

Construction of new school celebrated at groundbreaking

MIDDLE CREEK - Several members of the community were on hand Thursday evening to celebrate the construction of a new elementary school to replace Prestonsburg and Clark elementaries.

Floyd County Supt. Paul Fanning called the event a "postgroundbreaking" for the new school. Construction began at the site several months ago, but Fanning said now seemed like a better time to conduct an official ceremony considering the weather of recent weeks.

The architect chosen for the project is an Eastern Kentuckian himself working under the company named Richardson and

"We thank everyone for giving us this opportunity," said architect Bill Richardson.

Richardson took a few minutes at the podium to to describe a few key aspects of the the new school. He says it will be a very unique school that will have the capacity to hold 780 students, all on one level. The library and gymnasium will have skylights and each section of the building, or pod, will be connected by glass corridors.

State Sen. Johnny Ray Turner was also on hand at the ground-

"I know that this school will be beautiful," Turner said.

Past disagreements over the site and the name for the new school were also on the minds of several in attendance. Mayor Jerry Fannin said, "A lot of people have not agreed, but the bottom line is that this school is going to [provide] a great education for our students.'

Each principal has been given a time capsule. They will each place items in from their schools in the capsules, which will be placed underground when the school is dedicated.

The school is expected to be completed in July 2007 and to be ready for students to enter for the 2007-08 school year.

This project is expected to cost an estimated \$11.2 million.

P'burg P&Z votes to add enforcement powers

The city council will ultimately have approve the action at a future meeting.

Federal inmate seeks \$35 million for broken hand

PIKEVILLE - A former inmate at the Big Sandy United States Penitentiary has filed a \$35 million lawsuit against the government and the Federal Bureau of Prisons.

Clarence Skinner, who is currently being held in an Indiana penitentiary, filed a lawsuit on Sept. 5 which alleges he was not given proper treatment for an injury he sustained to his wrist while imprisoned at Big Sandy.

Skinner says that a cast was applied to the broken wrist, but after removal of the cast he was still experiencing excruciating pain. He alleges that he told officials at the prison of his pain and visited the medical staff several times, but they told him it would get better in a few weeks. Skinner is now saying that he still has severe arthritis and pain in the wrist.

Skinner is requesting compensatory damages in the amount of \$10 million and punitive damages amounting to \$25 million.

Soldiers describe life in a war zone

PIKEVILLE - Many often let it slip their minds that so many troops are still in Iraq, fighting skirmishes every day, and most people have no idea what they go through on a daily basis.

Thanks to modern technology, we do sometimes get the chance to see our loved ones and others who put their lives on the line.

The stations of East Kentucky Broadcasting recently conducted a video conference with a few of the nation's troops. The group consisted of one National Guard member, two Army soldiers and five Marines.

East Kentucky Broadcasting invited several other news outlets to participate in the conference. As everyone stood in the room and saw the young troops step in

front of the camera and the images that were relayed through on the large television situated at the front of the room, many reporters were taken back by the sight of each one of them carrying their guns over their shoulders, almost as if it had become a part of their body.

Despite being far from home, the troops appeared to be in good spirit. They often laughed and kidded with each other, just as if they were home with longtime friends. Several said they become attached to each other, although most have only been deployed for a couple of months.

When each of them were asked what they were doing on the day of the Sept. 11 attacks, some described being in a 10th-grade history class or a ninth-grade

Wilcher resigns as state environmental secretary

FRANKFORT Secretary Environmental LaJuana S. Wilcher will leave her job at the end of the month, becoming the latest in a long line of ranking officials to depart from Gov. Ernie Fletcher's administration.

Wilcher said in statement that she plans to return to private law practice and to devote more time to her farm at Alvaton.

"I also plan to return to teaching law school classes and participate more in my church and public interest activities," she said.

The Fletcher administration has been plagued by a series of resignations, including Commerce Secretary Jim Host, Education Secretary Virginia Fox, Health and Family Services Secretary Holsinger, Justice Secretary Steve Pence, Personnel Secretary Erwin Roberts.

Wilcher was one of three remaining cabinet secretaries in Fletcher's original executive cabinet. Another is Economic Development Strong. Secretary Gene Finance and Former Cabinet Administration Secretary Robbie Rudolph is now Fletcher's executive cabi-

Fletcher spokeswoman Jodi Whitaker said Wilcher will be replaced by Teresa J. Hill, vice chairman of the Kentucky Public Service Commission.

"Her experience in public service and in private practice as an attorney will serve her well in this new position," Fletcher said in a statement.

After taking office in 2003. Fletcher combined several into cabinets Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet and named Wilcher to head the agency that regulates a number of diverse activities, including coal mining, horse racing, banking, workers compensation, alcoholic beverage control, charitable gaming, professional boxing and wrestling.

Hill was appointed vice chairman of the Public Service Commission in August 2005. She had served previously on Fletcher's staff as executive director of boards and commissions and as executive director of legal services in the Commerce Cabinet.

A native of Whitley County, Hill is a graduate of Morehead State University and the Northern Kentucky University law school. Before her work at the Commerce Cabinet, Hill worked in private practice in chance to help shape state and national education policy to better serve all children in our public schools and to serve state education leaders across the country," Wilhoit said in the release.

Wilhoit was Kentucky's third education commissioner when he took over in October 2000. Before being named to the position, Wilhoit had served as deputy commissioner from 1997 to 2000. He came to Kentucky after serving as deputy commissioner for the Department Education's Bureau Learning Support Services, the release said.

Commissioner Deputy Kevin Noland will take over as interim commissioner when Wilhoit leaves, the release said. It would mark the third time Noland has served in that capacity, board spokeswoman Lisa Gross said.

FRANKFORT - With Gov. Ernie Fletcher no longer facing criminal charges, one of his potential challengers in next year's election has decided not to run against the firstterm Republican.

That would include talks on the reauthorization of the No Child Left Behind Act, which could come next year. The law, pushed by President Bush, was intended to hold schools accountable for student per-

Wilhoit's presence in Washington could benefit Kentucky during that debate, Sexton said.

"It certainly helps to have someone who understands the challenges facing a state like Kentucky," Sexton said. "Kentucky is one of a handful of states that have struggled to keep No Child Left Behind from having a negative effect on what they're doing in their own state."



Right direction, farther to go

Of course, there is a lot to celebrate in the fact that more Kentucky high school students are taking advanced placement classes than before. That shows today's students are thinking bigger. They're aiming higher. They're willing to suffer a little more to get ahead.

They're thinking more seriously about college: Admissions officers at good colleges expect students to have taken AP courses. And at most schools, students can get college credit for their high school AP courses if their test scores are high enough.

But while we celebrate this progress Kentucky's students and schools are making, and the commitment they are showing, it must be just the start. After all, offering a breadth of AP courses and seeing kids respond by signing up isn't enough. In the end, success is determined by the number of students who are able to pass their final AP exams, administered each year by the College Board.

And unfortunately, Kentucky still trails the national aver-

age in students who receive a passing grade.



The 1 percent problem

Ron Suskind's best-selling book "The One Percent Doctrine" refers to Vice President Dick Cheney's axiom that if there is a 1 percent chance of a nuclear bomb going off in an American city, the U.S. government has to respond with all the urgency as if there is a 100 percent chance of such an event. When Suskind's book appeared, there was much clucking about Cheney's thinking - so dire, so dark, so unmodulated.

But Cheney's vision can only be considered unhinged if a fog of complacency descends about the terror threat facing us. Whenever that threat becomes clear again, as it has in the wake of the breakup of a plot in Britain to blow airliners from the sky, everyone begins to think like Dick Cheney, or maybe more so: If there is a mere .0001 percent chance of a terrorist smuggling liquid explosives on a flight from Denver to Green Bay, Wis., no one can carry on hair gel. and new mothers must present their baby formula for inspection.

The fact is that we live in a 1 percent world. We face a shadowy enemy who represents a threat that is unspeakably awful when it is actualized, but is too easy to discount when it isn't. The British plot serves as a

reminder that Islamic fanatics are intent on committing violent acts against the West, but really, how many reminders do we need?

Since 9/11 there have been the Bali bombings (October 2002), the Madrid bombings (March 2004) and the British subway bombings (July 2005), among others. Terrorists are very good about reminding us of their

threat at regular intervals - it's just that there is a segment of Western opinion that willfully wants to forget.

Fresh from rallying around the Democratic Senate candidate Connecticut who vanquished

their party's most prominent hawk, the Democrats reflexively condemned the Iraq War as a distraction from the war on terror in response to the British news. A case can be made that Iraq has indeed prevented us from taking tough measures elsewhere in the world. But Democrats simply oppose tough measures, in Iraq or anywhere else.

The same Democrats who oppose the war in Iraq tend to oppose the National Security Agency surveillance program, condemn aggressive interrogations and complain about the Patriot Act. It is all part of a

worldview that wishes away dangers when they demand philosophically uncongenial responses, defined as roughly anything that doesn't involve shoveling federal money to localities.

We are engaged in a multifaceted war on terror. To fight it requires the military, law enforcement, international cooperation and preventive domestic-security measures. The ulti-

mate center of gravity is the hearts and minds of Muslims. We have to reach into the Middle East, because so long as the cradle of Islamic civilization is a cauldron chaos and failure, it will spin

off murderous fanatics.

We also must engage in an ideological struggle within the West, where radicalism infects Muslims living among us. Britain is a study in how not to do the latter. It doesn't insist on assimilation and routinely courts exactly the Islamic extremists who should be shunned.

All of this is the work of decades. In the meantime, get used to the 1 percent world.

Our economic 'recovery' is mostly phony

With the fifth anniversary of the end of the last recession now approaching, both employment and wages should be fully restored to their pre-recession levels and growing in real terms. Instead, both are still below their 2000 to 2001 peaks, with no sign of any improvement before the business cycle turns down

Real weekly earnings declined in ten of the past 12 months. With inflation still rising and unemployment edging up once again, there will be no improvement in real wages through the end of the year. The modest upturn in job growth that occurred in the second half of 2005 ended abruptly this year.

Job growth hit 200,000 in February - a sufficient level to absorb new entrants and a small number of the unemployed. But since then, job growth has averaged only 119,000 per month, well under what is needed to ease joblessness and keep any upward pressure on wages. Unemployment, too, is rising nationwide and in most major urban labor markets. From Miami to San Francisco, large cities have lost most of the ground they gained in the first

quarter of 2006, with unemployment rates back up to the same levels as a year ago.

In many large labor markets, the unemployment rate jumped by half a percentage point or more from June to July 2006. The number of mass layoffs, which dropped below 1,000 for the first quarter of 2006, rose to 1,213 in the second quarter as GDP growth slowed and companies in several sectors made substantial workforce cuts. A new study from the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) clearly demonstrates that the recession ended in November 2001, but employment did not recover to its pre-recession level until early 2005.

And that recovery was short-lived, with job growth sputtering at the end of 2005 and then declining sharply in

The BLS study also found that the average workweek remains shorter than it was at the start of the 2001 recession and earnings have not kept pace with inflation. The job "recovery" from the 2001 recession has been atypical. From 1969 to 1981, the length of employment downturns averaged nine months from the peak to the trough, and then took an average of 16 months from the previous peak to recover to pre-recession levels, according to the BLS. With the 2001 recession, however, employment declined for 30 months after the start of the 2001 recession, and took 48 months from the February 2001 peak to recover.

Some industries never did regain the jobs they lost. Employment in manufacturing, transportation and the wholesale trades is still below 2001 levels. The information industry, which lost a larger percentage of jobs in the recession than any other except manufacturing, is still down by more than 650,000 jobs. Employment in IT will drop again as more companies move more jobs off

A new report from McKinsey Consulting shows that the number of offshore vendors prepared to handle IT infrastructure work has tripled in the past two years and 40 percent to 50 percent of these positions in the United States now can be moved abroad. Those jobs lost in IT, along with the jobs lost in manufacturing, carried above-average wages and

Many of the industries that have recovered fully since the recession, such as leisure and hospitality and retail trade, are lower-wage, adding to the overall downward trend in wages since the recession. The BLS study also confirms that real average hourly earnings have declined since November 2001 in six out of 13 industries. Even in the leisure and retail sectors, where employment fully recovered, real earnings have declined.

Overall, earnings in the lowerpaying industries have been more adversely affected than the high-paying industries. Some have seen real earnings decline by 2.5 percent or more. With higher unemployment and inflation on the horizon and the number of lower-wage jobs growing faster than higher-wage jobs, pushing a federal minimum wage increase through Congress is even more crucial than we thought.

Lee Marvin stars as the local mountie and manages to quickly sell himself as the toughest screen persona ever to be named Edgar. He is initially leery of the gang's story but reluctantly agrees to investigate while breaking in his new assistant, who is fresh out of the academy and sporting the latest technology, a two-way

They decide to bring Johnson in to headquarters to straighten the mess out but are saddled with the gang when they ride out to Johnson's place. The gang blows it — no surprise there — and takes a shot at Johnson just as Edgar is on the brink of talking him out of his cabin.

Tips for privately selling a used car

Dear Tom and Ray:

I am planning to buy a 2006 Subaru Forester this year and don't want to deal with the trade-in hassle and rip-off, so I'm thinking about selling my five-speed Subaru 1997 Impreza Outback Sport privately. I'm a little wary about the whole thing, because I've never done it before. I've had all of the required maintenance done on a regular basis, including timing belts, brakes, new clutch, tires, tire rotations and oil changes. It has 170,000 miles on it. I've been the sole owner. Also, the yellow "engine" light has been on for a few months, but there's no problem with how it drives. Externally, there is a dent in the front passenger nose above the wheel (that I'm hoping my husband can pop out) and no hubcaps. I guess my question is: When I sell it, am I supposed to have it evaluated first and give a list of its known problems? I just don't want to spend any more money on it. How much do I need to do before I sell it? - Denise

TOM: Laws vary from state to state, Denise. In the strictest states, you could be held liable for problems that prevent the car from passing the state inspection. But it doesn't sound like that's an issue in your case.

RAY: So you don't HAVE to do

anything before you sell this car. In fact, you can give it to a consignment lot if you really don't want to deal with it. They'll display the car on the lot and give you a percentage of the final sale price whenever it sells.

TOM: But if you decide to sell it yourself, all you're morally obligated to do is provide reasonable disclosure about anything you know to be wrong with the car, and not lie to the buyer. Traditionally, it's up to the buyer to have it checked out, not the

RAY: But there are things you can do to prevent potential buyers from running away screaming. I'd say the "check engine" light is one of those

TOM: Think about it. If you're buying a used car, especially one with 170,000 miles on it, you know that there are going to be some imperfections. So you'll probably shrug off a little dent or some missing hubcaps. But if you get in the car and turn the key, and a bright-yellow light shines right in your face and says "Check Engine!!" you might get a little

RAY: Now, in reality, the "check engine" light could mean something incredibly minor. It could indicate a loose gas cap. Or, more likely, a bad oxygen sensor or a bad knock sensor. And that'll probably cost you a couple hundred bucks to fix. But that'll be money well spent.

TOM: Then just clean it up the best you can, and write an ad. Something like: "'97 Subaru Impreza Outback Sport, 5 spd, 170K, runs great, well maintained, lost hubcaps while being chased by police at high speed through wooded swamp.' You'll sell it in a weekend, Denise.

The finer points of downshifting Dear Tom and Ray:

A recent Car Talk column about downshifting left me with another question. You said that when going down a long, steep hill, you should shift your automatic transmission into a lower gear, like third, second or first. But here's my question. Whenever I shift my automatic transmission, like from park to drive, or from drive to reverse, it's always with the car stopped and my foot on the brake. Do I have to stop the car and put my foot on the brake before shifting down to third, second or first on a steep hill? - Kathy

TOM: No. The car only needs to be stopped if you're changing directions or shifting into or out of park. But you can shift between forward gears while you're driving.

RAY: Just to remind everybody, we said that when you're descending a long, steep hill, you want to avoid

"riding" y o u r brakes all the way down because they can overheat and fail. True, that's the quick way down the mountain, but it's not the

way

want to go.

Trust me. TOM: The best way to avoid riding the brakes is to shift to a lower gear and let the engine do some of the

Talk Cars

RAY: So here's the routine. If you find yourself going down a long, steep hill, and you notice that you're constantly on the brakes, move the shifter down one gear. You should feel what we call "engine braking," and the car should slow down. The engine will sound louder - maybe a lot louder - but that's fine. You're not doing any harm.

TOM: If you find that you still need to ride the brakes to keep the car at a reasonable speed, shift down another gear. You should feel even

more engine braking now. And if you need to, shift down again, all the way to first gear. I've been on plenty of mountain roads where I had to shift all the way down to first just to keep from soiling my trousers!

RAY: Once you're in a gear that keeps the car's speed under control, you can then use the gas pedal to speed up between turns, and then just take your foot off the gas pedal to help slow you down again. You'll find that it's much easier to keep the car under control this

TOM: And once you get to the bottom of the hill, you shift back into drive and go on your merry way,

Detroit Lakes, Minn., company that produces Swheat Scoop litter, said the litter has normally used lower grades of wheat for its product rather than wheat grown specifically for the kitty box.

Hughes founded Pet Care

Systems Inc. in 1994 to create and market the litter. He sold the company four years ago to the Farmers Union Marketing and Processing Association of Redwood Falls, Minn.

The Detroit Lakes plant uses about 5,000 bushels of wheat each day, Hughes said. It is ground and made into pellets, with soybean oil used in the process to keep down flour

MANCHESTER, England — His driving was swift, but his thinking wasn't.

A 28-year-old man who blew up a speed-trap camera, hoping to destroy evidence of his transgression, was sentenced to prison for four months on Wednesday.

Craig Moore, 28, from Doncaster, said he had seen a flash of light from the camera, indicating that it had detected him speeding on Aug. 14,

He claimed he feared his driver's license would be suspended, making him unable to work to support his family.

So, he drove back to the site and employed materials that he uses in his work as a welder to melt the camera's metal body in an explosive fire.

That backfired because images of his speeding survived the explosion, and so did images of him returning to attack the camera. He pleaded guilty to a charge of damaging property.

'The defendant accepts that he has created a mountain out of a molehill by behaving stupidly. He finds himself in a great deal of trouble rather than the little deal of trouble he would have been in," said lawyer Andrew defense Bailey.

In fact, he would have been in no trouble.

Officials confirmed that the camera that Moore sped past was only to monitor traffic patterns and was designed to deter speeders, not catch them. It flashed only as a warning.





LEXINGTON - It was a medical diagnosis Matt McCutchan refused to

Neck injury. No more football -

The 310-pound center had enlisted with the Naval Academy largely because he always dreamed of playing Notre Dame, and Navy had an annual date with the Fighting Irish. He acknowledges now that in that pre-Sept. 11 world, football came first and the possibility of combat was a distant

But a series of injuries he sustained as a sophomore in 2002 put his football dreams on hold. The Navy deemed him healthy enough to continue his military training, but not healthy enough to play.

"They were more worried about me being an officer than playing football," McCutchan said. "I really didn't

see it that way."

So he got a second doctor's opinion a far rosier one — and searched for another school. He found Kentucky, decimated by NCAA sanctions, particularly on the offensive line. The Wildcats, which had turned him down originally when he joined Navy, offered him no scholarship when he walked on to the practice squad three

But as a junior in 2004 and senior in 2005, McCutchan emerged as a starter and one of few bright spots on Kentucky's line. When the season ended last year with a loss to Tennessee, he thought he had played his final football game.

Most of the spring, he refused to put on any pads, not wanting to confront that reality. But then he got a call from the NCAA, which granted him one more year of eligibility because of his previous injuries.

McCutchan had new life as a foot-

"There were a lot of ifs," McCutchan said. "I didn't think last year that I'd have another opportuni-

Now, after Kentucky's 59-28 thumping Sunday at Louisville, the 24-year-old center may be the only member of the Wildcats' line that retains his starting job for week two against Texas State.

Although McCutchan is one of the oldest players in college football because of his six years of eligibility, he's no longer the oldest on Kentucky. Defensive end J.D. Craigman, a junior college transfer, has him beaten by a few months, McCutchan says. McCutchan's nickname for his elder is "grandpa."

Craigman and McCutchan say that sometimes they feel they come from a different generation than their younger teammates. Most of the team likes rap music, McCutchan said, but their tastes in the genre are far different than

And, McCutchan points out that some of his teammates were barely born in 1988 when Notre Dame won the national championship — an event that had him glued to the television

Laid back and personable off the field, McCutchan's teammates say his on-field persona is anything but.

"He brings an attitude to the offensive line," said senior offensive guard Michael Aitcheson. "He's got a nasty attitude. He's just a gritty kind of guy.'

His struggle to preserve his football career has changed him profoundly as a person, McCutchan said.

Ironically, he says he is more determined now to serve his country in the military - even if it means going to war - than he ever was at the Naval Academy. Once his playing days at Kentucky are over, he is considering finding a recruiting officer and enlist-

"All of my friends right now in the Marine Corps and Navy just finished a year of training," he said. "They're heading to Iraq. I kind of feel guilty I'm not going through the same thing they're going through."

But that's a decision for later. For

now, McCutchan says he is determined to help get Kentucky back in the win column - even if it means sacrificing most of his free time from his final year of college to do it.

"Every little thing - taping my fingers up before practice, putting my shoes on, I just love every bit of it," McCutchan said. "I don't have class on Tuesday or Thursday. I think I'm just going to come in here and watch film all day."

LEXINGTON - The University of Kentucky announced Monday the 2006 inductees into the UK Athletics Hall of Fame, which includes men's golfer Gay Brewer, gymnast Jenny Hansen, 1930s multi-sport star Ellis Johnson, men's basketball player Adrian Smith, broadcaster Claude Sullivan and football player Craig Yeast. The class will be formally inducted during Hall of Fame Weekend,

Sept. 15-16, in conjunction with

the football game against Ole Miss.

'It's a pleasure to recognize some of the great UK accomplishments that have occurred over the years," Athletics Director Mitch Barnhart

"These six individuals personify hard work, dedication and commitment - all the things that make Kentucky great."

Brewer (1952-54) joined the PGA Tour in 1956 and won 10 tournaments durin his career, highlighted by a victory in the 1967 Masters. He was a member of the 1967 and 1971 United States Ryder Cup Teams.

Hansen (1993-96) is one of the most distinguished gymnasts in NCAA history, holding NCAA records with eight individual titles at the national meet; four titles in one year (1995, floor exercise, balance

beam, vault, all-around); and three all-around championships (1993-95).

The 1995 SECFemale Athlete of the Year, Hansen was recently named the NCAA's most outstanding gymnast of the past 25 years. Johnson (1930-33) played men's basketball, football, baseball and track at UK and is considered one of the greatest allaround athletes in the history of the Commonwealth. A basketball All-American, he was a starter on Adolph Rupp's first Wildcat team and later served as head football and basketball coach at Morehead State and as basketball coach at Marshall.

Smith (1956-58) was a starting guard on Kentucky's 1958 national championship team and won gold medals as part of the United States' 1959 Pan American team and 1960 Olympics squad. A 10-year veteran of professional basketball, he was named MVP of the 1966 NBA All-Star Game.

Sullivan (1948-67) served as playby-play voice for Kentucky football and basketball. He began the Standard Oil Sports Network in 1951, covering UK games until his untimely death in 1967 at the age of 42. He also called Cincinnati Reds baseball from 1964-67, and was named Kentucky Sportscaster of the Year every year from 1959 through 1966.

Yeast (1995-98) caught more passes than any player in SEC history, with 208 receptions for 2,899 yards and 28 touchdowns. He broke two SEC records and 19 school records for pass receiving, kick returns, scoring, and all-purpose yardage during his career, and helped lead the Wildcats to the 1999 Outback Bowl.

The UK Athletics Hall of Fame was started in 2005 to recognize and honor persons whose participation and contributions enriched and strengthened the University's athletic program. The charter class included 8 individuals who had previously had their jersey retired by UK.

There is a five-year waiting period after leaving UK - to be eligible for inclusion into the Hall of Fame, and a 10-year waiting period to have a jersey retired. An individual must be a member of the Hall of Fame to be eligible for jersey retirement.

A committee consisting of Hall of Famers, media members, campus representatives and current coaches and administrators elects new inductees each year.

"I think the most important thing is for us to use our non-conference games as preparation for a very difficult Big East Conference schedule," said U of L Head Coach Rick Pitino. "We will be challenged very early with the likes of Northwestern State who reached the NCAA Tournament Second

Round last year - Arizona, Miami, Kentucky, St. Joseph's and UMass to name a few. It will be a very competitive schedule. The big key for us right now is to get healthy and get ready for the start of the sea-

With four starters returning from last year's team that produced a 21-

13 record and reached the national semifinals of the NIT, the Cardinals will face their first outside competition in an exhibition game against Bellarmine on Nov. 1, the first of 22 home games in Freedom Hall. U of L will play 12 of its first 14 games at home in Freedom Hall, beginning with a Nov. 18 season-opener against Northwestern State, which posted a 26-8 record last season and beat No. 3 seed Iowa in the NCAA

Tournament. The Cardinals will play their second exhibition contest the next evening on Nov. 19, facing Kentucky Wesleyan in Freedom Hall. U of L will make its first national television appearance of the season with a CSTV-televised game on Nov. 24 against Dayton, a game which will be played at US Bank Arena in Cincinnati, Ohio. After playing Sacramento State in Freedom Hall on Dec. 2, U of L will face Arizona in the ESPN-televised Jimmy V Classic on Dec. 5, a game played in New York's Madison Square Garden. Syracuse faces Oklahoma State in the first game of the doubleheader.

U of L will serve as host on Dec. 8-10 for the NABC Classic, an exempt event played in Freedom Hall. The Cardinals will join St. Joseph's, Ohio University and a team to be named in the event, with each team rotating opponents for three straight days. The Cardinals will also serve as host for the Billy Minardi Classic Dec. 13 in Freedom Hall, an event named in memory of Pitino's brother-in-law who died in the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center. This year's event will feature a single game

against Massachusetts.

Kentucky will provide the opposition for a Dec. 16 CBS telecast in Freedom Hall. The Cardinals will close out the year with five additional home games against Savannah State (Dec. 20), Miami, Fla. (Dec. 23, ESPN), Northeastern (Dec. 27), San Francisco (Dec. 28), and UNC Asheville (Dec 30).


U of L opens the new year and its second season in the BIG EAST Conference at Notre Dame on Jan. 3. The Cards' league schedule includes two games each against Connecticut, Marquette and USF while U of L will not face league members Rutgers or West Virginia this season.

Bengals back in Kansas City after humiliating loss

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — If Marvin Lewis is mad at the Kansas City Chiefs, he's not letting on. Leave that to Rudi Johnson.

Still fresh in the mind of Cincinnati's star running back are bitter memories of KC holding a 30-3 lead in the final three minutes but still chucking passes into the end zone, and hitting one.

"It left a bad taste in our mouth," said Johnson. "Nobody's forgotten that game."

Now eight months later and buoyed by Carson Palmer's remarkable recovery from reconstructive knee surgery, the Bengals will open the season Sunday in the very stadium and against the very team that mauled them 37-3 in last year's regular-season finale

The Chiefs had already been shut out of the playoffs because of Pittsburgh's victory that day over Detroit. But in Dick Vermeil's final game as head coach, they wanted to see Trent Green get 4,000 yards passing and Larry Johnson erase the team rushing record.

So they kept pouring on the fire and, at the Bengals' expense, both did.

Green's 4,014 yards made him the fourth quarterback in NFL history to post three consecutive 4,000-yard seasons. Johnson had 201 yards and three TDs and a team-record 1,750 yards.

"We've had this game marked on our calendar for a year," said Johnson. "We're looking forward to going out there and putting on a great show."

Nonsense, says Lewis.

"They're a different football team coached by a different person than last year," said the Bengals coach. "We're a different team. They're a different team. This is a new season."

In Kansas City's defense, the Bengals had already wrapped up their first playoff berth since 1990 and Palmer and many other starters played only a few series.

Nevertheless, it stung.

"They scarred us for 200 yards," said defensive end Bryan Robinson. "We know what they did to us last year. We know what they're capable of doing. They punched us in the mouth."

But as Chiefs defensive end Jared Allen points out, Vermeil has been replaced by Herm Edwards and Edwards that day was not within 1,000 miles of Kansas City.

"That has nothing to do with us," he said. "That's the coach's decision.

He's the one calling plays. We're out here to win. We're trying to score as many points as possible and hold their defense from scoring as few points as possible.

"Last time I checked, football's not a sport about compassion, it's a sport about knocking heads together and the best man's going to win. So that's between the coaches, if they felt that way. We're just out there playing what's called."

Palmer, injured in the first few minutes of the Bengals' playoff loss to Pittsburgh, thrilled Cincinnati's fans the way he rebounded from an injury that some felt might end his career. A perfect 4-0 preseason record, Cincinnati's first, also has fans looking forward to a second straight division title

The Bengals, for the third straight year, also return every offensive starter. Acquisitions of massive defensive tackle Sam Adams and safety Dexter Jackson could strengthen a defense that gave up almost 400 yards a game.

Under Edwards, the Chiefs have also made a big effort to shore up a leaky defense. The offense that led the league from 2001-05 with 30,470 yards and 262 touchdowns probably will not be the same, either. Gone are

several key operatives, including left tackle Willie Roaf, running back Priest Holmes and fullback Tony Richardson.

But rookie defensive end Tamba Hali and free agent cornerback Ty Law looked impressive in brief preseason appearances and gave hope for an improved defense.

"I think they're better," said Allen.
"But we're better, too."

One person who laments the way the Chiefs behaved last Jan. 1 is also one of Lewis' good friends.

"There are certain times in a football game where you know that the game is over. You know it and the other team knows it," Edwards said.

"There's a way you can play where you don't rub people's noses in it. I don't believe in that. I think it's bad ball. I think it's bad sportsmanship. It sets a bad precedent and it sets you up for eventually what goes around, comes around."

Told that Lewis and Palmer both insisted they're not at all concerned with that embarrassing loss, Edwards merely smiled.

"I would hope they wouldn't tell you guys what they're going to try to do," he said. "I would hope they're smarter than that." National Football League

CINCINNATI — Chad Johnson, the master of the touchdown dance and the locker room list, is branching out into the field of marketing.

Marketing what? Himself, of

The Pro Bowl receiver changed his hairstyle this season — instead of the shaved head, he's got a blond-dyed Mohawk — and is helping the Cincinnati Bengals sell his new look at

their gift shop.

For \$30, fans can buy a rubber scalp with a blond Mohawk to slip on the tops of their heads, a sign of unity with the most colorful Bengal. The "Chad Mohawk Head" will be available at the team's gift shop before the home opener against Cleveland on Sept. 17.

"You don't have to cut a Mohawk anymore," Johnson said, in a late-night infomercial tone. "You can just go buy the hat. You can buy the head. It's me."

Sure is. It's the thing that sets him apart from NFL receivers — a knack for promotion to go with that knack for getting open. And, it's the one thing that will bring him a lot more scrutiny this season, from officials and coaches alike.

Frustrated at how things were going at halftime of the 31-17 playoff loss to Pittsburgh on Jan. 8, Johnson

evidently voiced his frustrations in the locker room. Johnson and coach Marvin Lewis later denied that there was a physical confrontation.

It wasn't the first time that Johnson's emotions bubbled over. He revealed this week that the coaching staff met with him in the offseason, hoping to help him mature as a player.

"One conversation is all I needed,"
Johnson said. "I've been working on
what they told me since then."

Lewis hates the touchdown dances and attention-grabbing antics — sending Pepto-Bismol to the Browns before a game, posting a locker-room list of opponents that failed to cover him. Asked to discuss the meeting with Johnson, the coach tersely said, "No."

The new hairdo made it clear that Johnson isn't about to abandon his free-spirited ways.

"I'm still a kid at heart," he said.
"I'm maturing in certain ways, where I need to improve with my maturity."

Quarterback Carson Palmer has noticed signs that his top receiver is trying to focus his emotions a little bet-

"I think that's one of the things that make Chad who he is and the receiver that he is," Palmer said. "He's got so much energy and he wants the ball so bad. He wants to make big plays in critical points of games.

"You don't want to channel that completely out. That energy and emotion is what makes him one of the best receivers in the league. There are certain points where his emotions get the best of him. That's something that he has worked hard at and recognized that he's needed to change."

Of course, it's easy to keep cool during the preseason.

"You won't know until you get into a critical point in the season or in a game," Palmer said. "From everything I've seen so far, he's done a great job of handling that. I think he's going to stay on himself."

On the field, perhaps. Off the field, he's still the same old Chad.

He hasn't posted a list in his locker yet, but plans to have one ready before the Cleveland game. He's giving a lot of thought to how he'll celebrate his first touchdown.

The league clamped down on celebrations in the offseason, so Johnson won't be allowed to use the end zone pylon as a putter, for instance. Still, Johnson sees some wiggle room.

"Continue to watch the north and south end zones if I'm able to score," he said, mischievously. "Obviously a Chiefs fan will have to help me with my celebration for week one."

Steelers 28, Dolphins 17

PITTSBURGH — Referee Walt Coleman stood waiting patiently for the red flag he sensed was coming from the Miami Dolphins' sideline. A minute or so before, the Steelers had gone ahead on a scoring play that may have taken tight end Heath Miller out of bounds, and there was no reason not to chal-

Still, the challenge flag remained firmly in Dolphins coach Nick Saban's hand. Even as the teams lined up for the extra point. Even as center Greg Warren leaned over the ball before snapping it to holder Chris Gardocki.

Finally, the flag requesting a replay review fluttered to the turf, only no official was watching as Jeff Reed converted the kick. Saban was a moment too late — to challenge to call and, perhaps, to save the game for the Dolphins.

Can a coach be penalized for delay?
"The officials said they didn't see it,"
Saban said. "Whose fault is that?"

To a few Dolphins fans, the blame for a 28-17 loss to Super Bowl champion Pittsburgh in the NFL's season-opening game Thursday night might not rest entirely on the players. No doubt a few were asking themselves, "Why didn't he throw the flag earlier?"

Miller's 87-yard scoring catch with about six minutes remaining was one of the longest in history by an NFL tight end and gave Pittsburgh a 21-17 lead. The problem was it probably should have been an 85-yard catch, and no touchdown.

TV replays showed Miller going out

of bounds and, if Saban had challenged in time, the Steelers probably would have been forced to try to score from around the 2-yard line. The previous time they had the ball so close, quarterback Charlie Batch fumbled at the Miami 1 with the Dolphins recovering.

Maybe that's why Coleman seemed as surprised as anyone when he didn't see the flag. By the time Saban tossed it, the officials were focused on the extrapoint try.

"After the ball was snapped, we can't go back to the previous snap," Coleman said. "Once they snapped the ball on the try, there was nothing we could do."

Saban contends he threw the flag in time.

"It was well before the kicker kicked it," Saban said. "The official said he didn't see it, and when he said he didn't see it, there was nothing he could do. That shouldn't happen."

Saban's mistake was the most curious on a night neither team all played that well, but it wasn't the only one by the Dolphins. Daunte Culpepper, the former Vikings quarterback playing his first game since tearing three knee ligaments last year, was intercepted twice following Miller's score. One was a 42-yard touchdown return by linebacker Joey Porter that effectively ruined Culpepper's debut game with the Dolphins.

The Super Bowl champion Steelers had plenty of reasons to win their ninth in a row, including backup quarterback Charlie Batch's three touchdown passes, Willie Parker's 115 yards rushing and Porter's big play. Yet they easily could have lost, and they knew it, especially after falling behind 17-14 in the third quarter on Ronnie Brown's 5-yard touchdown run.

Miller also knows he was lucky his score counted. Asked afterward if he was certain he got in, he said, laughing, "Touchdown. Yeah."

"It didn't go as well as we liked it to. If we had scripted it, it probably wouldn't have been like that," Miller said. "It was scrappy game but we came out on top."

Without Ben Roethlisberger, too, as the quarterback sat out after having his appendix removed on Sunday. Batch took his place and had his first three TD pass game since 2001 with Detroit. He had thrown only one scoring pass the previous four seasons combined.

"The guys are comfortable with Charlie," said Hines Ward, who returned from a monthlong hamstring injury layoff to make a 7-yard touchdown catch that put the Steelers up 14-7. "You have to remember that Charlie was 2-0 when he was the starter last year."

The Steelers don't play again until a Monday night game at Jacksonville on Sept. 18 and, despite Batch's effective play, they are hopeful Roethlisberger can return that night.

The Dolphins also expect to come back from this, a disappointing loss in a game they probably shouldn't have won — not on a night they were outrushed 143-38 — but one they felt they could have won.

"We played well into the fourth quarter, but you can't turn the ball over in this league," Culpepper said. "We're better than that. We know we're better than that."

The Steelers believe they are, too.

Maybe that's why Porter planted a kiss on coach Bill Cowher following his first career interception return touchdown.

"I try to tell you guys that me and him are close," Porter said.




