegetables, fruits and low-fat dairy products for well-balanced meals.

Arts academics funding increases five fold

In a remarkable show of support for the Kentucky Center for the Arts' Academies for Teachers, the Kentucky Department of Education has announced that it will increase its financial commitment to the program from \$30,000 last year to \$150,000 this year. Developed by the Kentucky Department of Education, the Kentucky Center for the Arts, and the Kentucky Arts Council, this professional development seminar was designed to prepare teachers K-12 to meet KERA mandates in arts education.

Last year in the Department of Education's Region 8, covering southeast Kentucky, 27 teachers benefited from the Academy. The additional funds will support five Academies, serving six out of Kentucky's eight regions, and reaching 150 teachers. Region 8 will pilot an Academy in Visual Art and Music at Perry County Central High School (tentative), July 9-13. In addition, four Academies of Dance and Drama are being planned: July 16-20 at the Glema Mahr Center for the Arts at Madisonville Community College (Regions 1 & 2); July 23-27 at Atherton High School in Louisville (Region 3); July 23-27 at a site to be determined in Region 6; and July 16-20 at Ashland Community College (Region 7).

"We are excited about this partnership with the Kentucky Center for the Arts," said Education Commissioner Gene Wilhoit. "We are expanding our support team. The Arts' Academies for Teachers provide valuable professional development opportunities and resources. With increased funding, more teachers will be able to use those resources to enhance student achievement in the arts and humanities component of their curricu-

Each Regional Service Center will contact the school districts in their regions to select the teachers who will participate in the Academies. Teachers receive a stipend of \$500 to attend a pre-Academy workshop, the five-day Academy, and a post-Academy follow-up. During the Academies, leading artists/educators will lead teachers in a variety of hands-on arts experiences and demonstrate how those experiences support KERA mandates. Teachers will also see presentations by cultural resource speakers from such organizations as KET, the Kentucky Center for the Arts, and the Kentucky Arts Council. The Department of Education hopes to expand the Academy to serve all eight of Kentucky's Service Center Regions in coming years.
