Judge denies ower bond

PRESTONSBURG - A Martin man who allegedly attempted to skirt a traffic check near Jenny Wiley State Park last week was denied a lower bond Friday.

The attorney for Robert Gregory argued that her client had no serious crimes on his record and could not afford the \$10,000 cash bond that was issued, but could come up with 10 percent of that amount.

County Attorney Keith Bartley opposed the motion, saying, "This man ran from police and when they caught up with him, he struggled with them.'

Bartley went on to note that Gregory had wrecked his vehicle in a ditch and tried to escape on foot. He also pointed out that Gregory left two minors in the car and was driving under the influence.

Gregory is also facing additional charges of promoting contraband that were brought against him after incarceration, when officers found that he allegedly had several Lorcet tablets in his possession which were not surrendered to authorities before his arrest.

Gregory's girlfriend attended the hearing and later complained that the drugs were not hidden in his underwear, as previously reported. She insisted that the contraband was merely stuffed in his side

Second arrest made in eBay thefts

PRESONSBURG — The Prestonsburg Police Department arrested a second suspect Thursday in a rash of thefts that plagued Abbott Creek residents.

Deborah Wallen, 36, of Bull Creek, surrendered herself to authorities on Thursday and came in with her attorney, Jerry Patton. She is charged with five counts of receiving stolen property.

Wallen was arraigned in district court Friday morning and charged with receiving stolen property in five cases. She was issued a \$50,000 cash bond for each case, which brought her bond total to \$250,000. She faces one felony count of reciving stolen property in each case and an additional count of receiving stolen firearms in one of the

Patton asked for a bond reduction at the arraignment and was overruled by Judge James Allen, who granted Wallen a preliminary hearing on June 7.



Beaver man pleads guilty to trafficking

PRESTONSBURG -A Beaver man pleaded guilty to three counts of trafficking in marijuana Friday upon a 10-year sentencing recommendation from the commonwealth attorney's office.

"Dougie" Wendell Vance, 34, entered the plea alongside his attorney, Tim Parker, and admitted that he had sold marijuana on three occasions in 2004.

Vance was expected to enter the plea months ago, but suffered a setback when he appeared in court under the influence of

drugs last February. Judge Danny P. Caudill had Vance and three codefendants screened for drugs when their condition was reported to him and Wendell and two others tested positive

methadone. Vance was offered a chance to explain his condition on that occasion at a hearing two weeks later. He did not fare well at the hearing and he could not explain how he got a prescription for methadone.

Fletcher spokesman says ...

Republican chairman 'wants the governor out'

LOUISVILLE — In the latest twist of political intrigue within Republican ranks, Gov. Ernie Fletcher's top spokesman claimed Friday that the Kentucky GOP chairman is part of a faction that "wants the governor out."

Fletcher spokesman Brett Hall said the group includes some Republican Party officials, and

despite overtures from the governor's office "the signals ... we get from them are that basically we're on our own and they're not there for us."

"There is a faction — and Darrell Brock seems to be in the middle of it - that wants the governor out and has been working on this for some time," Hall said in a phone interview.

Filching of Medicare applications raises specter of ID theft

BISMARCK, N.D. — A batch of Medicare prescription drug benefit applications was stolen in a car burglary, rich with information that can be used to defraud the people who filled them out, Insurance Commissioner Jim Poolman

Dick Brown, a spokesman for the Humana health insurance company, said 268 Humana Medicare benefit applications were in a computer case that was filched from an insurance agent's vehicle in Brooklyn Park, Minn., last month.

James Theiss, Humana's chief privacy official, said in a letter to affected customers that the forms included applicants' names, addresses, Social Security numbers and bank routing information.

Brown said 44 of the applications were filled out by North Dakotans, Almost all of the rest were Minnesota customers, he said Thursday.

Brown declined to identify the agent, or the agency he or she works for. He said the burglary was reported May 5. Brooklyn Park police could not immediately locate the theft report Thursday.

Poolman said the applications would be valuable for a thief who wanted to assume someone else's identity to obtain credit cards and loans. He said Humana has not treated the theft with the seriousness it deserved.

"They need to display ... concern for the consumers, because identity theft is incredibly dangerous for people," he said. "In my opinion, they've shown a complete disregard for the consumers that they're supposed to be serv-

Brown called the theft "an unfortunate incident for which we have apologized to the members who were affected." based Humana,

he did not believe the company was being forthcoming about the extent of the data loss. He suspects customer information was also stored on a stolen computer inside the case, Poolman said. Humana did not notify

insurance regulators about the incident, and dawdled for two weeks before telling its customers, Poolman said. He learned of it when customers, curious about the significance of Humana's letter, called his "We don't know if this

affects 40 North Dakotans or 4,000 North Dakotans," he said. "If they're not being up front with us as regulators ... about what information was stolen, and what wasn't, it makes me think there is something else there."

He has sent a letter to Humana's president, Michael McCallister, demanding information. Poolman said he will consider barring Humana from doing business in North Dakota if he is not satisfied with the company's response.

MSHA starts interviews with mine employees as state wraps up

HARLAN — The sole survivor of a mine explosion in southeastern Kentucky that left five men dead said Friday that he doesn't know how long his air pack lasted after the blast.

Paul Ledford said at first he thought his air pack malfunctioned after he started to escape with fellow miners Roy Middleton, Paris Thomas Jr. and Bill Petra.

"I thought it lasted about 10 minutes," he told The Associated Press in an interview outside a federal mine safety office in Harlan where federal investigators were holding closeddoor interviews with mine employees

about the blast.

In the smoke and confusion, Ledford said he lost track of his fellow miners and passed out for nearly two hours. Middleton, Thomas and Petra died of carbon monoxide poi-

Ledford said that investigators have told him his air pack worked properly while he was unconscious and up until he was rescued.

He said when he regained consciousness, he saw rescuers approaching and that he flashed the light on his hard hat to get their atten-

Two others miners, Amon "Cotton" Brock and Jimmy Lee, were killed in the May 20 explosion at Kentucky Darby Mine No. 1.

Ledford said he went to the proceedings in Harlan to show his support for more than a dozen family members of the killed miners who were protesting the closed-door inter-

Ledford said he was not subpoenaed to talk to investigators from the U.S. Mine Safety and Health Administration Friday and that he had given testimony already to state and federal investigators last week.

Ledford said he believed the victims' families should be allowed to observe the interviews of coal company employees.

"They need to know what's going

on," he said.

Earlier in the day state and federal investigators privately questioned one of the owners of the mine, but the coal boss wouldn't speak publicly about the blast.

"He's fairly devastated," said Kent Hendrickson, a Harlan attorney representing Ralph Napier, a co-owner of the mine. He declined to elaborate on what his client was asked.

Napier and John North, the other owner, haven't spoken publicly since the explosion.

The investigators from the state Office of Mine Safety and Licensing and the U.S. Mine Safety and Health Administration have declined to comment on the interviews. It's unclear whether North, who was not interviewed Friday, has already given testimony in the investigation.

Napier was the last witness to be questioned in the state's preliminary interviews which began Wednesday and wrapped up Friday. Miners said questions from state investigators focused on protective seals designed to contain combustible and poisonous gases underground.

The miners interviewed by The Associated Press have defended Napier, saying their boss was a stick-

"He's a good man," said Stacy "Scooter" Huff, an 18-year veteran of coal mines who was interviewed Friday. "Ralph had the best mine I ever worked for."

Governor

Hall's comments came on the eve of a Republican state central committee meeting that will cap a turbulent week in which Lt. Gov. Steve Pence announced he wouldn't seek a second term, declined to endorse Fletcher and dug in his heels when the embattled governor demanded his resignation from office.

Pence's announcement came a few weeks after Fletcher, Kentucky's first Republican governor since 1971, was indicted on misdemeanor charges alleging he broke state law by rewarding political supporters with state jobs after he took office in 2003. Last summer, he issued a blanket pardon for anyone in his administration who might face charges in the probe except himself.

Since a Franklin County special grand jury began its work last June, it has returned 29 indictments in the case -14 of which remain sealed.

Brock, who himself defied Fletcher's demands last year that he resign as party chairman, responded that Hall "hasn't bothered with the facts" and chalked up the remarks to a "vivid imagination or politi-

cal paranoia." Last month, Hall said he agreed with Fletcher Chief of Staff Stan Cave who claimed that Democratic U.S. Rep. Ben Chandler was behind the crippling investigation into the Fletcher administration's hiring practices.

Fletcher defeated Chandler in the 2003 governor's race.

Chandler dismissed the claims as "bizarre" and a sign of desperation.

"I can only hope that once again Brett Hall is speaking for himself and not Governor Fletcher," Brock said.

Hall said Fletcher still has broad support among many rank-and-file Kentucky Republicans, creating a "disconnect" with some Republican officials.

"You have certain higherlevel officials in the party who are at odds with the grassroots and their support of the governor," he said.

He said the governor's office has heard from some local Republican officials con-

cerned about the rift. The GOP central committee meeting comes amid heightened speculation about whether Fletcher, who has announced he'll seek a second term, will face Republican opposition in 2007. Fletcher has been on vacation in Florida amid the fallout from Pence's decision against running as Fletcher's sidekick next year. Pence did not rule out a future run for political

State Rep. Lonnie Napier, R-Lancaster, said Friday he thought Fletcher would likely face opposition in a primary but didn't know who the challenger might be.

"We all know right now that the governor's popularity is very low," Napier said. "But politics are funny in Kentucky you never can predict

Napier was critical of Pence, saying "I would hate to have sent him to fight a battle for me because he quit in the

heat of a battle." State Rep. Stan Lee, R-Lexington, said Pence would have been an asset on the ticket, and said he didn't know whom to blame for the Fletcher-Pence rift. Lee said "you don't have to be a rocket scientist to realize that Ernie has a tough road to hoe with re-election," but said Fletcher shouldn't be written off.

"The question that a lot of people are asking is Ernie over and done with," he said. "At this point I don't think so. There is a lot of time left and a

FRANKFORT — Former state highway engineer Sam Beverage, indicted last month on a perjury charge related to the state hiring investigation, pleaded not guilty Friday in Franklin County Circuit Court.

Beverage was indicted by a special grand jury that has been investigating whether Gov. Ernie Fletcher's administration broke state law by basing personnel decisions on political considerations.

Fletcher also was indicted on misdemeanor charges that he illegally rewarded political supporters with state jobs. Indictments have been returned against 13 other current and former administration officials and associates. All were misde-

meanor counts. In addition, the other than himself — for any grand jury has issued 14 indictments under seal.

Fletcher announced in August that he had pardoned his entire administration -

charges that could result from the hiring probe. In his pardon, Fletcher named nine people specifically and offered blanket amnesty to everyone else.

A public hearing on the content of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) will be held at Prestonsburg High School, 825 Blackcat Boulevard, Prestonsburg, KY 41649, on Thursday, June 29, 2006, starting at 6:00 p.m. The public hearing will give the public an additional opportunity to provide comment on the content of the DEIS.

BACKGROUND: In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Huntington District has prepared a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) which documents planning analyses undertaken for a proposed flood damage reduction project in the Levisa Fork basin in Floyd County, Kentucky. The study area includes the incorporated areas of Prestonsburg and unincorporated areas in Floyd County which are subject to flood damage from the potential of a reoccurrence of the April 1977 flood. The study area does not include the City of Martin, Kentucky where a separate flood damage reduction project is underway. The DEIS documents agency evaluation of four alternatives, two of which include floodwall/levee alignments intended to protect Prestonsburg and non-structural flood-proofing measures, a total non-structural alternative, and the No Federal Action alternative.



Err on side of caution

It shouldn't take a tragedy, such as the explosion that claimed the lives of five coal miners in Harlan County, to force government to make coal mining safer. Unfortunately, though, it seems that nothing captures legislators' attention like death, and a string of mining accidents this year has pushed Congress into action.

The Senate passed a bill recently designed to improve mine safety. The House version stalled, however, because California Rep. George Miller wants the bill to require no less than a two-day supply of oxygen for underground miners, instead of the two hours in the Senate bill.

Miller also wants to put communication and tracking devices in mines within 15 months, instead of no later than three years as the Senate version states. And he wants to direct MSHA to regularly inspect breathing devices.

While it appears Miller has the safety of miners in mind with his proposed changes, time is critical to prevent more disasters.

It was only a few months ago that members of the current administration in Washington, D.C., were trumpeting their safety record in the mining industry when only 22 people were killed in the coal mines during 2005 - down from 47 in 1995.

An administration that liked to promote itself as industry friendly before the disasters now appears to have been just lucky then and reckless now, according to a report in the Philadelphia Inquirer:

- The number of major fines over \$10,000 has dropped by nearly 10 percent since 2001. The dollar amount of those penalties, when adjusted for inflation, has plummeted 43 percent to a median of \$27,584.
- Fewer than half of the fines levied between 2001 and 2003 — about \$3 million — have been paid.
- The budget and staff for the enforcement office also have declined, forcing the agency to make do with about 100 fewer coal-mine-enforcement personnel, a cut of about 9 percent.

The Louisville Courier-Journal reported that 10 citations issued against the Kentucky Darby Mine No. 1 in Holmes Mill in the days before the fatal accident May 20 included one for a malfunctioning sprinkler over a conveyor belt and one for accumulation of combustible materials on a roof-bolting

Tony Oppegard, former general counsel to Kentucky's mine safety agency, said of the citations: "There's nothing that jumps out at you that might be connected to a methane explosion," according to The Courier-Journal.

But he said the "significant and substantial" violation for accumulation of combustible materials "just shows an inattention to safety when they don't take time to clean up on the section."

Cracking down on violators is crucial for the safety of miners. Coal operators who don't pay fines or address their vio-

lations should not be able to stay open. It's time to start erring on the side of caution if there are questions about safety, and that starts at the top with enforcement of current and future regulations. The mine-safety bill being debated by the House could be an important step in placing the lives of miners ahead of production and profits.



The Democrats' abortion problem

with a painful truth, one that will hurt even more as its full weight becomes evident to them: The absolutist prochoice position on abortion is a political loser. In his brilliant and incisive new book, "The Party of Death," my National Review colleague Ramesh Ponnuru demonstrates why.

In the early 1990s, it seemed that all pro-lifers were headed to oblivion, bulldozed under by the Soccer Mom ascendancy and the public's reaction to the (supposedly) noisome social conservatism of the failed 1992 Republican Convention. But a funny

thing happened on the way to the rout of pro-lifers - the rout began to happen the other way.

Ultrasound images worked to undermine pro-choice premises. What was called a "blob of tissue" that was easily disposed of, looked instead on the scans like a little baby. Asked to believe the pro-choice rhetoric or their own eyes, most peo-

preferred the evidence of their eyes.

Then, the pro-life side began to exploit its openings with incrementalism.

Democrats are beginning to grapple the calls for a constitutional amendment to ban abortion, replaced instead by a push to ban a particularly gruesome form of the procedure, partial-birth abortion. Now it was pro-choicers opposing this targeted ban who seemed like extremists.

> By 2004, Democrats knew they had to adjust. John Kerry said he believed life begins at conception not that he would actually do anything about it. Suddenly, the uninviting was aimed in the opposite direction than it had been in 1992 - former NARAL Pro-Choice America head Kate Michelman was uninvited

to a Kerry rally.

Still, Democrats lost the Catholic vote for the first time since 1988. Democratic strategist Donna Brazile said, "Even I have trouble explaining to my family that we are not about killing babies." So the Democrats are trying even harder. Democratic chairman Howard Dean has refused to call the party "pro-choice." Hillary Clinton has called abortion "a sad, tragic choice," and said the number of abortions should be reduced.

But these rhetorical feints can't gain Democrats much, especially when they're at odds with their opposition to any restrictions on abortion. "What's so tragic about abortion anyway?" Ponnuru asks. "Abortion is regrettable and needs to be minimized, for the same reason that abortion is wrong and unjust: because it kills an innocent human being. That is also the reason it should be prohib-

Democrats, of course, will resist that logic strenuously. They might stomach Bob Casey Jr., but only because he is running against pro-life leader Sen. Rick Santorum, and a Casey victory could help deliver the Senate to pro-choice Democrats. This Casey is welcome, but only so long as he is useful to the uncompromising and ultimately untenable cause of abortion on demand.

Odds & Ends

■ EASTON, Pa. — A woman asked a judge to toss her \$173.50 fine for throwing lettuce out of her car, but he ordered her to fork over the green.

Dawn Higgins, who was cited Oct. 18 while parked outside a Wal-Mart near Easton, appeared in Northampton County Common Pleas Court on Thursday.

Higgins has said she took her daughters and a friend to the store, and they stopped at a McDonald's along the way. She said she pulled into a parking space to finish her meal but decided not to eat the half-dozen or so leaves atop her salad.

After failing to appear before a district judge on Dec. 22, Higgins discovered that she had been convicted in absentia and owed the state \$173.50. She appealed, arguing that lettuce is biodegradable.

President Judge Robert A. Freedberg on Thursday found Higgins guilty after listening to her attorney pepper a police officer with questions about lettuce.

Higgins is mulling an appeal to state Superior Court "as a matter of principle," said her lawyer, Timothy Prendergast.

"Probably the most expensive McDonald's salad ever sold," he said.

■ VIENNA, Austria — This was definitely not your typical toilet paper.

A tax collector in the southern Austrian city of Graz accidentially left \$28,000 in cash in a black attache case he placed on top of a toilet in the men's room of a restaurant Thursday, police said.

By the time he realized it was missing and went back, the cash was gone, authorities said.

As of Friday, no one had turned up with the money, prompting police in the city 120 miles south of Vienna to issue an appeal for its return.

■ DOYLESTOWN, Pa. — A Memorial Day special? A time warp? Whatever they thought, motorists lined up for a brief fueling frenzy at a pump selling premium gasoline for 32.9 cents a gallon.

As drivers called friends and relatives, up to a dozen cars lined up for a turn at a Lukoil pump vending premium at that price instead of the \$3.29 at which it should have been set.

The rush Monday was Doylestown short-lived. Township Police Chief Stephen White said a woman called 911 saying she had noticed the error when she used the pump, though she herself pumped "plus" grade correctly priced at \$3.19 a gallon. White said the woman said she was "incensed" at the behavior of other customers scrambling for the penniesper-gallon premium, considered the opportunism theft and felt bad for the station owner.

Once the mistake was discovered, a Lukoil employee put up signs temporarily halting sales of the premium until the price was adjusted. The Intelligencer of Doylestown said the station owner did not respond to an interview request.

■ BALTIMORE — A man pretended to be a station attendant and "sold" gasoline to drivers for \$10 a tank, then pocketed the purchase money, police said.

Joseph K. Boulware, 41, was arrested May 19 at a gas station in West Baltimore where, police said, he dispensed 450 gallons of gas worth about \$1,300.

Authorities said Boulware used a magnetic key and a code that effectively places a pump on standby mode, allowing him to dispense gasoline unnoticed.

Boulware had worked for gas testing companies, which is how police believe he obtained the key and code.

"He asks you, 'You want

gas? I will fill you up for \$10," said Mohammad Mehtabdin, manager of the Citgo station where Boulware was arrested. "Nobody will complain about that."

About 5:30 p.m. on May 19, a \$71 charge for pump No. 8 showed up on the register inside the Citgo, catching sales associate Francis Okondu by surprise.

Okondu, Mehtabdin and three other employees confronted the man.

"I was working that night," said Mehtabdin. "He was going pump to pump. He was selling gas to the people. So our employees noticed. We asked him, 'What are you doing here?' He said, 'Nothing, nothing."

Boulware was charged with theft, assault and possession of crack cocaine. His bail status could not be determined late Tuesday. Police say they are investigating other gas-pilfering schemes at as many as eight other stations.

"He had a lot of customers," Okondu said.

■ AMSTERDAM, Netherlands — Several self-avowed pedophiles founded a political party in the Netherlands and plan to endorse broadcasting pornographic material on daytime television and allowing children as young as 12 to feature in porn films.

The Charity, Freedom and Diversity party said Wednesday its central campaign platform will be lowering the age of consent in the Netherlands from 16 to 12.

"Forbidding children from sex only makes them more curious," party president Martijn Uittenbogaard told The Associated Press.

Uittenbogaard said his new party had supporters from "all corners of the country" but acknowledged Wednesday's launch had been marked by poor attendance. Reports said the launch in the city of Leiden was only attended by people from the media.

Uittenbogaard declined to give membership figures. The party still has to register with the government to be recognized as a political party.

He acknowledged his ideas are loathed by most Dutch people.

"A lot of people are against us and that's not strange but that doesn't worry us very much because we know we also have a lot of support," he said

Pollster Maurice de Hond dismissed the Netherlands' newest political arrival. "No one will vote for this party. Maybe they will get a thousand voters but not the 60,000 needed to get a parliamentary seat," he said.

Uittenbogaard said he had been a pedophile activist for many years.

Party secretary Norbert de Jonge told local media that he had been a target of hate emails and phone calls since Tuesday.

"They think its a joke but we're dead serious," he said.

■ STAMFORD, Conn. — Commuters passing through the state's busiest train station are fighting a losing battle against the pigeons that call the station home.

With its tall pillars and welcoming rafters, the Stamford station reminds pigeons of their natural habitat and the birds have resisted several efforts to keep them away.

"Why can't we outsmart a pigeon?" said Joseph McGee, a vice president at the Business Council of Fairfield County who uses the station daily. "Man has got to do better."

Pigeon droppings have stained some of the walls, prompting concerns about health hazards. Others fear the dangers of large crowds jostling to avoid falling feces.

"Somebody could get pushed off the platform," said Connecticut Commuter Rail Council member Jeffrey Maron.

Two years ago, the state

installed spikes on some of the rafters, making them less desirable for roosting. It worked, for a time.

"They improvise," said Kevin Nursick, a state Department of Transportation spokesman. "They've learned how to continue to roost."

The state hired a consultant this month to trap and remove the pigeons one at a time. Female pigeons are baited into traps, then males are caught when they arrive looking for the females. The operation has cost the state \$5,000.

doesn't understand the fuss.



SEC coaching carousel slows, for now

DESTIN, Fla. - Southeastern Conference football coaches spent part of last year's spring meetings getting to know one another.

With three new coaches and another returning to the league after a three-year hiatus, there were introductions, handshakes and pleasantries galore.

No need for any of that this time

Every football coach in the league kept his job after last season, something that hasn't happened since 1988. Has the SEC finally found stability after 36 coaching changes in the last 17 years and numerous highprofile debacles that included the tenures of Mike DuBose, Hal Mumme, Mike Price and Ron Zook?

"It's just a down year for firing," South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier quipped.

Maybe so. In fact, every conference coach agreed that the lack of turnover in 2006 has nothing to do with increased job security, especially in a profession that has developed

little patience for rebuilding and even less tolerance for losing.

"Job security? There ain't none," Auburn coach Tommy Tuberville said. "There's pressure, but we knew it getting in this business, especially our conference. It's very competitive. You can have a real good team and lose two or three games. That's our business. We thrive on it, just like athletes thrive on competition. It's no different any year. You try to play your best and coach your best and take the consequences - good or

Nine of the league's 12 schools have replaced their football coach since the 2000 season, with Alabama making three hires in that span (Dennis Franchione, Price and Mike

The conference had its biggest turnover last year, with Urban Meyer (Florida), Les Miles (LSU), Ed Oregeron (Ole Miss) and Spurrier taking over programs.

Despite a shake-up of his assistant coaching staff, Tennessee coach Phillip Fulmer remains in the top spot after a disappointing 5-6 season.

Fulmer hired a new offensive

coordinator, David Cutcliffe, who was a Vols assistant for 17 years before he left to be head coach at

Ole Miss fired Cutcliffe after a 4-7 season in 2004, even though he was just one year removed from being named SEC coach of the year.

Fulmer fired receivers coach Pat Washington and offensive line coach Jimmy Ray Stephens. Running backs coach Trooper Taylor moved to receivers; former Ole Miss assistant Matt Luke replaced Stephens; and Kurt Roper, a former Ole Miss and Kentucky assistant, now coaches running backs.

"Obviously it is a very tough league, and turnover has been a major part of it," Kentucky coach Rich Brooks said. "It's become more and more that way. Ten years from now, it will be even more so that way. The pressure to win has increased at all levels and certainly in this league because it is such a competitive league. You've got to win pretty consistently."

Indeed.

Florida parted ways with Zook before he finished his third year in

2004, cutting him loose despite a 23-14 record that included four victories against rivals Georgia, Tennessee and Florida State.

"You may not like it, but you better understand it and accept it," said Brooks, whose job could be in jeopardy without some improvement in 2006. "If not, you're going to have a lot of sleepless nights."

Tuberville had a few of those.

Auburn was poised to fire him after the Tigers failed to meet lofty expectations in 2003. But school officials bungled the search for a possible successor, generating enough sympathy for Tuberville to save his job.

The following year, the Tigers won the school's first SEC championship since 1989 and finished undefeated. Although Auburn had to watch Southern California and Oklahoma play for the national championship, Tuberville secured a long-term contract.

But Tuberville knows that having several years remaining on a lucrative deal would mean little if he's not winning.

"It gets harder every year," he said. "And we've even made it harder with the championship game and now 12 games.'

With the 12-game schedule beginning this fall, conference teams have mostly shied away from adding marquee matchups.

LSU and Tulane signed a 10-year contract. Georgia and Colorado have a series set. North Carolina and South Carolina agreed to renew their rivalry in 2007 and in 2010. Florida and Miami will do the same in 2008 and

But the schools are pretty much unwilling to trade a lucrative home game for a home-and-away series every year. They also don't want to fill what would have been an open week with a tough opponent.

And who could blame them, especially in a league with so little job security?

"Every team we play, I know we can get beat," said Georgia coach Mark Richt, a former assistant at Florida State. "There have been times back in the old ACC where I probably thought, 'We're probably going to win this thing.' But I don't ever go into a game in this league saying, 'We've got this one."

Izzo was one of several basketball coaches who visited Kuwait in late May and led military teams in a basketball tournament.

Other teams were coached by Alabama's Mark Gottfried, South Carolina's Dave Odom, Charlotte's Bobby Lutz, Indiana's Kelvin Sampson, Texas' Rick Barnes, the U.S. Military Academy's Jim Crews, the U.S. Naval Academy's Billy Lange, Kentucky's Tubby Smith, Maryland's Gary Williams, former Air Force coach Reggie Minton and ESPN basketball

analyst Jay Bilas.

Sampson's team won the tournament, Izzo said.

Several of the military players in the tournament were headed to Baghdad immediately afterward. Some of the teams had members who were expected to play in the tournament but died in combat earlier.

"Again there were some life-changing, bone-chilling experiences and situations,' Izzo said.

The coaches also conducted a youth clinic in Kuwait City and visited a military hospital. The trip ended Sunday.

Izzo and several of the coaches also visited Kuwait for a similar event last year.

LEXINGTON - Roger Clemens stood on the mound in a nearly empty minor league stadium Thursday night and warned to his son in the batting cage, "time for the heater _ fastballs."

On the first workout fastball, Koby Clemens - third baseman for the Houston Astros' Class A Lexington Legends - grounded weakly to second. Three heaters later, he launched the ball off a score-

board on the left-field wall. Dad didn't even look back.

The future Hall of Famer said his workout went "like clockwork," although he insisted that wasn't his prime

"Even with everything going on in my life right now, my job is to turn him loose with his ballclub and his manager, ready to play," Clemens said after a workout that approached two hours.

Next Tuesday, Clemens will make his first step in a much-anticipated return to the

Astros when he starts for the Legends. Koby, who has missed the last several weeks with a broken finger, will return to the minor league line-

Taking batting practice with a 341-game winner isn't bad rehab, he said.

"It's almost like a pitching machine when he gets out there," the younger Clemens said. "It's going to be right

Clemens, wearing an Astros workout jersey and a Legends cap, says he'll keep

count Tuesday night and won't be surprised if youngsters with ambitions similar to his son's end up tearing him apart. He says it'll be a good time to work on his changeup, which he seldom throws.

Barring any setbacks, his Lexington appearance will be followed by one June 11 at Double-A Corpus Christi and another June 16 at Triple-A Round Rock.

Although Clemens says his son's recovery from injury provided a major nudge for his

himself to a strict 60-pitch own return, he didn't get much pressure from him on choosing the Astros over other suitors, such as the Yankees, Red Sox and Rangers.

"He's old enough and mature enough to know I was beating myself up about it, so he didn't need to add to it," Clemens said.

Rocket coming back for a good reason - because he can

Roger Clemens struggled a bit trying to answer the only question that really mattered. It was almost as if he wasn't quite sure himself why he's coming back to pitch for the Houston Astros.

At the risk of putting words in his mouth, I'll answer it for

Because he can.

Because he can still bring it at the age of 43. Because he can get the Astros to pay him more than \$12 million to do it.

Because he can.

It's really not much more how conflicted Clemens sounded Wednesday when he put an Astros cap on his head and announced plans to return to the team in a few weeks.

He talked about his late mother and what she would think. He talked about his sons and what they did think. An awful lot of thinking was

going on until Clemens finally decided late Tuesday night to return.

"I don't necessarily know that I need to (come back) or that I want to, but I'm committed," Clemens said.

Clemens should because the Astros are certainly committed to him. They'll pay him about \$120,000 a day for the rest of the season once he joins the team, and the best part is he only has to work every fifth day or so.

That's not bad as part-time jobs go. Beats fighting other retirees for those \$7 an hour gigs as Wal-Mart greeters.

The bottom line, though, is complicated than that, despite that Clemens, who retired twice before, believes he can still pitch. So do the Astros, Yankees, Red Sox, and other teams who were trying to lure him back onto the mound.

Not many athletes who are Clemens' age get that kind of attention. Usually if clubs call past the age of 40, it's to invite you to shake hands on a cruise or indulge some beer-belly wannabes in fantasy camp.

The attention is flattering, to be sure. But the thought that he could stave off Father Time for yet another year seems to be what really appeals to

He said as much when he made it clear he wasn't signing on for a sentimental retirement tour around the league.

"I'm not riding around in the back of a convertible, waving my hat and selling tickets," Clemens said. "They expect me to get on the field and win ballgames and do it the way they're used to seeing me do

"And I accept that more so than anyone.'

The worst thing, of course, that could happen to Clemens is that he embarrasses himself because he doesn't know when to quit. The history of sports is littered with images of athletes who stay too long because they can't see what has happened to their once formidable

Think of Willie Mays stumbling around the outfield for the New York Mets, or Muhammad Ali taking a beating from Larry Holmes.

Time really does wait for no one, even the greats.

And, legendary workout regimen or not, Clemens will be 44 in August, an age at which both skills and muscles are inexorably in decline.

"I can get into a game situation and my body not respond like I want it to," he acknowl-

Still, you have to like Clemens' chances. Though he faded in the playoffs and World Series last year, giving up 10 runs in 16 innings, his ERA for the regular season was a ridiculous 1.87, the best in the league and half the average of pitchers who were half

And with just little more than a half a season left by the time he takes the mound, Clemens can pace himself in a

way he couldn't through an entire season.

Besides, this deal was too sweet to turn down.

Clemens was not only able to escape spring training and a good chunk of the season, but he'll begin his comeback in Lexington, for the Class A team where his oldest son, Koby, plays.

If all goes according to plan, he'll take the mound for the first time June 22 at home against the Minnesota Twins. Assuming he stays healthy, he figures to make about 18 starts the remainder of the season, which for those keeping score at home comes out to about \$666,000 a start.

With Clemens, though, it's not all about money. He's made more than the gross national product of some third world countries already, and another \$12 million or so isn't going to change his lifestyle.

Clemens wants to win more games, and he wants to get back to another World Series.

He believes he can help a .500 team get there and, judging from the calls urging him to return from his former teammates, they believe, too.

Clemens has 341 wins, a lifetime ERA of 3.12 and 4,502 strikeouts. He'll go down as one of the greatest pitchers of all time.

He's just not ready to go just quite yet.

"I know it's going to be stressful, I know I'm going to be tested, I know I'm going to have some lows going through this," he said. "Those are the questions I had to ask myself, if I'm ready to do this again."

Clemens answered his own questions.

It won't be long until he starts answering some of ours.

Woods folded father's plans into his own heart

Tiger Woods hinted for the first time publicly that he plans to play in the upcoming U.S. Open, and he did it while staging a golf clinic for a few dozen kids Tuesday in Arkansas.

Both of those things would have pleased the old man to no end.

Earl Woods died May 3, and his son has been understandably mum about his golf schedule since. Tiger did, however, squeeze in a practice round at Winged Foot in Mamaroneck, N.Y., on Saturday, as revealing a hint as any that he will be back there June 15-18 for the U.S. Open.

But since little in his life happens by accident, on or off the golf course, there was a reason Woods used a question from the crowd at the Alotian Club outside of Little Rock to confirm he was tailoring his practice sessions to meet the exacting demands of a U.S. Open course setup.

"You can't win a U.S. Open driving the ball poorly," Woods said. "Work on my driving and really work on my irons, distance control."

And the reason he answered that question became clear not long after, in Woods' response to another question about what message he had for young

"I think the greatest advice is to care and share," Woods said. "My dad was so adamant about that line. He said if you care about something, you'll share it."

One part of Earl Woods' legacy is on display every time Tiger tees it up. Though he was a fair player, the father realized about the time his boy grew as tall as a 4-iron there was nothing he could teach him about the swing. But the intense concentration, his supernatural calm, his fierce competitive drive - those are all things Earl willed his son, or else imbued in him so exhaustively that they became second nature.

Teaching Tiger to share, though, was different. That Earl did by example. Clinics like the one Tiger staged to coincide with the inaugural Jackson T. Stephens Charitable Golf Tournament were part of Earl's grand plan for his precocious son, and he steered Tiger down that path early.

The first time I sat in the crowd for one was on a warm Sunday afternoon in 1993, when Earl was 61 and Tiger just 17. It was held at an inner city golf course on the south side of Chicago, a couple of dozen par-5s from the nearest country club, with threadbare fairways and pockmarked greens. Cars zoomed past on one side and rap music spilled over from nearby picnies. Housing projects were visible in the distance over one of Tiger's shoulders and downtown skyscrapers over the other.

And the day before this - their sixth inner-city golf clinic in the past few months - Tiger had three-peated as U.S. Junior Open champion with birdies on the last two holes and a par to start the playoff. Some 250 kids and grown-ups politely arranged in a semicircle at the back of the Jackson Park driving range had already watched the teenager curve 5-iron shots around trees to one target, then bend 9-irons right and left and high and low to another for almost a half hour.

No one needed to be told they were seeing something special, and so rather than hype his son's obvious talents, Earl slipped in messages about staying in school and off drugs. Then, as they say in show business, came the pure entertainment. The big finish.

Tiger pulled the head cover off his metal driver and Earl put the bullhorn back to his lips. The distinctive "thwack" of a golf ball beginning a very long flight was followed by his booming voice.

"I hope nobody lives back there. Otherwise," Earl paused, pointing to a stand of trees beyond the 250-yard tar-

get, "they've got trouble on the way." Tiger almost certainly believed by then that he would rule the golf world one day. But on that one, he was just an obliging son, following a script his father had drawn up and enjoyed

PGA players Lee Elder and Calvin Peete, and several other black teaching pros who were not quite as successful, had pioneered similar programs for kids. But none of the golfers - black or white - who had gone before Tiger was so clearly marked for stardom.

There were a thousand other things a 17-year-old phenom could be doing with what little time he had away from the golf course, especially the day after winning the biggest tournament in the junior orbit. But Tiger stood around afterward and autographed every program, hat, golf ball and slip of paper thrust in his direction. It was his day to learn about sharing.

Plenty of things have changed since, not the least of them Earl's passing. From Tiger's opening tee shot at the U.S. Open on June 15, to his final putt that Sunday on Father's Day, we'll be reminded countless times by the announcers that he's playing through this tough time in his life because that's what Earl would want him to do.

That's true, of course. But showing up at Tuesday's clinic would have meant every bit as much to his father, knowing that the son he left behind has become a man who knows how to take

Kyle Busch, Mayfield penalized 25 points

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. -NASCAR announced Wednesday that Kyle Busch, driver of the No. 5 Chevrolet, has been fined, penalized points and placed on probation because of a rule infraction during the Coca-Cola 600 at Lowe's Motor Speedway.

Busch was in violation of Section 12-4-A (actions detrimental to stock car racing) of the NASCAR Rule Book. He disobeyed a directive from a NASCAR official, entered the racing surface without authorization and threw an object at another competitor's car during the event.

He has been fined \$50,000, penalized 25 driver points and placed on probation until Dec. 31. The infraction also resulted in car owner Rick Hendrick being penalized 25 owner points.

In addition, the No. 19 Dodge team was found to be in violation of Section 12-4-A, 12-4-Q (car. car parts, components and/or equipment used that do not conform to NASCAR rules) and Section 20-12.8.1A (roof height too low in post-race inspection). That infraction resulted in crew chief Ted Andrews being fined \$35,000, driver Jeremy Mayfield losing 25 driver points and car owner Ray Evernham losing 25 owner points.

Also, Don Richardson, crew member on the No. 5 Chevrolet team, has been fined \$5,000 and placed on probation until Dec. 31. He violated 12-4-A, because of improper use of a NASCAR credential.

Underrated actor Jeff Fahey ("White Hunter, Black Heart") is well cast here as a troubled prison psychologist who is frustrated in his efforts to help convicts go straight. He soon gets much more to worry about when a car wreck leaves him in need of a new right arm. He's rushed to an emergency room and lucks out (depending on your point of view) because the resident surgeon just happens to have won a huge grant for the facility based on her experiments in limb replacement surgery.

All goes well with the operation, eerily filmed Fahey's from drugged out point of view, until the arm starts ignorcommands ing from its new brain and displays a lack of respect for the personal space of others. Turns out that it came from a

mass murderer who liked to strangle his victims and is intent on continuing its wicked ways.

Socially, this wreaks havoc for Fahey, especially when the arm asserts its independence by slugging complete strangers in bars. Fahey opts to check into a hotel after the wayward limb turns a little friendly roughhousing with his boy into a deadly serious struggle that almost kills the child.

He then sets out to find other recipients of the murderer's limbs and forms a sort of "lonely parts club." Turns out that everyone who got a limb at the same hospital is hankering for a recall.

The group swaps individual accounts of their replacement limb horror stories and bond over the tense moments their independent parts have incurred. One member of the club recounts a tense scene where he loses control of his legs while trying to stop at a four-way intersection. It's great moment that plays on every driver's fear of losing control of their vehicle, while events seem to slow down unbearably as an accident looms.

Granted this sounds like the premise of some silly 1950s B-movie, and there's good reason for that, as the script is based on a 1950s French novel which loosely translates as "Choice Cuts." Studios passed on a screenplay adapted from the book, which may have been too grisly for audiences of the time.

Luckily, director Eric Red ("The Hitcher") resurrected the project and does a commendable job of translating it to the screen. Here he resists the urge to intensify the gory aspects of the story and instead ups the suspense with several great car sequences such as the opening accident which sets up the story. There is also a killer stalking the recipients and you won't have to work to hard to puzzle out his identity, as he is awash in stitches and moves like a man who appears to be missing several appendages.

Red also employs a fine cast,

The altar boy

We had made a rapid advance across Northern France from the Normandy beachhead. (Historians say it was the fastest opposed advance in the history of modern warfare.) Now, our 105-millimeter howitzer battalion was bivouacked in an abandoned castle on the outskirts of a small Belgian town. The exact locations of occupied and unoccupied territory were not well known, and

due to an error in map reading, we learned at daybreak that we were close to a German infantry unit. Watching our artillery battalion attempting to act as infantry was laughable, but we had no choice. Using our pieces at close range, with time bursts, we caused the enemy to Later that morning, I ventured

away from the castle and observed the local townspeople walking to the center of the village to the sound of church bells. I realized that it was Sunday, and people were on their

way to a Catholic mass. I followed

Inside the church, when the priest appeared from the sacristy, I saw that he was without an altar boy. I was only 19 years old, not too far away from my own altar-boy days in Philadelphia. Halogen headlights are a driver nuisance

by TOM and RAY MAGLIOZZI

Dear Tom and Ray:

How should I respond to drivers whose cars are equipped with the new blue headlights? Unlike the traditional headlights that most cars have, these are often blinding and are clearly unsafe. When I remind them by blinking my own headlights, the driver then flashes his already-bright lights, making things worse for me and others. Should I simply join them and leave my brights on full time? What should I do? And where are the regulators? - Richard

TOM: The regulators are in Washington, Richard, where they're busy with crucial matters of national importance, like how to refer to

RAY: So far, government regulators have declined to do anything about these HID (high-intensity discharge) headlights - even though many people have complained.

TOM: There are several theories as to what can be done to reduce the glare from HID headlights. Some have suggested that lights of that intensity need to be mounted lower so they don't shine right into the eyes of oncoming drivers. Others suggest that the wavelength of blue light is simply more irritating to the human eye than whiter light.

RAY: Both of those theories might

be true, and might suggest areas of potential regulation, but according to our sources at the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, they haven't found any hard evidence yet that these headlights are actually causing accidents.

TOM: Now, you might say: "Of course they're causing accidents! They're blinding people ... like me!" But before NHTSA will issue a regulation, it needs to have hard evidence that associates these headlights directly with accidents. In other words, it has to have testimonials or reported documentation of incidents in which cars with these headlights have blinded other drivers, causing those other drivers to crash into something. And apparently, the evidence is not there. Or not there yet.

RAY: And we all know that you can't make something illegal just because it's annoying. Otherwise, my brother would be locked up for life.

TOM: I would not encourage you to flash your bright lights at drivers with HID lights. You'll just blind THEM and increase the chances that they'll crash into you or the next innocent person behind you. And, as you've discovered, it usually just leads to retaliation" on the other drivers' part, when they flash their evenbrighter bright lights back at you. A better form of protest would be to write to NHTSA.

RAY: NHTSA is particularly interested in hearing from you if you've had an accident or near accident that you attribute to oncoming HID headlights, or if you know someone who

TOM: To add your thoughts or evidence to NHTSA's "Glare Docket," go to dms.dot.gov (leave out the "www"). Then click on "Simple Search" and enter "8885." When the docket comes up, choose "comment/submissions."

Engine cutoff has a few possible

Dear Tom and Ray:

I have a 1972 Chevy 1/2-ton pickup that's been parked for quite a while. I got it started and took it for a spin down the street. It does fine in first gear, but when its shifts into second gear, the engine cuts off. If I let off the gas, it idles just fine. Could this be a carburetor problem? The ignition system seems to be fine. The engine idles great and revs fine while stationary. Help! - Big Kahuna

RAY: Well, it could be the carburetor, B.K. But before you spend your next eight weekends trying to rebuild it, try the simple things first.

TOM: Right. You say the ignition seems to be fine, but it might not be. If your spark is weak, for example, the engine might run fine at idle. But when you speed up, the increased

flow of air and gasoline rushing into the cylinders can cause the spark to be blown out ... like a birthday candle. That might be your prob-

RAY: So, start by replacing the stuff most likely to cause weak spark: the points and condenser. You might also want to check for bad plugs or a bad ignition coil.

TOM: If the problem isn't weak spark,

then it IS the carburetor. I'd bet on plugged jets. You say the truck was sitting for a while. It's probably got the same gas in there that it had when you parked it in 1983. That means there's enough varnish there now to plug up the jets AND recoat the hull of the Andrea Doria.

RAY: You actually have three sets of jets on your carburetor. You have the idle circuit, which, as the name implies, provides enough gas to run the engine at idle. Then you've got your low-speed jets, which, as the name implies, provide enough additional gasoline to the engine for lowspeed operation.

TOM: Then you've got your high-

speed jets, which, despite the name, can come into play at fairly low speeds, too! Anytime you really step on the gas, even at a low speed. enough demand for gasoline that all of the jets - including the high-speed jets are delivering fuel. Or, in your case, not delivering Talk Cars fuel. And that might be what's causing

> the engine to stall. RAY: In which case, you'd need a carburetor rebuild. Mr. Kahuna. Or you can park the truck again, and pretend none of this

Exhibit reminds hikers that volunteers created Appalachian Trial-

GATLINBURG, Tenn. -Each year thousands of people hike all or part of the 2,175mile-long Appalachian Trail from Maine to Georgia.

And for each cleared footpath, clean toilet or comfortable shelter, the hikers should thank the network of volunteers who help maintain the

The AT is technically a national park, but volunteers organized through Appalachian Trail Conservancy and hiking clubs keep it open.

A small exhibit at the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, which contains 71 of the most-traveled miles on the AT, is hoping to educate visitors about the importance of volun-

"I think it's one of the neat-

est things about this trail," hiker and author Cindy Ross said. "Even though it's a government organization that's in charge of it, if it wasn't for the volunteers there wouldn't be a

A forester in New England named Benton MacKaye is credited with the idea for the Appalachian Trail in 1921.

The Appalachian Trail Conference, later called the Appalachian Conservancy, was founded four years later to organize the clearing of the trail, mostly by volunteers. It was completed in 1937 and crosses six national parks and eight national

The AT became a national scenic trail in 1968 by an act of Congress. The National Park Service delegated management to the ATC and provides some of the group's funding. Hiking clubs along the trail help organize volun-

The ATC estimates about 4 million people step foot on the AT a year. Between 2,000 and 3,000 start with the intention of hiking the entire trail; of those, between 600 and 1,200 finish.

About 11,400 people spent night along the Appalachian Trail in the Smokies last year, according to backcountry permits and reservations issued by the

Ross hiked the entire AT in 1978-79 after having to stop in the middle to recover from a broken foot. Her book, "A Woman's Journey," chronicles the experience. She spoke about it in a lecture series last month in conjunction with the

'We wanted to bring out this idea that everybody can walk a part of the AT. You can get out of your car at Newfound Gap and walk either direction, north or south,

as much as you want," said folks know it's maintained by Phyllis Henry, a volunteer coordinator with Smoky Mountains Hiking Club. "Anybody can experience the AT no matter what age.'

Henry helped put together the AT exhibit at the Sugarlands Visitor Center near the Gatlinburg entrance to the park. It is scheduled to remain open through October.

The exhibit, while covering only two walls in a corner, displays a pair of worn-out boots used by a "thru-hiker," the term for someone who hikes the entire trail. It also notes that it would take 5 million steps to walk the whole trail.

A similar exhibit is located in the Shenandoah National Park in Virginia, and visitors can search the archives or see a giant relief map of the trail at the ATC headquarters in Harpers Ferry, W.Va.

Last year more than 5,500 people volunteered some 195,000 hours on the trail. In the Smokies, trail "maintainers" pitched in 11,000 hours.

The AT gets a big push on National Trails Day, held this year on June 3, when volunteers work all day on certain

"Even with all that help there's still lots more to do," said Morgan Sommerville, ATC's regional director in Asheville, N.C.

There's a lot of backlog of work to be done. We're working as quick as we can to do it. Almost all of the work is done by volunteers so we have many years of work left to do to bring the Appalachian Trail in the Smokies up to a reasonable standard."

The trail portion in the "I just don't think a lot of Smokies is plagued mainly by erosion caused by heavy rainfall and a steep terrain -Clingmans Dome on the Tennessee-North Carolina line is the AT's highest point at 6,643 feet.

Volunteers, either working one day a year or for days or weeks at a time as part of a crew, install and clean water bars, which are used to keep water off the trail. They trim overgrowth, clear fallen trees. pick up trash and help build bridges or steps.

Remote sections are even harder to maintain because they may require volunteers to spend all day hiking there. Sometimes material has to be flown in by helicopter.

And somebody has to tend to the backcountry toilets and keep them stocked with mulch to compost the waste.

"It's not as unpleasant as it sounds," Sommerville said, "but it's something we're always seeking volunteers
