## Thompson unveils plan to extend sewer lines

PRESTONSBURG - The Floyd County Fiscal Court met Friday for their regularly scheduled meeting and devoted two hours to completing a lengthy

The meeting started off with an announcement by Judge-Executive Paul Hunt Thompson, who said that he is embarking on a project that will take longer than his current term to complete. The effort has been dubbed "Pride on the River" and aims to provide sewer lines to communities along the Big Sandy River.

Thompson said that the scope of the project would prove very costly and said that it has been broken down into three phases which will eventually terminate the dumping of solid waste into the Big Sandy from sewer systems which have no place else to discharge waste products. He said that 1,300 pounds of waste goes into the water daily in areas like Mud Creek and remarked that the project would prove useful to the community by solving three related problems from the practice, which include public health

issues, water quality and the chance for economic develop-

Thompson also noted that the project is off to a good start with pledges of support from Pike County, which will help by accepting waste from the Betsy Layne and Harold areas while treatment stations are developed in the Mud Creek area. The project will prove costly, with an estimated \$26 million price tag for all three phases of the concept.

The court also welcomed local Red Cross Director Bob Carpenter, who thanked the county for the support offered in a recent drive to aid Gulf Coast victims of Hurricane Katrina. Thompson chimed in that the Big Sandy Region is the fourth biggest contributor in the commonwealth and noted that many donations were made in small increments of \$1 to \$5. He said that those who gave could barely afford to, but that the numbers of givers was so great that it quickly added up to an impressive figure of over \$200,000.

The court also discussed a late bond payment from Mountain Racing. Many griped about the lateness, saying it had happened

before. A small dispute broke out when Magistrate Jackie Owens opined that the track makes millions and is consistently late in making payments for which the fiscal court is ultimately responsi-

But Thompson said that the track probably doesn't make much money and added that he would oppose any plans to add slot machines to the facility at Thunder Ridge if the government made such amusements legal.

Owens countered that the county could raise money by penning off the parking lot at the facility to house pigs, but the court eventually stopped needling the track and opted to give them a week to come up with the pay-

The court also opened bids from area companies to purchase land near the dump at Garth and awarded the parcel to Blackburn Natural Resources, which offered the highest bid at \$212,000.

Citizens comments closed the session with the fiscal court bowing out of the ongoing disagreement between Mayor Jerry Fannin and former mayoral can-

## Clerk's office taking donations to help veterans

of the clerks' HAVE (Help a Vet Today) program.


The way Waugh sees it, that there is a duty for clerks, whose offices oversee elections, to honor vets.

### Expert: Kentucky's math, science standards need narrower focus

LOUISVILLE - A national education expert is advising simplicity for Kentucky's math and science curriculum, saying the current standards don't give students time to grasp basic concepts.

William Schmidt, Michigan State University eduprofessor. Wednesday that students should be taught fewer concepts, but be taught them more in-depth.

You have to think seriously about cutting out some stuff," Schmidt told Jefferson County school officials. "You're doing too much.'

Schmidt was brought in by

the school district to give his expertise on how other, highachieving nations teach their students in math and science. The school district is trying to improve the standards as part of a \$25 million education initiative sponsored by General

Schmidt drew comparisons between Kentucky's math and science standards and those in high-achieving nations, like Singapore and The Netherlands.

For example: While firstgraders in those countries learn only three math concepts, including meaning, measurement and number operations such as addition and subtraction, Kentucky students learn 22, from 3-D geometry to prob-

Brent McKim, a physics teacher and president of the Jefferson County Teachers Association, said many teachers would agree.

"That's what I've been preaching," he said.

In Jefferson County, only 38 percent of students demonstrate proficiency in science and math. But narrowing the number of concepts taught in certain years could have implications for textbooks and materials, school

officials said. Paula Wolf, presi-

dent of the district parentteacher association, said the

wisdom of narrowing standards "would depend on what they (might decide) to cut out."

The district hopes to use the four-year GE grant to raise the percentage of proficient students to 70 percent by 2010.

### Teens need more driving practice before getting licenses, lawmakers told

make up only 6 percent of Kentucky's drivers, but they account for more than 13 percent of drivers involved in fatal crashes.

The number of crashes could be reduced and lives would be saved if Kentucky required teens to get more driving experience before getting full driver's license privileges, a federal transportation safety official told members of the General Assembly's Health and Welfare Committee on Wednesday.

"Unfortunately, Kentucky has a rather weak law in gradu-

FRENKFORT - Teenagers ated licensing statues," said Steve Blackistone, state and local liaison for the National Transportation Safety Board. "It's one of the weakest in the nation."

Blackistone said Kentucky is one of four states that doesn't require drivers with learner permits to go through an intermediate phase before getting fullfledged driver's licenses.

"The Safety Board has recommended to all states and recommends to Kentucky that you implement a three-phase process by adding an intermediate license during which the driver would be able to drive with restrictions on their licenses to ensure they're driving only in the safest of conditions," Blackistone said.

Intermediate licensing phases often place restrictions on nighttime driving, the number of passengers allowed in a vehicle, and cell phone use, Blackistone said. "Learning to drive and being comfortable in traffic requires all the concentration that a novice driver can muster."

Rep. Tom Burch, D-Louisville, noted that he has prefiled legislation that would create a six-month intermediate phase that a new driver would have to go through after holding a learner's permit for six months. Identical legislation has also been prefiled by Sen. Denise Harper Angel, D-Louisville.

In each measure, intermediate drivers wouldn't be allowed on the road between midnight and 6 a.m. and would be prohibited from having three or more passengers under the age of 18 who aren't family members. New drivers would also be required to finish a driver training program and maintain a clean driving record throughout the intermediate phase before applying for a full license.

Other states that strengthened their graduated license laws have reduced traffic accidents, according to Blackistone. "There have been a variety of studies in other states that have shown a reduction in crashes involving the effected groups ranging from 25 to about 60 percent," he said.





## Strictly political

Strict construction of the law is a conservative mantra. So is tough enforcement.

But court documents in the JOBTROT merit hiring case show that a top official in the administration of self-styled conservative Gov. Ernie Fletcher wanted to rig the

Personnel Board operation, by replacing legal mandates with political convenience.

Keith Hall, who at the time was the state's \$121,958 homeland security director, said in an e-mail that the board's top administrator should be fired, and that hearing officers should be made to "look at life correctly," meaning the administration's way.

This is the same Mr. Hall who said, in another e-mail, that the Fletcher administration's network of eight regional offices, comprising the Local Initiatives for a New Kentucky (the officially disbanded LINK system, which has yet to be shut down), was an undervalued asset for its two main clients, the governor and his "political field opera-

Somebody should ask Gov. Fletcher whether he was part of this effort to subvert handling of state personnel cases before the board.

On second thought, the administration hasn't exactly been forthcoming on the subject of Mr. Hall. It initially billed his resignation as voluntary. The governor finally admitted firing him.

In an attempt to discredit Attorney General Greg Stumbo's investigation of merit hiring violations, Gov. Fletcher regularly has insisted that the proper place to have taken any complaints was the Personnel Board. Apparently, he expected them to get a proper welcome there, at least from his political point of view.

The governor had installed his own man, John Chowning, as board chairman, and Mr. Hall was pushing for Mr. Chowning in turn to get rid of executive director Mark Sipek ASAP. "The whole point of having the chairmanship is so Chowning can ensure those hearing officers look at life correctly," Mr. Hall explained in an e-mail to Commerce Cabinet official Teresa Hill.

During Mr. Chowning's tenure, the board did put Mr. Sipek on a formal evaluation schedule that will include a review in January. Of course, given what's now known about the administration's scheming against the Merit System, any finding that the executive director performs poorly would be, to put it gently, highly suspect.

The Fletcher approach to the Merit System was strict all right. Strictly political.



### Bush's pain, McCain's gain

Katrina has indeed altered our politi-

cal landscape: For the first time in years, conservatives have listened to Arizona Sen. John McCain talk about a high-profile domestic issue and have nodded their heads vigorously. The maverick Republican made his reputation by bucking his own party, especially its conservative

base, and, after his failed 2000 nomination bid, seemed to want to make a career out of it.

After Katrina and the countless billions of dollars that began pouring toward the Gulf Coast, conservatives clamored for spending offsets elsewhere in the budget, and there was McCain right there with them, excoriating porkbarrel spending (as he always has) and calling for repeal of the massive new Medicare prescription-drug entitlement. In a major battle between conservatives in Congress who want to cut spending, and the party's leadership, which is - to prospect, McCain is with the conservative rebels.

This is so important because, if he runs, McCain is probably the front-runner for the Republican presidential nomination in 2008. But he's an odd frontrunner, a front-runner whose campaign

> is almost certaindoomed unless he handles conservatives better than he did in 2000.

McCain will come out of the gate with formidable assets. them among near-universal name recognition, media adu-

lation and crediagain lets another major candidate get to his right on nearly everything - as he let President Bush in 2000 - his campaign will again attract independents, but not the Republicans who are by definition necessary to win the Republican nomination.

So McCain is in a different game from other potential candidates. They need money, media attention and insider buzz. McCain needs the right to stop loathing him, and he seems to realize it. Indeed, McCain's campaign will strain

put it mildly - unenthusiastic about the his capacities for insincerity. If a second marriage is the triumph of hope over experience, a second McCain presidential campaign, to be successful, will have to be the triumph of experience over the candidate's own predilections.

> McCain has never demonstrated great affection for social conservatives, whom he blasted in 2000. But he can work around these things. He recently endorsed teaching Intelligent Design in schools, although he probably has as much sympathy for this critique of evolution as The New York Times editorial board does.

McCain will be the strongest performing Republican against Hillary. Clinton in early opinion polls; if any thing, he is more aggressive on the War on Terror than Bush is; he will have a strong theme of returning to a cleaner Republicanism after the ethical lapses of the current congressional majority. And all of this will be wrapped in his app ing thematic mix of patriotism, sacrifice

The problem for McCain is that he has such a richly layered history of apostasy, including on conservative gospel like the Bush tax cuts. A strong conservative candidate who unites the right can take him down. But for that candidate, the less conservatives nod their heads at anything McCain has to say, the better.

### Baseball and intelligent design

There are those who still believe that baseball evolved from other, more ancient, games. An absurd notion. It is quite obvious that baseball sprang forth directly from the brow of God. The game is far too complex to have "evolved" through a series of fortunate accidents. Think about it: The distance from the pitching rubber to home plate is sixty-feet, six inches. Not an even sixtyfeet nor sixty-one, but sixty-feet, six inches. Yet the distance between bases is an even 90 feet. Ask a knowledgeable baseball person where those distances come from and silence will be your

The rules of batting are no less arbitrary. A batsman is given three strikes to hit a ball thrown over home plate at a height above the knees and below wherever the umpire decides that day. A ball thrown into that area but not swung at is a strike. A strike is also recorded when a pitch is hit into foul territory that is, outside the lines drawn from home plate to first and third bases and stretching into infinity. (Part of the charm of baseball is that it is played on the edge of infinity.) A ball hit on the ground past first or third base in fair territory is in play, even if it subsequently rolls foul. A fly ball, however, that passes a base in fair territory but curves into foul before hitting the ground beyond the bases is a strike. Unless, of course, the batter has two strikes on him already, in which case the

pitch is neither a ball nor a strike. It is merely a pitch. The lone exception to this rule occurs when the ball is bunted into foul territory on a third strike. That is an automatic out.

If the pitcher, on the other hand, throws four balls (pitches outside the strike zone at which the batter does not

offer) the batter goes directly to first base. Three strikes. Four balls. Now I ask you, does that sound like something that could have happened by accident? I don't think so, and I haven't even mentioned the infield fly rule. I imagine what happened was something like this. God had a meeting with his crack

Tragedy has struck at the Jenny Wiley State Park boat dock on Dewey Lake. All the ducks are dead, save one lonely drake.

The ducks came to the lake, flying north with their wild kind, one spring, several years ago. A few were captured and their wings were clipped. They were fed at the dock, a year or so passed, and the wild ones were no longer wild. Autumn and spring, their brothers flew over, stopped briefly, but the ducks at the lake, had found quiet haven, and they resisted the impulse to take again to the skyways. The flock multiplied, and the ducks

became one of the fasci-Mations of the dock area.

This spring, the usual hatch came off. and the little ones waddled

into the water and followed the mother ducks. But they survived only a few days. Dock attendants were mystified as the ducklings sied. Now, the fellows at the dock think they know what happened. Greens of the nearby golf course were sprayed to kill a troublesome pest. A variety of bugs got a dose of the poison and fell into the dock area, where the ducks gobbled them up.

So, it is believed, silent death Same to the ducks. They had been spared the lethal blast of the hunter, but death has a way of coming to all that's living, in many ways and guises.


#### LOCAL BOY MAKES **GOOD BAITS**

## Heritage and Traditions

Freshmen in Ms. Slocum's English Class recently were able to experience a unique way of integrating a writing assignment. While completing an assignment involving researching family trees, conducting an interview with a family member and writing poetry students were asked to find out about heritage and traditions from their rela tives. During an interview with my grandmother I learned more about a tradition I was already somewhat familiar with - Quilting. Ms. Slocum had asked students to invite speakers to the classroom so on September 19, 2005, Clara Ratliff (my grandmother) and Sue Reynolds (my great aunt) visited Ms. Slocum's 4th period English class to demonstrate the art of quilting by hand.

The presenters brought samples of quilting projects they had done in the past to show to the students. They also brought the items needed to show how to quilt. Mrs. Ratliff showed how to laver the material and then place it in the quilting hoop. Once this was done she began to demonstrate how to quilt using a between (quilting needle) and thimble. After a few minutes of demonstration, Mrs. Ratliff asked if anyone would like to try their hand at quilting. After an initial moment of silence, two students eagerly volunteered - Billy Adkins and Billy Akers. According to Sue Reynolds, Billy Adkins did quite well for his first try, making small, neat stitches. Billy Akers had a little trouble at first but ended up doing well with a little help and with making larger stitches.

Also trying their own hand at quilting were Casey Tackett and Lakeisha Lantz. Mrs. Ratliff passed around two quilts showing the difference in stitches, from neat and small to larger, looser stitches. Mrs. Reynolds also showed the difference between hand stitching and machine stitching on an appliqué

it prettier by doing it by hand and you can make it more detailed," Sue Reynolds said.

They also passed around a quilting book that showed different patterns ranging from complex to simple.

Everyone enjoyed themselves and seemed to learn a little from the presentation. Some of the students who didn't try the stitching, asked questions about the materials and seemed interested in trying it on their own.

### 'Bruce Lee: A Warrior's Journey'

In the summer of 1973, my friends and I came home with black eyes and a tall tale about taking out a street gang. Truth was our wounds were self-inflicted, though entirely by acci-

We had spent that summer watching "Enter the Dragon" every chance we could get and had decided to fashion a pair of "nunchucks" to use like Lee did in that film, where he and those two pieces of wood, joined by a chain, took out 50 extras in about 1.3 minutes. We decided to save up for a real pair we could share and spent the rest of the season rewatching the film, not knowing that our hero would die that same summer and would never complete his next film, "Game of Death."

Five years later, some footage would be assembled from that flick with new stuff and foisted on us like it was the real deal. In 1978, Robert Clouse ("Enter the Dragon") was handed 10 minutes of fight footage for Lee's final film and asked to build a movie around it. The result was awful, with a double used for Lee (actually Yuen Biao, who has made some good films since) and the entire story changed.

Lee was not involved in cobbling together that disaster and our dream of seeing Lee's last work, as it was meant to be shown, was abandoned -

Fans of kung-fu film legend Bruce Lee can rejoice with this documentary, which also showcases all of the footage Lee shot for "Game of Death." This film offers fans a chance to see what Lee actually shot and it adds up to three excellently choreographed fight sequences.

The plot is classic stuff, with Lee and four other fighters blackmailed by mobsters into entering a pagoda which hides a treasure. Their job is to get to the fifth floor but there is one hiccup — each floor is guarded by a fighting expert who uses a different

The film that was shot and completed follows Lee and two compatriots as they get to the third floor. The guys on the first two floors were never shot but they apparently took out two of the adventurers. Lee lets the other two guys go first in these bouts but must join in to take out each opponent in the end.

### 'I'm going to sue you!'

There is an old saying I hear say, were from Texas. quite often that goes, "Time flies

Gerald speak on several occasions and knew a little about him, the program chairman asked if I would be willing to introduce him, since he had never met him. I gladly accepted.

That evening when it came time for the featured speaker, the program chairman got up and said, "To be honest, I don't know anything about our speak-

er for our banquet, but there is a fellow out in the audience who does, and I'm going to ask him to introduce Dr. Fisher." That was neat. Never happened before or since.

That was a long time ago, but I still remember one of the stories Gerald told that evening. He said there was a family with several small children shopping in a grocery store. One of the children, a boy about 7 years of age, wandered off and was checking things out about two aisles away. About this same time an elderly gentleman was also shopping and did not see this young boy who had walked up behind him. When he turned around to move on, he accidentally knocked this lad down. Realizing what he had done, he quickly leaned down and said, "I'm so sorry." To this, the kid replied, "Sorry H\_ \_ \_, I'm going to sue you." We all laughed, but unfortunately this was the sign of the times and would become more so in the years to come.

A good and humorous example of this happened some time back out in the state of California. The staff of the Pacific Palisades High School voted unanimously to record the following message on the school's answering machine because they wanted to implement a policy requiring students and parents to be responsible for their children's absences and missing homework. This came about because the school and teachers were being sued by parents who wanted their childrens1 failing grades changed to passing grades though those children were absent 15 to 30 times during the semester and did not complete enough school work to pass their classes. Again, this is the actual answering message for the school:

If you want to reach out and touch, slap or hit someone, press 7. To request another teacher for the third time this year, press 8. To complain about bus transportation, press 9. To complain about school lunches, press 0."

And here is the way the message ends: "If you realize this is the real world and your child must be accountable and responsible for his/her own behavior, classwork, homework and that it's not the teacher's fault for your child's lack of effort, hang up and have a nice

When I read this thing, I chuckled a couple of times, but I also realize that the education of our children is serious business. In most cases, most people who will read this can see right through the motives of the par-

ents who had filed the lawsuit When we fail at something, what is the first thing we usually want to do? Transfer or fix the blame somewhere else. right? I am a parent and a grandparent and I care about the quality of education we have in our nation's schools, especially our public schools because I am helping to pay the bill. The truth is, schools and teachers need our help. We will only have better schools when parents take responsibility for their childrens1 discipline and behavior and prepare them to learn ib their formative years. It must be a team effort.

Finally they make it to the fifth floor to confront a 7-foot-5 giant, played by basketball legend Kareem Abdul Jabbar, who makes short work of Lee's companions. The fight that ensues is clearly one of Lee's best and the sight of a 5-foot, 7inch man destroying a sevenand-a-half-foot giant looks better than any CGI fight scene committed to celluloid. It's the David-and-Goliath standoff of the century, with Lee actually appearing to be in trouble until he finds his opponent's weakness. Great stuff here and a clear indication that Lee was about to reinvent the kung-fu cycle while it was still in its infancy.

What makes this film work is the 45-minute documentary that precedes it. Here you learn that Lee was as much a student of philosophy as the martial arts. Great attention is given to his style of fighting, which Lee

called "no style." His jeet kune do, or "the way of the intercepting fist," eschewed studied moves and instead focused on turning the opponent's attack against itself.

This material complements the "Game of Death" footage, which shows Lee using his opponents' moves against them, all the while stressing that flexibility gives him an advantage over studied moves and routine styles of self-

Nowhere is this more clear than when he takes on an opponent who uses wooden sticks. Lee points out that the switch he is carrying is flexible and thus a better weapon, which he promptly displays by opening a cut over the guy's forehead. The opponent doesn't like that and whips out some nunchucks, only to find that Lee has also brought a custom made set of chucks which he then employs

### Tom and Ray answer a 'flood' of questions

by TOM and RAY MAGLIOZZI

of TOM: Since the two big hurriidanes, we've had a flood (ha ha) of questions about flooded cars. So we thought we'd try to answer all of the most common questions at once:

xii Q: How do you know if a car you're buying has flood damage? borRAY: Well, there's the obvihus stuff: Fish in the back seat. A tiobster trap hanging off the headrest. A bathtub ring at the level of the inside door handles. You sit fin the driver's seat and your butt igets wet.

JETOM: Assuming none of those obvious signs is present. -you might see mineral deposits for discoloration on the seats, seat helts or door panels. There might hendroplets of moisture on the inside of the instrument cluster, warped or misshapen door panels (if they're made of fiberboard), tor an owner's manual that looks wikevit fell into a bathtub.

NA RAY: In the trunk or engine compartment, you might find mud, sticks or other debris. And inside, a heavy aroma of Hai Karate aftershave or Lysol is a telltale sign that someone's trying to cover up a festering mold or odor problem.

TOM: But most likely, if a "professional" is trying to pass off a flooded car on the used-car market, he will have cleaned up All those things, and perhaps even replaced the seats and carpet. It will be very difficult for the averdge buyer - or even the average mechanic - to be able to tell that He car was flooded.

RAY: So, our best advice is to simply avoid used cars that have "Sure," you say. "How do I do that?" Well, the current title of the car provides no guarantee that the tar is clean. Unfortunately, dooded and salvaged cars can be fe-registered in other states with clean titles, and then sold without disclosing the damage. That's called title washing.

TOM: So, your best bet is to use a service called Car Fax. We've put up a link to it on our Web site, www.cartalk.com. It's now offering a free service that will check the ZIP code in which Accar was last registered, and will let you know if it was registered mene of the flooded areas. You the Vehicle Identification umber, or VIN, to get a report. RAY: While it's not absoluteperfect (it's possible that fleone with a car registered sewhere could have driven to Orleans and been there for allood), that's about the best sauce you have to spot a potenflooded car before you buy

: Is a flooded car necessarily unk.

TOM: Pretty much, yes. There re-some obvious problems, as pte can imagine. If water gains access to one of the cylinders. of their through the air intake or the thaust system, that cylinder can H with water. Then, when the figine is started, that cylinder will hydro-lock (water can't be simplessed like air can), and everything connected to the finder will break or bend.

RAY: But even if the water is pushed out safely before the car is started, that cylinder has already had water sitting in it for a week. Those cylinder walls and rings are probably already rusting. So that engine's going to burn oil like crazy and run unevenly.

TOM: Water can get into the transmission through the transmission-fluid dipstick hole. If that happens, you'll be lubricating the transmission with one part transmission fluid and two parts water, or something like that. So kiss the transmission goodbye, too.

manufacturers now put electronic components - like computers under the seats, or under the dashboard. So even if only a modest amount of water was sloshing around the floor of the car, you might need a new computer - or several new computers, depending on your car which can cost \$1,000 each.

TOM: If the water gets a little higher up, it can wreak havoc on electronic seat controls, electric windows, ignition switches and air bags. TOM: First, you have to get the water out of it. You have to remove and either clean or replace the seats, the carpet, the interior panels and possibly even used to attempt to kill the mold cation. spores — the sooner, the better,

RAY: You have to remove all the spark plugs and then turn the engine over to purge any water that might have gotten into the cylinders. If water comes out, that cylinder is a candidate for corrosion and failure. You also have to drain the motor oil and transmission fluid, in case water has gotten in and diluted those crucial libricants.

TOM: Then you can start the car and start looking for electronic gremlins. And hope the mold and the smell don't get too bad.

RAY: So basically, if a car is flooded and it's your only transportation, you might be able to use it. But it's bound to cause you problems. Think about it. Insurance companies HATE to spend money. If they could fix a car and put it back on the road, theydo it in a New York minute. And even THEY won't bother fixing flooded cars.

TOM: So, if you absolutely have to keep a car that's been flooded, consider it a short-term solution. And if you're shopping for a car, buyer beware.

Stevens said someone may have fired into a herd of grazing livestock.

According to the Wisconsin Pork Association, professional slaughterhouses don't shoot animals, for employee safety

### KHSAA board declines to recommend separating public, private sports

LEXINGTON - A controversial measure that would separate the state's public and private high schools for postseason sports competition received a negative recommendation Friday.

The Kentucky High School Athletic Association's Board of Control voted 9-7, with one member abstaining, to from the meeting send the proposal to the state Board of Education without a positive endorse-

The state board meets again in December.

The full board's vote closely tracked a vote earlier Friday by the KHSAA's executive committee, which rejected the plan 9-8, with one member absent

KHSAA member schools voted Thursday 195-78, with two abstentions, to enact the measure, which needed a two-thirds' majority, or 184 votes, to

If the Board of Education approves the proposal, it will go to the General Assembly for consideration.

Proponents said the measure will

address competitive inequities caused by the fact that private schools can bring in students without consideration of geographic boundaries, Opponents argued that private schools are being unfairly targeted because of misinformation and unproven rumors of recruit-

If enacted, the proposal would dramatically affect high school athletics in Kentucky, particularly the Sweet 16 basketball tournaments, which would no longer be for all comers. Kentucky is one of only three states to still offer a one-class state basketball tournament. Hawaii and Delaware are the others.

Of the 31 state championships offered last season by the KHSAA, 17 were won by private schools.

### 'The human element in sport has always been a big part of the game'

The way things are going, umpires are in danger of becoming figureheads, stuck behind the plate to lend an air of authority more imagined than real, like the Queen of England at events of state, minus the tiara and jew-

Hemmed in by cameras on every side, they're being second-guessed more than ever before and losing the courage to make judgments stick without consultation or further review. Once a novelty, instant replay in sports is an increasingly annoying fact of life, like automated phone systems and car alarms, and after a rough week of playoffs and a World Series still to come, holding the line in baseball is going to be tougher than

Tennis became the latest game to knuckle under, with officials from several tours announcing this week that an electronic line-calling system dubbed Hawk-Eye Officiating could be in place for a number of tournaments next year.

Every major sport except baseball and soccer now employs some form of replay. College football, in the second year of a so-called "experiment," has convinced nine of 11 conferences to go along. In reality, the only thing experimental is which machines and how many will be used, not whether replay will become a fixture.

Mike Pereira, director of officiating for the NFL and a former supervisor of college refs who consulted on the program said, "The best measure of its success is the amount of time it takes to confirm a correct call or overturn a wrong one and right now, they're averaging close to where we're at, about

"That's pretty good," he added, "when you balance that between the White Sox and

against the five days of criticism Angels, and a handful of less that follow a blown call in any big game."

It's easy to say that from where Pereira sits. The latest version of replay in his league is in its seventh season, and after considerable time, expense and aggravation, many of the bugs have been ironed out. Effectively, though, with humans still making the final decision, all replay in the NFL has done is extend the controversy from the official on the field to the one in the replay booth. Through 74 games in the first five weeks, play was interrupted 86 times to review calls and 28 of those were overturned - roughly one in every three.

"There's no going back, at least not in our game, so technology is something officials can't be scared of," Pereira said. "It's up to them to train and work harder to meet that challenge. In that sense, I believe it's a positive and not a negative."

Baseball came to the opposite conclusion after a tough week. Maybe commissioner Bud Selig decided that an offseason of eye exercises wasn't going to make umpires as unblinking as the cameras that show the replays on the JumboTrons in the stadiums or TV sets across the country.

"I don't know how we could use it to improve the job that umpires do," Selig said. "The human element in sport has always been a big part of the game. I'm a football fan, too, and I hate instant replay in the NFL. Football games are taking four hours."

Playoff baseball games are already pushing the same envelope, but that's not the only reason Selig is insisting that judgments made by the officials on the field stand. That took some guts after the call by plate umpire Doug Eddings on a third strike in Game 2 of the ALCS

egregious misses by the crew working the NLCS between St. Louis and Houston.

Then again, the commissioner also knows that replay has come up for discussion several times during the general managers' meetings and was overwhelmingly rejected. People in his inner circle trot out the line about it "never being good news when umpires are the focus of the attention," but they know

Arguing about blown calls, like bonehead plays by hitters or fielders, is what makes the games interesting long after they're over.

Jeffery Maier leaning over the wall in Yankee Stadium is as much as part of baseball lore as the grounder that skittered between Bill Buckner's legs, no matter how much cleaner the outcomes would have been if both were granted a do-over. Troublesome as Eddings' mistake seems, plenty of the blame should be shared by Angels catcher Josh Paul for failing to tag Chicago's A.J. Pierzynski at home plate, something most kids learn in Little League.

Maybe that explains why there's still very little sentiment inside the game for instant replay even now, despite a growing drumbeat from fans and the media. Even St. Louis manager Tony La Russa, already tossed from one game in the NLCS for protesting too loudly, doesn't want to see the umpires lose any more of their

"A lot of the emotion they fire back at players is because of the scrutiny they get, and they're just human, too," he said. "There's replays all over the place. But they are held accountable for everything."

Diana Williams, Mr. Williams' wife of 26 years, will be in attendance at U.S. Cellular Field for Game 1 of the World Series as a special guest of Major League Baseball.

### No. 3 Virginia Tech 28, Maryland 9

COLLEGE PARK, Md. -He's got the quickness of a wide receiver, the moves of a running back and an arm that can fling the ball with pinpoint accuracy.

Marcus Vick put all those attributes to good use Thursday night in helping third-ranked Virginia Tech to a 28-9 victory over Maryland.

Vick accounted for 344 yards in offense, including a career-high 133 rushing, and the unbeaten Hokies pulled away in the second half to a 28-9 victory Thursday night.

Virginia Tech's unyielding defense was a factor, but Vick was the main reason the Hokies were able to repel an upsetminded Maryland team that trailed by only four at halftime.

"He certainly made a difference. There's no doubt about that," Tech coach Frank Beamer said.

The Hokies (7-0, 4-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) committed four turnovers, but scored 21 straight points after halftime to keep alive their hope of playing for the national championship in January.

"They have speed, and when they put the ball in Vick's hands, he can run," Maryland coach Ralph Friedgen said. "I thought the major difference in the two teams was they had a lot more speed. Vick has great acceleration, and does not need a lot of room to run."

The Terrapins (4-3, 2-2) came in with a three-game winning streak and designs on avenging a 55-6 defeat to the Hokies last November. It seemed possible until Maryland finally got tired of chasing the elusive Vick.

"Our defense was on the field too long, and they began to wear down as the game went on," Friedgen said.

Although Vick threw a career-high three interceptions - all in the third quarter - the little brother of Atlanta Falcons star Michael Vick averaged 8.3 yards per carry and completed 14 of 23 passes for 211 yards.

"I think what you have is a dynamic quarterback that has the ability to beat you running or beat you throwing," Beamer said. "Pretty good guy, Pretty good quarterback."

After Vick's third interception, Beamer didn't scold him. Instead, he said, "You're going to win this for us."

Vick followed the pickoffs by directing drives of 99 and 37 yards, giving the Hokies an insurmountable 28-3 lead.

That was more than enough support for a defense that forced two turnovers and kept the Terrapins out of the end zone until Sam Hollenbach threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Derrick Fenner with 2:16 to go. Hollenbach was 14-of-30 for

158 yards and two interceptions, and Lance Ball had 75 yards rushing on 15 attempts.

The Terrapins wore their alternate black jerseys for the second time this season, hoping for the same result as the last time: a 45-33 victory over Virginia on Oct. 1.

The ploy didn't work, yet Maryland could take solace in putting forth a decent performance in front of a national television audience and a crowd of 54,838, the second-largest in school history.

"I think we played hard and had the opportunities, but we didn't take advantage of them," Friedgen said.

The Hokies scored on their first possession of the third quarter to take a 14-3 lead. A 38-yard run by Vick got Tech to the Maryland 31, and five plays later Mike Imoh scored from

"I was really big. It set the tempo for the second half," Vick said. "It quieted the crowd down and just got our guys going."

After the Terrapins failed to capitalize on Vick's third interception, a punt left Virginia Tech on its own 1. Ten plays later, Imoh ran in from the 10 to make it 21-3 with 10:45 left.

Branden Ore added a 4-yard TD run with 6:47 to go.

The Terrapins trailed 7-3 at halftime, but charged off the field with their helmets held high, an emotional charge off the field probably had a lot to do with the fact they were down 41-3 at intermission in last year's game.

In the second half, however, the Hokies outgained Maryland

### GAME OF THE WEEK: Lewis using blueprint against Steelers

CINCINNATI - Marvin Lewis can put the final touch on his grand rebuilding by beating the team that gave him the blue-

For the first time in 15 years. the Cincinnati Bengals have a chance to take control of their division and join the ranks of NFL teams with legitimate playoff aspirations. And they know it.

Their game Sunday against the defending AFC North champion Pittsburgh Steelers represents their grandest moment in perhaps the last 15 years - certainly the biggest during Lewis' three seasons of resurrecting the Bengals.

like man, it's "Oh, Hollywood out here," said receiver Chad Johnson, who promises a Pittsburgh-flavored touchdown celebration. "We have to keep it going. The buzz and the electricity around here is crazy. It's been a long time since people have felt this way about

Fifteen years, to be precise. The Bengals (5-1) haven't had a winning record or made the playoffs since 1990, one of the longest streaks of futility in NFL history.

Lewis, who got more clout than his predecessors, has the Bengals contending in his third season. He's done it by modeling them after Pittsburgh and Baltimore, where he coached defense

"Everything we've done has been put together that way," Lewis said. "The way we practice physically, and the tempo, the spirit. It's that way because that's how you have to play the game. You can't go out and pittypat and play the game on Sunday. You've got to hit people.

"And that's what it's all about. That's been our mind-set all the way through, to bring players here who can handle that challenge and are up to that challenge.

Few teams are better at meeting such challenges than the Steelers (3-2), who have built their reputation on winning tough games in tough places. They've won their last nine road games since a 30-13 loss in Baltimore on Sept. 19 last season, the game in which thenrookie Ben Roethlisberger took over at quarterback after Tommy Maddox got hurt.

Roethlisberger sat out a 23-17 overtime loss to Jacksonville last Sunday because of an injured left knee, but is expected play in Cincinnati. Roethlisberger has won all of

his eight starts on the road.

"It's a must-win game for us," said Roethlisberger, who won both of his games against the Bengals last season. "It's our biggest game of the year, and we have to go out and play like it is,"

The Bengals hope to make it one of those changing-of-theguard moments. A victory would give them a 2 1/2-game lead over the Steelers, who don't want to fall so far behind so deep into the season.

The Steelers haven't lost consecutive games since the middle of the 2003 season. They can't afford to do it now.

'We're definitely going to see where we're at right now," Steelers linebacker James Farrior said. "They're the division leaders, so we've got to come in and be prepared to play a hard, tough game.

They'll have to do it without their customary home-awayfrom-home advantage in Cincinnati. During the Bengals' many lean years, tens of thousands of Steelers fans would make the five-hour drive, wave their yellow Terrible Towels and turn Cinergy Field and Paul Brown Stadium into close approximations of Three Rivers Stadium and Heinz Field.

The Bengals had to practice a silent snap count during the week leading up to the game because they knew the Pittsburgh fans would be so loud in their stadium - the ultimate indignity.

This time, it will be different. Back-on-the-bandwagon Bengals fans bought most of the tickets for this game, giving them a rare majority over the black-and-yellow.

"It's going to be a lot of fun to have them in our place," quarterback Carson Palmer said.

Which side does more cheering will likely come down to whether the Bengals can stop Pittsburgh's famed running attack - Cincinnati gives up 4.9 vards per rush - and which of the two young quarterbacks has the better day.

For the last four weeks, Roethlisberger and Palmer have been Nos. 1 and 2 atop the NFL passer ratings. It'll be only the second time since 1990 that two quarterbacks had 100-plus passer ratings in a game so late in the season.

Palmer has tied Peyton Manning's NFL record of nine consecutive games with a rating of 100 or more. The Steelers were the last team to hold him under triple digits, making him look average in their 19-14 win at Paul Brown Stadium last Nov. 21.

"I have a lot more experience, so I feel like I'm a different quarterback since that game," Palmer said.

So are the Bengals, who went to two Super Bowls in the 1980s, then went down in the dumps. A win would prove they're back.

'They're not the Cincinnati Bengals of old," Steelers guard Alan Faneca said.

#### County to allow security pat-downs at Bengals stadium

CINCINNATI - Hamilton County officials and the Cincinnati Bengals have reached an agreement allowing the team to pat down fans entering Paul Brown Stadium on Sunday.

Earlier this month, county commissioners objected when the Bengals announced a plan to hire a private security firm to conduct the upper-body pat downs and bill the county \$60,000 for the cost.

County Prosecutor Joe Deters has said using taxpayer money to finance the pat-downs presents questions about their legality. The Bengals lease the stadium from the county.

But on Tuesday, Hamilton County Common Pleas Court Judge Beth Myers approved a joint agreement between the county and the team that allows the security measure to proceed.

However, the deal leaves open the possibility that the Bengals may seek taxpayer reimbursement. The team agreed to pay for Sunday's added security pending further rulings by the court.

Pat-down stations at the perimeter of the stadium are expected to open at 9 a.m., with the gates opening at 11 a.m., earlier than normal because of potentially longer lines. The Bengals host the Pittsburgh

The NFL began requiring its teams to conduct the pat-downs earlier this month, not because of a specific threat but to provide extra security.

Thirty of the league's 32 teams conduct such searches, according to Hamilton County Chief Assistant Prosecutor Jim Harper. Public officials in Tampa, Fla., have raised objections similar to those in Cincinnati.

But the Bengals said among the other 31 NFL teams, only Chicago does not have pat-





## Smith: Morris to be back 'at some point' for Kentucky

LEXINGTON - The question has hung over Kentucky basketball since Randolph Morris decided to return to the Wildcats after an ill-fated attempt at entering the NBA draft: Will the erstwhile sophomore center be eligible, and if so, when?

During media day Thursday, Kentucky coach Tubby Smith who has remained mostly mum about Morris' situation while the NCAA considers his eligibility status - said he expected the 6-foot-10 Morris will play for the Wildcats during the upcoming season.

"We fully expect him to be back at some point when the NCAA finishes their job," Smith said. "Everything has been documented and processed on our side, and we'll wait for the NCAA to finalize their decision.

Morris did not attend media Athletics Department Morris would answer questions about his situation after the NCAA announces its decision about his eligibility

Morris started 33 of 34 games last season, averaging 8.8 points and 4.2 rebounds per game but also leading the team in fouls. Kentucky finished 28-6, and Morris played his two best games of the season in the NCAA tournament, in a win over Cincinnati and a doubleovertime loss to Michigan State in a regional final

Afterward, Morris returned to his hometown of Atlanta and from there informed Smith via fax that he planned to enter his name in the NBA draft. When the June 21 deadline for Morris to withdraw from the draft passed, it was assumed Morris had played his final game for the Wildcats.

Morris, however, was not one of the 60 players taken in the June 28 draft. A little-used NCAA rule would allow Morris to return to Kentucky, if he reimbursed all the expenses of any NBA workouts in which he participated, he asked Kentucky Athletics Director Mitch Barnhart for reinstatement within 30 days of the draft and Barnhart agreed to take him back.

But that rule wouldn't apply if Morris had an agreement with

spokesman Scott Stricklin said an agent. Sports agency SFX Morris can't play. Smith praised issued a statement from Morris on June 21. but Morris' father, Ralph, has said his son had not hired an agent.

The NCAA has granted Kentucky a waiver allowing Morris to practice with the team, but as of now, he won't be able to play when the Wildcats open their season Nov. 13 at home against South Dakota State in the Guardians Classic.

If Morris is ruled ineligible or if he has to serve a suspension of undetermined length then one of two juniors, 7-3 Shagari Alleyne or 7-0 Lukasz Obrzut, probably would start at center for the Wildcats.

Both Obrzut and Alleyne said they'd be up to the challenge - "We can handle the pressure," Obrzut said - but added they hope Morris is able to play for the Wildcats soon.

When Randolph comes back, we're going to be a better team with him," Alleyne said. "When he's not here, we'll just hold up the slack until he comes The future of 7-2 freshman

center Jared Carter also depends on Morris' situation, Smith said. If Morris can play, Kentucky likely would redshirt Carter, a Scott County High School product. But the Wildcats would need the depth Carter could provide if Carter on Thursday, saying "it's going to be hard to sit him.

Morris' teammates said they welcomed him back, taking the same attitude they did last season when then-freshman guard Joe Crawford temporarily left the team, then returned, after a dispute with Smith about playing time.

"We didn't all agree on how he did it," Crawford said of Morris. "But he's young. Even though he's almost 7 feet tall, he's a young person. He made mistakes. We all make mistakes."

Added Alleyne: "When he came back, it was like he never left."

Smith praised Morris' attitude and demeanor since his return to Kentucky and acknowledged Morris' importance as the Wildcats attempt to reach the Final Four for the first time since 1998, when they won the last of their seven NCAA titles. But he also said Morris wasn't indispensable.

"We never depend on one guy, but Randolph is a very important part of reaching our goals of an SEC championship and a national championship,' Smith said. "We've found ways to play without him, and we'll do it again. It is really a great opportunity for a lot of other guys to flourish and grow."

## Cardinals hope potential pays off

LOUISVILLE - Almost a week after Louisville's first practice, coach Rick Pitino had one word he kept repeating at media day Thursday.

"It's a little better in some areas than expected," he said. "In other areas, it's not quite as good, but this team definitely has potential to be a good basketball team."

He talked about 7-foot freshman center Jonathan Huffman.

"Jonathan Huffman is probably the slowest in development of his body of all the freshman, but he probably has the most potential," Pitino said. There it was again.

The Cardinals lost four players to the professional ranks from last year's Final Four team. Senior guard Taquan Dean, who averaged 14 points per game last season, is the only returning player whose starts numbered in double digits last season. Center David Padgett and forward Juan Palacios, both expected to contribute this season, are nursing injuries. Including Padgett, a transfer from Kansas, the Cardinals have seven new players. And this season will be Louisville's first in the Big East, maybe the toughest basketball conference in the country.

"Who's better?" Pitino asked. "Louisville or Notre Dame? Louisville, West Virginia? Villanova or Syracuse? Providence or Marquette? No one knows."

Pitino also has two assistant coaches in their first year under

"The staff has great potential as well as the young players," he said.

Though he's surrounded by inexperience, Pitino loves his team's talent. He called this freshman class his second-hest behind his 1991 Kentucky class that included Rodrick Rhodes, Jared Prickett, Tony Delk and Walter McCarty.

Freshman point guard Andre McGee is the farthest along of the freshman and would start if the season began today, Pitino said.

McGee and the other new players are getting an accelerated education in Cardinal basketball because of the players who are injured.

"I pretty much look at those guys being hurt as a blessing," Dean said. "We get the young guys some repetitions and con-

### Pitino not sure he will get to see a new Louisville arena

LOUISVILLE - Louisville basketball coach Rick Pitino criticized the Kentucky legislature Thursday when he was asked about a new proposed arena, a project that has not

drawn overwhelming approval. "I'm hoping to live a long time, but I don't think it will be during my tenure," Pitino said. 'I'm not dying, not going anywhere, but I just know how this state works. I know the way the legislature works, and I think they haggle too much, they're not visionary, they don't understand the fruits of what it can do for a city and a state."

The cost of a new arena is estimated at \$299 million. Business donations are at \$44 million, officials said, Louisville government leaders have pledged one-third of the arena costs. Gov. Ernie Fletcher wants to commit \$75 million in state support that would come from bonds.

Some legislators have not expressed support for the project because they don't believe their home regions would see any economic benefit from a downtown Louisville arena. Some say there are more pressing needs, like education, health care, Medicaid and highways.

Pitino thinks Kentucky legislators could take a lesson from neighboring states.

"Unfortunately, sometimes we're a little parochial in our thinking, and we don't understand how much Nashville does for the state of Tennessee and how much Indianapolis does for the state of Indiana," he said at the Cardinals' media day I musday "We don't think along those lines. We think more along the lines of blue and red, so we're limited in our scope." at the
